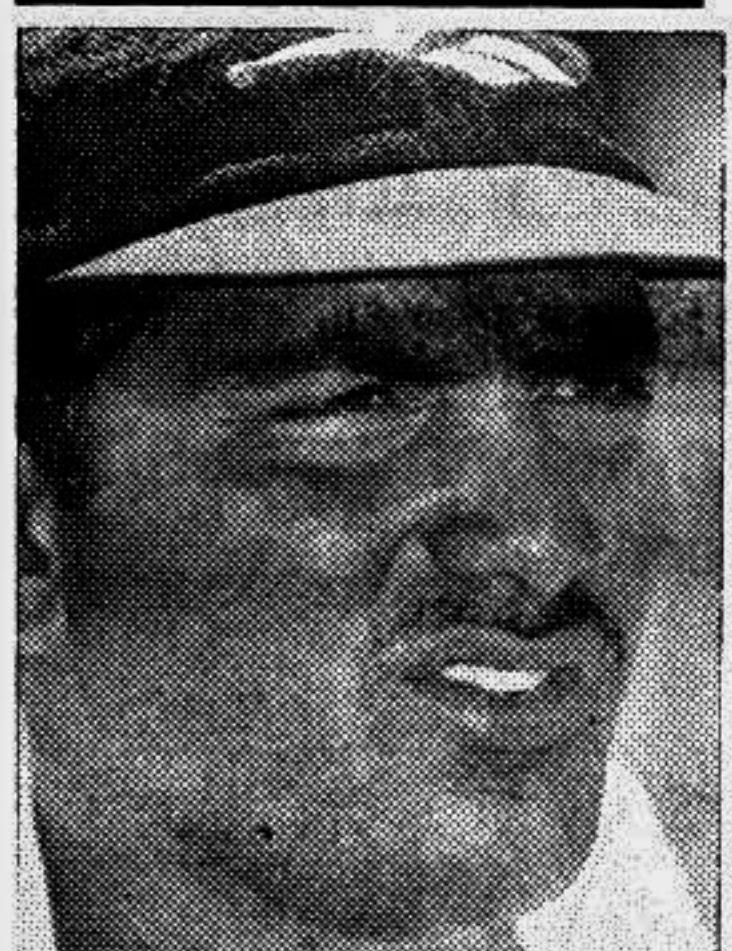

Shane skips Sharjah trip?



SYDNEY, Apr 12 (Reuters/AP): Australia leg-spinner Shane Warne could face shoulder surgery and is almost certain to miss this month's Sharjah limited-over tournament.

Warne sustained shoulder ligament damage while fielding during Australia's 16-run victory over Zimbabwe on Saturday in a triangular one-day tournament in India.

Team physiotherapist Errol Alcott said today Warne would be able to play in the tournament final against hosts India in New Delhi on Tuesday but could then return home for an operation.

"Shane will play the final (against India) come rain, hail or shine. "But there is a lot of doubt on Sharjah," Alcott told the Australian Associated Press news agency.

Australia, New Zealand and India are playing in the Sharjah tournament, starting on April 17.

Alcott said Warne had been scheduled to undergo arthroscopic shoulder surgery later this year to correct some wear and tear in the joint. The operation may now be brought forward.

"It could be a four-month rehabilitation but if he's got ten-day damage then it could be result of the heavy strain placed on the joints by Warne's bowling action, problems accentuated by his heavy workload in recent years.

That worst case scenario would make Warne a doubtful starter for Australia's tour to Pakistan in October and November, which immediately follows the Commonwealth

Games one-day tournament in late September, an event he will almost certainly forego.

Meanwhile, the New Zealand cricket team left Christchurch on Sunday for Sharjah with captain Stephen Fleming optimistic the Indian batsmen could be held better than they have been at home against Australia and Zimbabwe of late.

"In India the ball hardly swings at all and that suits their strokemakers," said Fleming. "The last time we were in Sharjah, the ball swung around."

"We have guys like Simon Doull and Shayne O'Connor who are capable of chipping them out."

Fleming said an unknown factor would be the effect of playing day-night matches at the venue after previous tournaments had all been day encounters.

India will enter the tournament as favourites after their recent series success against Australia and the run-scoring exploits of Sachin Tendulkar. Ajay Jadeja, captain Mohammad Azharuddin and Sourav Ganguly.

