Tillstrom in semis

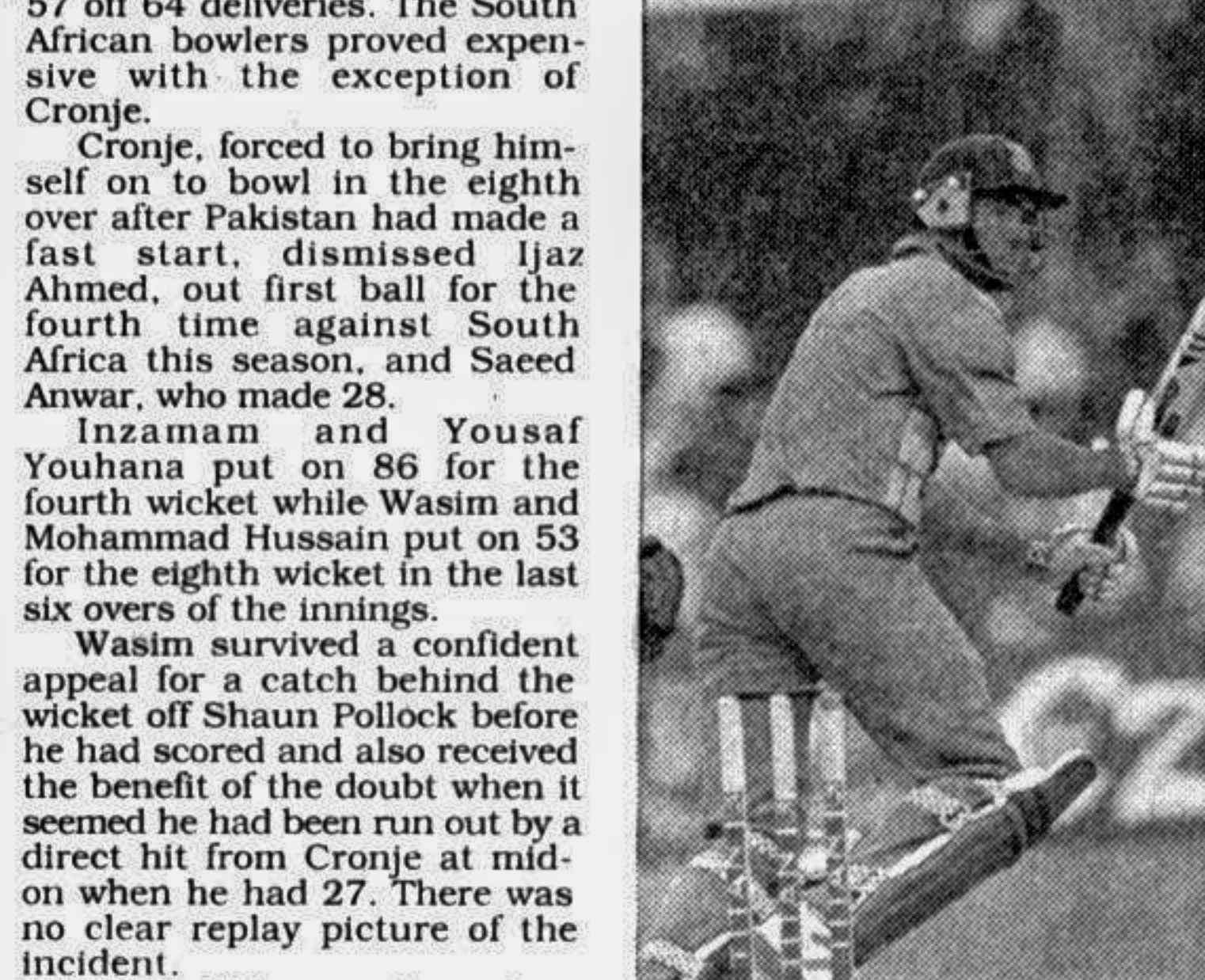
MADRAS, Apr 11: Defending champion Mikael Tillstrom reached the semifinals of the Gold Flake Open on Friday, beating Australia's Mark Woodforde 6-3, 2-6, 7-6 (7-3), reports AP. Tillstrom remained on the baseline for much of the two-hour match, and did most of the damage with his two-handed, crosscourt backhands and topspin forehands. The biggest upset came late in the night with world No 1 pair Todd Woodbridge and Mark Woodforde being out-gunned 7-6 (9-7), 6-1 by the French duo Arnaud Clement and Jerome Golmard. Elsewhere, Leander Paes of India overcame a first-set loss to topple Gerard Solves of France 6-7 (4-7), 6-4, 7-5. Second-seed Todd Woodbridge quelled a spirited challenge from eighth-seed Andrei Pavel of Romania, 6-4, 6-4. The match was bereft of dramatic rallies as the Romanian looked jaded after the doubles match he played late Thursday night. Top seed Patrick Rafter spent many anxious moments before subduing Lars Burgsmuller of Germany, 7-6 (7-3), 0-6, 7-5.

