



The qualifying round of the 24th national cricket championship will begin at five zones across the country from May 1. A total of 44 districts and

three other teams - Jahangirnagar University, BUET and Bangladesh Police, split into five zones — Thakurgaon, Bo-gra, Satkhira, Patuakhali and Dhaka, will compete in the two-week long qualifying stage. The champions of the five zones will join hosts Sylhet and last year's four semifinalists -Chittagong, Dhaka University, Biman and Dhaka district in the final round which will be held in Sylhet from the third

week of May. The participants of the qualifying rounds have been accommodated in the following zones for the knockout phase:

Thakurgaon: Rajshahi Lalmonirhat, Sirajganj, Kuri-gram, Rangpur, Jamalpur, Pan-chagar and Dinajpur.

Bogra: Thakurgaon, Pabna Jahangirnagar University, Na-tore, Satkhira, Nilphamari, Gaibandha and Tangail.

Satkhira: Khulna, Jhenidah, Barisal, Meherpur, Patuakhali,

BUET, Bogra and Faridpur.

Afghan booters to resume playing

KABUL, Apr 21: Afghanistan's national football side is to take to the field for the first time in years but players and supporters will have to comply with strict guidelines, the ruling Taliban said Monday. reports AFP.

The religious militia has outlawed clapping in the Olympic Stadium here so onlookers will be ordered to encourage both sides equally with cheers of "Allahu Akbar".

Sportsmen also have to be modestly dressed with long trousers and sleeves prescribed for all events, the militia-appointed head of the National Olympic Committee Mullah Abdul Shukur Motmain told reporters.

win in three matches in the tournament, putting them level with India. Australia lead the round-robin league after two successive wins.

All three teams still have a chance of qualifying for Friday's final, which will be worth 40,000 dollars to the winners. India frittered away the ad-

vantage of batting first in the day-night international with a reckless display. Their three most experienced batsmen - Sachin Tendulkar, skipper Mohammad Azhar-

uddin and vice-captain Ajay

Jadeja — ran themselves out




