 Argentina's captain and centre-forward Manuel Ferreyra missed the game against Mexico to take his university exams. His replacement Guillermo Stabile scored a hat-trick, stayed in the team with Ferreyra at inside-left, and finished as the tournament's top scorer.

 When the referee gave a foul against the United States in the semifinal, their medical attendant rushed on to the pitch to protest, threw down his bag, smashing a bottle of chloroform, was overcome by furnes and had to be helped off.

 The two halves of the final were played with different balls after an argument between the two sides.



# FRANCE '98 SIDELINES UNDATED, Apr 18 (AP): Gianfranco Zola and Roberto

Baggio have been left off the Italian squad for next Wednesday's World Cup warmup friendly against Paraguay in Parma.

Zola, of Chelsea, and Baggio, of Bologna, were the two big. omissions from the 19-man squad announced Friday by coach Cesare Maldini.

Baggio, the star of Italy's 1994 World Cup team, recently recovered from a pulled muscle and has said he wants to be selected for this summer's tournament in France. Zola, a regular member of

the Italian national side, has helped Chelsea win the English League Cup and scored a goal Thursday night in the 3-1 win over Vicenza as the London club reached the Cup Winners Cup

Maldini chose five forwards: Juventus star Alessandro Del Piero, Christian Vieri of

Atletico Madrid, Fabrizio Ravanelli of Olympique Marseille, Pierluigi Casiraghi of Lazio and Enrico Chiesa of Parma.

Maldini also picked two newcomers: defende - Mark luliano of Juventus and Luigi Sartor of Inter Milan.

The squad includes such veterans as Paolo Maldini and Alessandro Costacurta of AC Milan, goalkeeper Angelo Peruzzi of Juventus and midfielders Dino Baggio of Parma, Demetrio Albertini of AC Milan and Roberto Di Matteo of Chelsea.

#### ROYAL BOOST FOR THE DUTCH

Prince Albert of Monaco has promised the Dutch soccer team royal red carpet treatment during the World Cup.

The prince has assured coach Guus Hiddink that the Dutch team will have access to AS Monaco's ground and training facilities throughout their stay in the principality, the Dutch daily De Telegraaf reported Friday.

After a brief stay in Versailles ahead of their opening match June 13 against Belgium at the Stade de France in Saint-Denis, the Dutch will set up camp in an exclusive hotel in the mountains above Monaco for the remainder of their cam-

Prince Albert gave his blessing to the Dutch team as official patron of AS Monaco, the defending French champions.

#### TROUSSIER RUNNING AGAINST THE CLOCK

South Africa have a 50-50 chance of defeating hosts France in their World Cup opener, partly because the French will be under pressure at home, coach Phillipe Troussier said in an interview published Thursday.

Troussier, who took over as South African coach last month, told The Star newspaper he has only a little time to put together a side capable of succeeding in the country's first World Cup appearance.

So he said he has to concentrate on improving the focus of the players.

I want twenty-two eyes following the ball at all times and 100 per cent concentration,"

Troussier said after a practice with a training squad of South African-based players competing for a spot with Bafana Bafana, which means The Boys in Zulu.

SAF Football Federation announced this after a meeting in Kuala Lumpur last Sunday. Representatives from Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Sri Lanka and the Maldives attended the meeting.

Asian Football Confederation (AFC) Marketing Limited will patronise the tourney, said a press release of Bangladesh Football Federation yesterday. The Kuala Lumpur meeting also decided to hold the third

SAF Championship in Bangladesh in the year 2000. The SAF Federation election will be held next November.
