



Responding to a call attention notice on matters of public importance, the state minister said that being directed by the Prime Minister, the Health Secretary had written to the Cabinet Secretary requesting the latter to declare the Secretariat

a smoking-free zone. All directorates, departments and hospitals under the Ministry of Health were already

Meanwhile, Cairn's partner Halliburton issued an "unofficial" press release yesterday which said that three wells out of the four in Sangu were ready to supply gas to the national gas grid. It also said that all formalities in Sangu was completed and the 48 km pipeline

was tested. It said that Sangu was ready to produce gas in a few days

Cairn's Halda valley exploration operators, who are working under a sub-contract, observed a one-day strike earlier this month for non-payment of their dues for a long time. This is the first such incident in the private sector gas and oil development work.

Cairn faced vet another drawback early this month when its' operation in Sonadia "proved negative." Sources said that Cairn was getting "positive signals" from drilling an exploratory well in Sonadia. But when it reached its ultimate depth, the results turned out to be "very depressing."

Some 889 SSC examinees were expelled from different centres across the country for adopting unfair means on the third day of the examination yesterday, sources said, reports

During the examination in Bengali first paper, 303 students were expelled from different centres in Dhaka, 205 in Rajshahi, 71 in Comilla, 209 in Chittagong and 36 in Jessore education boards respectively.

Under the Dhaka Board, 29 examinees were expelled from Jamalpur, 36 in Sherpur, 82 in Netrakona, 13 in Faridpur, 7 in Gopalgani, 4 in Rajbari, 16 in Madaripur, 12 in Shariatpur, 41 in Tangail, 33 in My
