### Police-dacoit gunfight in Tongi: 6 held

Police nabbed six dacoits after an hour-long gunfight at Pajar village under Tongi thana in the early hours of yesterday. At least three constables and

two dacoits sustained injuries

during the armed clash that started at around 1:30 am. Acting on a tip-off, a group of police led by Tongi thana Officer-In-Charge (OC) Abdur Rashid raided an abandoned house where the dacoits were taking preparations for committing robbery. But, sensing the police presence, the dacoits started firing and hurled cocktails on them.

Police also recovered two revolvers, one sawed-off rifle, nine bullets and three cocktails from their possession.