Akram captures 350th wicket Hansie's superb show



EAST LONDON, South Africa, Apr 11: An inspired performance by skipper Hansie Cronje took South Africa to a three-wicket victory over Pakistan in their Standard bank triangular limited-over international at Buffalo Park Saturday, reports AFP. Cronje took two for 17 in ten overs, then slammed a half-century off 42 balls as South Africa turned back a strong challenge by the tourists. It was South Africa's tenth consecutive limited-over win against Pakistan. Half-centuries by Inzamam-ul-Haq and Wasim Akram enabled Pakistan to score 250 for eight on a pitch which offered help to seam bowlers. South Africa replied with 254 for seven with 22 balls to spare. Opener Mike Rindell made 64 despite hostile bowling from Wasim Akram and Waqar Younis. Wasim became the first bowler to take 350 wickets in one-day internationals, when he bowled Jacques Kallis. Although South Africa lost three top order batsmen cheaply, they maintained a good scoring rate and were able to take advantage when Wasim and Waqar were rested. Cronje hit four sixes as he and Shaun Pollock put on 89 for the fifth wicket in a partnership which virtually ensured victory for South Africa. Pakistan left-arm spinners Mohammad Hussain and Ijaz Ahmed both took heavy punishment.

ishment. Pollock, back in the side after recovering from a groin injury, made top score of 66. Pakistan's total seemed a good one with most of South Africa's bowlers failing to take advantage of helpful conditions. Inzamam made 52 off 80 balls while Wasim hammered 57 off 64 deliveries. The South African bowlers proved expensive with the exception of Cronje. Cronje, forced to bring himself on to bowl in the eighth over after Pakistan had made a fast start, dismissed Ijaz Ahmed, out first ball for the fourth time against South Africa this season, and Saeed Anwar, who made 25. Youhana put on 86 for the fourth wicket while Wasim and Mohammad Hussain put on 53 for the eighth wicket in the last six overs of the innings. Wasim survived a confident appeal for a catch behind the wicket off Shaun Pollock before he had scored and also received the benefit of the doubt when it seemed he had been run out by a direct hit from Cronje at mid-on when he had 27. There was no clear replay picture of the incident. South Africa now have three wins from three matches, while Pakistan have won two and lost two. South Africa play Sri Lanka, who have lost all their three games, in Port Elizabeth Monday. The Pakistan management announced that Saqlain Mushtaq will return home because of a finger injury, he will be replaced by fellow spinner Mushtaq Ahmed, who will arrive Sunday.