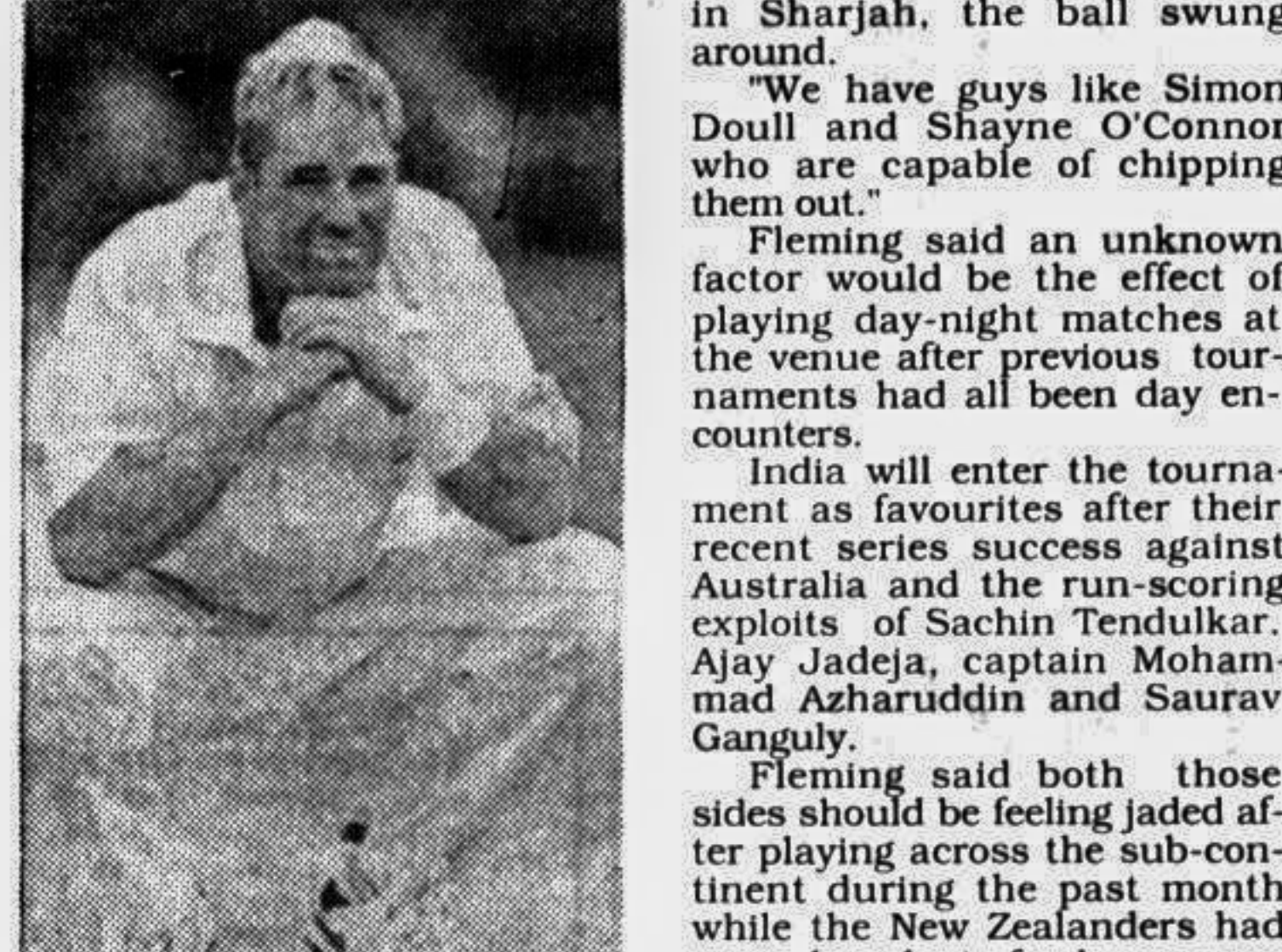
Fleming said both those sides should be feeling jaded after playing across the sub-continent during the past month while the New Zealanders had several weeks to freshen.

"It's a fine line between freshening up and losing match fitness and toughness," he said. "The three weeks off we have had is about right."

The side arrives in the United Arab Emirates late Monday via Singapore and has three days to prepare before their first match of the double round-robin tournament, against India on Friday. The final is the following Friday.

New Zealand's record in one-day tournaments overseas is poor. They last won a one-day series abroad in 1983-84 against then fledgling Sri Lanka. When New Zealand played in Sharjah last season they reached the final of a three-team tournament but were beaten by Pakistan.

The conditioning camp involving 39 cricketers will begin at the Bangladesh Krira Shiksha Protisthan (BKSP) from April 14.

Pierce stays on track



AMELIA ISLAND, Florida, Apr 12: Mary Pierce reached her third consecutive Bausch and Lomb Championships final on Saturday with a semifinale victory over top seeded and defending champion Lindsay Davenport, reports Reuters.

