Richardson visits BNWLA's shelter

Visiting UN envoy Bill Richardson yesterday expressed concern over increasing women and child trafficking in Bangladesh and elsewhere. He said his government was eager to extend help to stop such abuse.

"We are working on a US strategy to combat trafficking and violence against women, he said while visiting a shelter home in the city for women and children rescued from traffick-

The shelter is run by Bangladesh National Women Lawyers' Association (BNWLA). "The children, aged between two to eight, are being trafficked to Dubai to work as camel jockeys," Salma Ali, Executive Director, BNWLA, told Richardson, who was accompanied by US Assistant Secretary for South Asia Karl Inderfurth. "The (smuggled) women become slaves," she said.

"That's wrong ... We need to focus more international attention on this problem," Richardson said while playing carom with the children at the shelter. Richardson lauded the BN-

WLA's efforts saying that "it is no accident that action has been taken first by a non-governmental organisation." He announced a donation of 32,000 US dollars for the shelter.

The BNWLA shelter houses 59 women and children.

Grameen Bank's success amazes Richardson

The visiting US Permanent Representative to the UN, Bill Richardson, has found it amazing how the lives of rural poor women saw a big change through the Grameen assistance, reports UNB. Ambassador Richardson,

who arrived in the city yesterday flew to Sonargaon by helicopter in the afternoon to see Grameen Bank's micro-credit programme in action.

Many rural women described their poverty-stricken past and their present situation to the distinguished American visitor who found a big change in the life of the poor women.

Mahmuda Begum, the owner-operator of the Grameen mobile telephone centre, told Ambassador Richardson how she was running the centre giving telephone services to the village people.

She also told him her abject poverty of the past and how the fortune smiled on her after she got involved with the Grameen programme.

Amena Begum, a beneficiary of the Grameen Bank, described her days before she got involved with the Bank's micro-credit

"I've managed to buy a piece of land from the profits I made through rice business after getting a loan from the Bank," said a happy Amena Begum.

Earlier, Ambassador Richardson and other members of his delegation were welcomed by groups of women and chil-dren at different places on their way to the Grameen project after they alighted from the chopper at Sonargaon.

While visiting a Grameen Bank site at Mograpara in Sonargaon, Ambassador Richardson talked and exchanged greetings with the beneficiaries of the Grameen Bank programmes.

Grameen Bank chief Mohammad Yunus accompanied the US delegation. Talking to newsmen at the

old Tejgaon airport after returning from Sonargaon. Richardson said Bangladesh was making tremendous effort in achieving selfreliance.

The micro-credit programme was the best he saw in the developing countries, the US politician turned diplomat

"It is really tremendous that over two million women work on their own under such an in-

novative programme."

Ambassador Richardson praised Dr Mohammad Yunus for his innovative micro-credit programme for the rural poor.

The idea could be duplicated in other developing countries of the world, he said.