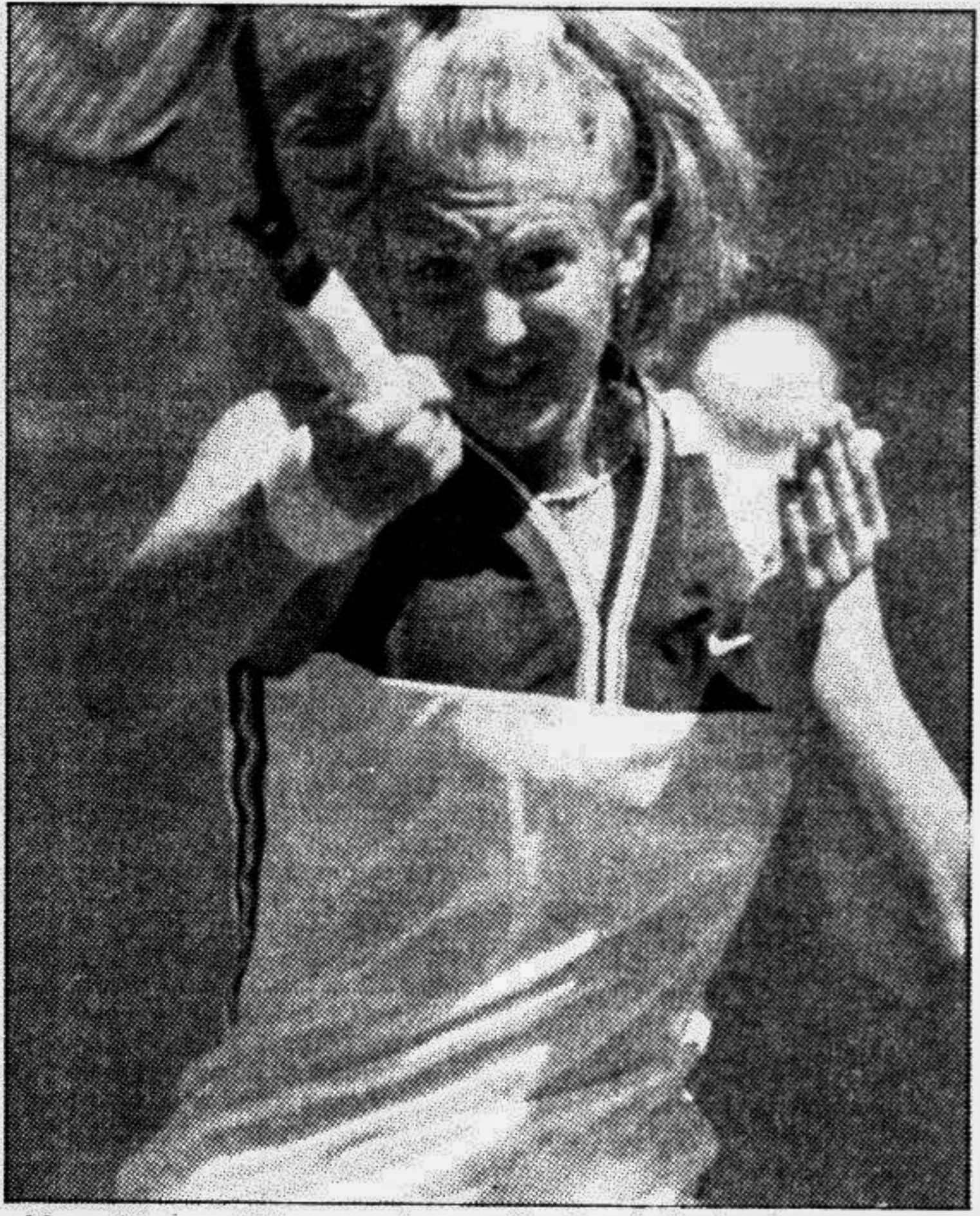

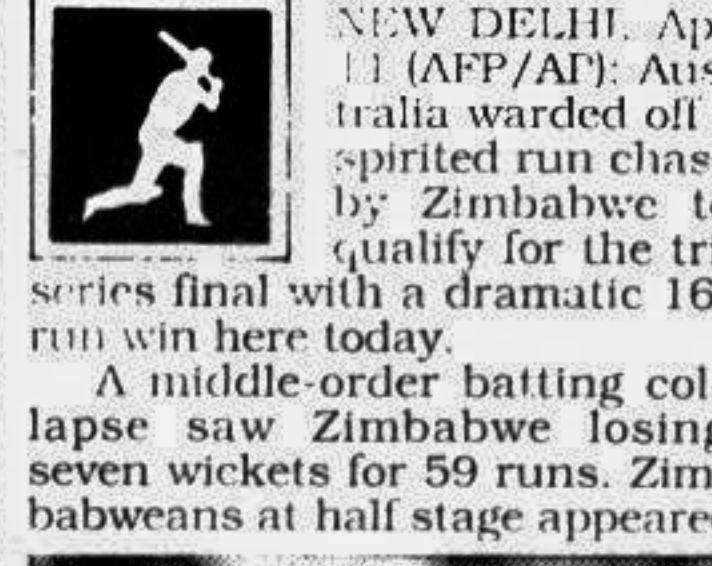

Mantilla ousted

OEIRAS, Portugal, Apr 11: Top-seed Spaniard Felix Mantilla was upset 3-6, 7-5, 6-1 by Moroccan Karim Alami in the quarterfinals Friday of the 625,000 dollars Estoril Open, reports AP. Alami, ranked 55th in the world, who in the first round eliminated seventh-seed Francisco Clavel of Spain, recovered from a set down to beat the top-seeded Mantilla. Sixth-seed Austrian Thomas Muster, a clay-court specialist, proved his good form and downed fourth-seed Spaniard Alberto Costa. Ranked No 21 in the world, in straight sets 6-4, 6-4. Ponting's 145 equals Australia's record for the highest individual score in one-day cricket that was created by Dean Jones in 1990. Waugh scored an 87 that contained four boundaries and a six before a Heath Streak delivery chipped his off stump. He faced 109 balls. The partnership was worth 219 runs, an Australian record for the second wicket. The pair overtook Jones' and Geoff Marsh's stand of 85 against England in Brisbane in 1990. Ponting was adjudged player-of-the-match. With the score at two, Gilchrist got his bat to a delivery from Mpuemele Mbanga, and the ball travelled straight to the waiting gloves of Andy Flower. But Ponting determined to make up for the loss, slashed away at Zimbabwean bowlers, Mbanga, Heath Streak and later Guy Whittall. When the spinners were brought in, Ponting demonstrated that he was not to be trifled with by hitting leg-spinner Adam Huckle for a mighty six over square leg in the 24th over. Four overs later, Mark Waugh repeated the humiliation, hitting him into the stands. Experienced Waugh, playing anchor, adopted a less flamboyant attitude and gave Ponting the support he needed. The pair guided Australia to their 100 in 17.1 overs. Alistair Campbell brought Huckle and off spinner Andy Whittall to rein in the vicious batting and that slowed down the run rate briefly. After 25 overs, Australia were 137 for one when Waugh reached his half-century. While his 50 had just four boundaries, most of Ponting's was made of 10 fours across the field. Two overs later, the score was 150. After 25.2 overs a shower took the players off the field for seven minutes. Opting to field after winning the toss, Campbell had hoped that an overcast sky would