She said that by damaging electric poles and raising the prices of essentials in a preplanned way, they (BNP) are trying to make an issue. They are also opposing the peace accord on CHT.

The Prime Minister said the BNP did not believe in parliamentary democracy and pointed out the party's constitution which, she said, is yet to change its policy of presidential form of government even after running the country for five years in the parliamentary

Making a call for maintaining discipline in Parliament, the Leader of the House urged the Speaker to take action against the unruly members as per the Rules of Procedure.

Tolerance is needed in practising democracy, she said adding that the Awami League had shown it after assuming power by not arresting the corrupt BNP people for the 'greater interest of democracy.

Hasina told the Speaker, "It is now up to you, it is totally your discretion what steps are to be taken against them (the unruly members). If you want, you can pardon them or take action against them."

"We hoped that the Leader of the Opposition will seek apology for the incident," the Prime Minister said and regretted her (Begum Zia's) attitude.

After Hasina's statement when Begum Zia stood up the Speaker refused to give her the floor saying that "I've repeatedly requested you to speak. But I can't allow you now after the statement of the Leader of the House."

At this stage, as the Speaker started to give his ruling on yesterday's incident in the House, the BNP lawmakers, led by Begum Zia, staged walkout for the third time on the day at about 9:55 pm

In a briefing later, the ruling Awami League has condemned the BNP's rowydism in the House yesterday saying the Parliament had seen an 'unprecedented heinous incident' with the madding attitude of BNP members.

"It's a pre-planned evil design of BNP to make the Parliament inoperative and ineffective," Commerce Minister Tofael Ahmed said in press briefing at the Prime Minister's office in Parliament.





Jatiyatabadi Mahila Dal near

Farmgate at about 11:45 am.

Police fired teargas shells to disperse the mob. Our Khulna Correspondent adds: Sanjay Shill was killed and several others injured when pro-hartal and anti-hartal activists were locked in an armed clash at Chuknagar under Dumuria thana. Sanjay, a barber was working in his shop when a bullet hit him in the head. He died on the spot. Police
