Peace deal ending bloodshed

BELFAST, Apr 10: After a day and a half of non-stop talks, weary negotiators concluded an agreement late this afternoon designed to bring peace to Northern Ireland for the first time in decades, reports AFP.

"I am pleased to announce that the two governments and the political parties in Northern Ireland have reached agreement," said the American Chairman of the peace talks. George Mitchell.

"I have never felt the sense of gratification, responsibility and gratitude that I feel today." he added.

"It was a truly remarkable

experience for me. I have never been in any place with better people. This is a remarkable place with remarkable people,"

The agreement was formally put to the opening of a plenary session of the talks chaired by Mitchell.

Negotiators in turn, including Gerry Adams, leader of Sinn Fein, the political wing of the IRA, and Ulster Unionist leader David Trimble paid tribute to Mitchell for his conduct of the talks.

There were also tributes to British and Irish Prime ministers Tony Blair and Bertie Ahern for the role they had played

over the past 48 hours. The historic accord was

reached in a marathon session at Stormont outside Belfast. Negotiators worked right through a midnight Thursday deadline set by George Mitchell.

The agreement aims to end decades of violence between Protestants who make up the majority in the province and want continued British rule there and Catholics who seek union with the Irish Republic to the south.

The peace settlement will be put to a referendum in Northern Ireland on May 22. Blair's spokesman said. Ireland will See Page 12 Col 5

150 Hajj pilgrims killed in stampede at Meena

MEENA, (Saudi Arabia) Apr 10: A total of 118 Hajj pilgrims died in a stampede Thursday near the holy city of Makkah, Saudi Arabia's health ministry said in a statement read on state television, report agencies.

"The total and definitive number of the dead is 118, 11 having died in hospital," the ministry said, updating the previous toll of 107 given by the official SPA news agency.
Saudi officials, speaking on

condition of anonymity, said 150 people, most of them elderly, were trampled or plunged to their deaths as pilgrims rushed forward to take part in the 'stoning the devil' ritual.

An additional 200 people were injured, the Arab News, a Saudi newspaper reported. Gen Ahmad Bilal, director general of public security, said

some 700,000 pilgrims were crowding by the site of the stoning at midday Thursday, when people began to press forward. "The number was frightening and the crowd advanced like

a torrent," he told the English-

language paper. He said some security officers who tried to control the crowd were trampled and hospi-

Road accidents kill 14 during Eid holiday

At least 14 persons were killed and 34 others injured in road accidents in six districts during the Eid holiday.

Four people, including three members of a family, were killed and 15 others injured in a road accident at Dawlatpur of Daudkandi thana on Dhaka-Chittagong highway on Tues-

Police said the accident occurred when a microbus collided with a Dhaka-bound truck and later was hit by a Comillabound passengers bus at about

Of the dead, three were identified as Abdul Quyium, 35, of village Kamella in Muradnagar thana of the district, his wife Shahida, 25, and son Saddam, The other person was the

driver of the micro-bus. Police seized all the three vehicles but the drivers of the bus and truck managed to flee

In Mymensingh, three persons were killed and 11 others injured when a Mymensinghbound truck from Muktagachha collided with a tempo on Mymensingh-Tangail road Tues-

Abdul Mannan, 40, died on the spot. Abul Kashem, 30, and Abul Hashem, 25, were declared dead at the Mymensingh Medical College Hospital

The victims were found by a team formed by the Bangladesh embassy in Saudi Arabia, the sources added. The dead were identified as

Mohammad Hamiduddin (Passport No 352125, Maktab No 33 and File No 54), Ershad Ali Bashar Mia (Passport No 1892, Maktab No 39 and File No 49) and Ahmed Bagi Dhali (Passport No 3667, Maktab No 35 and File No 36).

Bill Richardson's visit 'highly significant'

A high level US government delegation led by influential politician and Permanent Representative to the United Nations Bill Richardson will arrive in Dhaka tomorrow on a two-day official visit to Bangladesh.

He will be accompanied by Karl Inderfurth, Assistant Secretary of State for South Asia and Bruce Rifdel, Special Assistant to the President and Senior Director, Near East and South Asian Affairs, National Security Council. The team will arrive by a special US government aircraft.

The visit of Richardson, who holds the rank of cabinet minister and is a close friend of President Clinton, is being viewed as very important for

business ties. The team will particularly probe the prospects of US companies getting big business in Bangladesh, specially relating to the potential energy sources said. A foreign ministry official.



One thousand twenty-nine Bangladeshi nationals in Malaysia, served with deportation orders, might return home within a week, Bangladesh High Commissioner in Kuala

Number of motorised vehicles doubles in eight years till '96

The number of motorised vehicles plying on the roads across the country had nearly doubled in eight years, till 1996. according to a survey conducted by the Transport Survey Wing of Bangladesh Road Transports

The total number of mo-

torised vehicles was 2,51,765 in

1989 and it rose to 4,35,311 in "In recent years, road traffic increased by about nine per cent annually," said the survey report, available recently.

Authority.

Motorised traffic exceeded 1000 vehicles per day (VPD) on about 13.8 per cent of the road network under the Roads and Highways Department and it was below 200 VPD on about 60 per cent of these roads.

But 40 per cent of the na-

tional road network had 1000-

2000 VPD, 13 per cent had 2000-

4000 VPD and only four per cent had over 4000 VPD, the report

pointed out. The number of three wheeler autorickshaws and private transports with limited passenger capacity increased remark-ably during the period compared to that of transports like bus and minibus.

Increase in the number of three wheeler tempo was much higher than "that of bus and minibus. Among all modes of mecha-

nised transports in the country. autorickshaws recorded the highest increase. In 1989, the base year for the survey, its number was 19,796 and in 1996, it stood at 62, 548. Similarly, vehicles used as private transport with limited passenger capacity also showed

a marked increase in number
