Hussain obsessed with captaincy

LONDON. Apr 16: Nasser Hussain admitted Wednesday he would relish the challenge of succeeding Mike Atherton as England captain, reports AFP.

Opener Alec Stewart is clear favourite for the post but Hussain, the current vice-captain, is not ruling himself out of the running.

"It is a job I would love to do. it's one of the best jobs in British sport but the decision is in the hands of the selectors." said the Essex player.

They have a difficult decision to make and if I don't get it, it wouldn't be the end of the world. "But it is a challenge I feel up

to tactically, and I also understand the players. I've grown up with many of them who are currently in the England squad and know how to handle them and how to get the best out of them." Asked if he would be disap-

pointed if the England selectors did overlook him for the captain's job. Hussain said "If you don't get something you want you are bound to feel disappointed. "But as I said it won't be the

end of the world if I miss out. My main concern is that I am scoring runs for England and if the captaincy comes along I would regard it as a bonus - and a great honour."

Ashes of bail or veil? LONDON, Apr 16:

The origin of cricket's most famous trophy — the Ashes — has been called into question after claims that the urn contained the remnants of a burnt veil, not a cricket bail,

reports AP. The new version comes from Rosemary, Dowager Countess of Darnley. She told the London Evening Standard that her mother-in-law created the Ashes in 1882 when she burned her veil to get the attentions of

Ivo Bligh. She says the story was recounted to her by her motherin-law, Florence Bligh, later to become Lady Darnley.

My mother-in-law told me that the Ashes were a burned veil she wore while Ivo was playing," the countess was quoted as saying. She believes the confusion

arose from a simple mis-hearing — bail for veil. Her son, the current Lord Darnley, said he could corrobo-

rate her account. "The story is quite possible," he said. "I have heard the story about the veil before. I can remember asking my uncle Colonel Bligh about it and he said that grandfather had said the ashes were probably from something that burned quite quickly. So it would have been

something flimsy. "It was something burned by the women, and I think it was

just a way of fulfilling a joke that had started. I was too young to have spoken to my grandfather or grandmother about it.

According to official cricket history, the Ashes came into being after Australia's first victory over England on English soil at the Oval in August 1882. The Sporting Life printed a

mock obituary and Punch ran a cartoon lamenting the death of English cricket. The Sporting Life's obituary read: "In affectionate remem-

brance of English Cricket which died at The Oval, 29th August 1882. Deeply lamented by a large circle of sorrowing friends and acquaintances. NB The body will be cremated and the ashes taken to Australia."
