

SEOUL. Apr 5: South Korean President Kimdae-Jung today accepted a North Korean proposal for a meeting of highlevel government officials and welcomed it as 'major progress and a change' in inter-Korean relations, reports AFP. "We will, of course, take part

in the meeting. I hope it will be fruitful," Kim said in a statement on arrival here from the Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) summit in London. In what appeared to be a major policy change, North Ko-

U Ohn Gyaw, who will be leading a four-member delegation, will hold talks with his Bangladesh counterpart Abdus Samad Azad on promotion of bilateral relations, including economic cooperation. The sources said repatria-

tion of Rohingya refugees will be the prime agenda of the talks between the two foreign ministers. About 21 thousand Myanmar nationals, locally known as Rohingvas, are waiting to be repatriated to their homes in Myanmar. The repatriation process remained stalled for the last few months following refusal of the refugees to go.