The fourth-seeded Pierce, who vowed to come back and finally win this title after falling

just short for the second year in a row, put herself in position to do just that by avenging her 1997 loss to Davenport with a 4-6, 6-3, 6-3 triumph.

The last hurdle for Pierce comes in the form of Spianard Conchita Martinez, who won this tournament in 1995.

The sixth seed continued her personal domination of Amanda Coetzer with a 77-minute, 6-4, 6-0 whipping of the second seed to raise her career

record against the South African to 12-1.

Coetzer, who was coming off a title last week at Hilton Head, managed to win a mere five points in the entire second set against the former Wimbledon champion.

Davenport held a 4-1 edge in meetings with Pierce prior to Saturday's one hour and 47 minute clash. But the Canadian-born French woman came in with a plan this time.

Pierce's aggressive tactics and ability to consistently capitalise on her break opportunities won the day.

Davenport controlled the first set, but Pierce, who skipped Indian Wells and Lipton hardcourt events to better prepare for the clay season, seized momentum in the second as she bolted to a 5-2 lead.

Pierce used her formidable return of serve to convert five of six break points presented by the top seed, while Davenport squandered numerous chances. The American converted just three of 11 break points — two in the first set.

In the final set, Davenport's serve simply deserted her.

A pathetic fifth game efforts saw the top seed broken at love, and although she managed to recoup the break in the sixth game, Davenport never held her serve again.

Serving at 30-30 in the final game, Davenport produced a most untimely double fault and then watched a Pierce forehand graze the baseline to end the match.

Pierce came up with the most entertaining shot of the day on the first point of the final game when she hit a backhand between her legs. Even though Davenport responded with a forehand into the open court.

"It's my favorite shot," Pierce said of the move usually best left on practice courts.

"I just like to do it a lot. It just happens naturally," she said of the decidedly unnatural stroke.

Rafter faces Tillstrom in final

MADRAS, Apr 12: Top seed Patrick Rafter will face defending champion Mikael Tillstrom in the final of the ATP Indian Open after both players enjoyed straight set victories here Saturday, reports AFP.

Rafter overcame a stiff challenge from local hero Leander Paes to win 6-3, 7-6 (7-3), while fifth seeded Tillstrom upset second seeded Australian Todd Woodbridge 6-2, 6-2.

Having survived a tough three set match the previous night, Rafter faced the challenge of hitting himself again to face an opponent encouraged by the cheers of 6000 noisy spectators.

In an entertaining contest between two committed serve and volleyers, a single break for 3-1 gave Rafter the opening set, games then went with serve in the second, until a wayward backhand volley from Paes left Rafter serving for the match at 5-4.

Paes though responded to the challenge magnificently, and his enterprise was rewarded when a desperate return from a lob was put away with a smash to seal the set at 5-5. Paes then made the early turning in the tiebreak, but from 3-5 Rafter claimed the next four points and the match.

Mexicans almost ready

MEXICO CITY, Apr 12 (AP): Mexico's World Cup soccer team is almost set a squad that includes only six members of the 1994 World Cup squad but most of those who suffered three recent humiliating defeats in South America.

Coach Manuel Lapuente announced the pre-selection of 23 players. Relatively few changes are expected before the World Cup starts in France in June.

The announcement comes on the heels of a disastrous tour of Argentina and Chile that saw the Mexican national team lose convincingly to Boca Juniors (3-1), the Catholic University of Chile (5-1) and a Chilean youth team (2-1).

"Games were lost, but we go forward," Lapuente told reporters as the team returned to Mexico City on April 9.

The pre-selection leaves out some of Mexico's best known players: forward Carlos Hermosillo, midfielders Benjamin Galindo, Joaquin del Olmo and Alberto Coyote and goalkeeper Adolfo Rios.

But it includes players who have been anchors of the squad in recent months: forward Luis Hernandez, midfielders Alberto Garcia Aspe and Ramon Ramirez, defender Claudio Suarez and goalkeeper Jorge Campos.

Muster makes it

LISBON, Apr 12: Former world number one Thomas Muster fought a hard battle in strong winds on Saturday to qualify for the 625,000 dollars Astoria Open final, but Spain's Alberto Berasategui sailed easily through his semifinal, reports Reuters.

Muster, the sixth seed, lost the first set 3-6 as his Moroccan opponent Karim Alami made an aggressive start and he had a hard time dealing with the powerful winds that kicked up dust and sent serve way off target.

But the Austrian showed remarkable concentration throughout, and fought back in the second and third sets to win 3-6, 6-2, 6-4.

Third seed Berasategui thrashed compatriot Carlos Moya 6-1, 6-1 with a thrilling display of precision tennis.