help the bowlers and the first quick wicket appeared to vindicate him. But none of bowlers could get any help from the wicket and failed to make a dent despite tiring efforts. With no win to their credit in the series, Zimbabwe, burdened by a weak middle-order, had to win by at least 30 runs or with at least four overs to spare to go into the final.

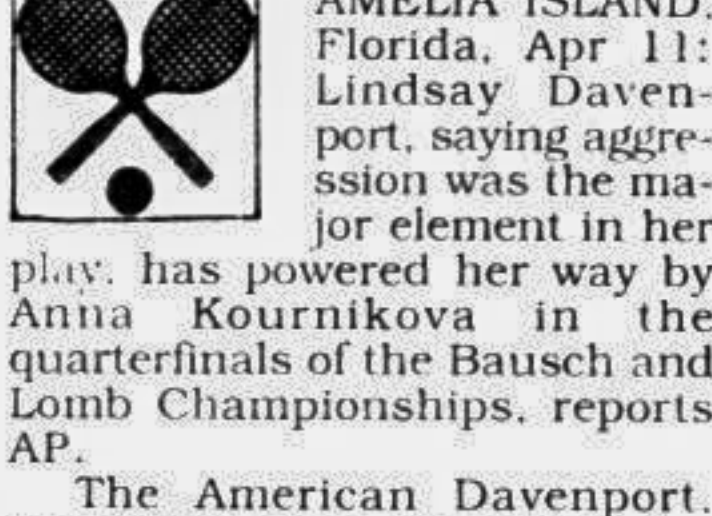

Lindsay reaches last eight



AMELIA ISLAND, Florida, Apr 11: Lindsay Davenport, saying aggression was the major element in her play, has powered her way by Anna Kournikova in the quarterfinals of the Bausch and Lomb Championships, reports AP. The American Davenport, using hard, deep ground strokes — many of which clipped the lines — beat the outspoken 16-year-old Russian sensation on Friday 7-5, 6-3. "Today I wanted to really be aggressive, whether I lost it by making a ton of errors or won it by controlling the points," Davenport said. "I wanted to dictate play through my power game and my aggressiveness." But 16th-ranked Kournikova, who beat Davenport in a three-set match last month at the Lipton, downplayed Davenport's game. "No, she doesn't hit the ball that hard," said Kournikova, adding that 16-year-old Croatian Mirjana Lucic "hits it harder than Davenport does." Davenport, who at 6-foot-2 1/2 (1.89 metres), 175 pounds (79 kilos), uses her power to put away many of her opponents, was surprised by the comments. "She can say what she wants," Davenport said. Carlsen, Black enter final

HONG KONG, Apr 11: Eighth-seed Kenneth Carlsen of Denmark upset third-seed Thomas Johansson of Sweden 6-2, 6-2 Saturday to advance to the final of the 340,000 dollars, Salem Open, reports AP. In the final, the 24-year-old Carlsen will face Zimbabwe's Byron Black, who saved a match point in the second set and rallied to beat Canada's Sebastian Lareau 6-7 (5-7), 7-5, 7-6 (7-4). Carlsen, Denmark's top player, swept aside the 43rd-ranked Johansson after breaking the Swede twice in each set on hardcourt at Victoria Park. It was the first time that Carlsen, who is ranked 76th, had advanced to the final of the Salem Open after three appearances. "I don't think any player on tour wants to lose to Anna ever," Davenport said. "That's incentive right there, in knowing some of the other players are pulling for you to win.
