In his heyday, Papin simply

BORDEAUX, France, Apr 2 (Reuters): Jean Pierre-Papin is preparing for the ninth final of his career,

the French League Cup final between Girondins Bordeaux and Paris St Germain on Saturday, as if it were the first. Although he no longer holds

down a regular starting place in the Bordeaux side and despite being one of the most successful French players ever, Papin is almost always the last player back in the dressing rooms after a team practice. An enduring scenario thro-

ughout the 34-year-old's career has been the constant extra practice he has put in after hours on honing his goal scoring skills.

"I don't know if it will be my last final. Today I'm not sure of anything," Papin, who has adjusted to a kind of super-sub role for Bordeaux, said.

"There have been lots of big rendezvous in my career. But each final is different," he said in an interview.

"There isn't one that stands out in particular. Maybe Saturday's will remain in my memory. It will be special because it's going to be played in the Stade de France in front of

80,000 people." The match, Bordeaux's second successive League Cup final, will be only the fourth match of any kind to be staged in France's new National Stadium built for the World Cup finals starting on June 10.

It has so far staged an inaugural soccer friendly between France and Spain in January and the country's two five nations' Rugby Union championship home matches this sea-

Papin, who has scored six goals this season after hitting 16 last season, said it was not easy at first to accept being on the bench most of the time now.

"It's true, it was tough at first, but now I've adjusted to this joker's role," said Papin who is allowed to take regular short breaks to fly his handicapped daughter Emilie to the United States for treatment.
