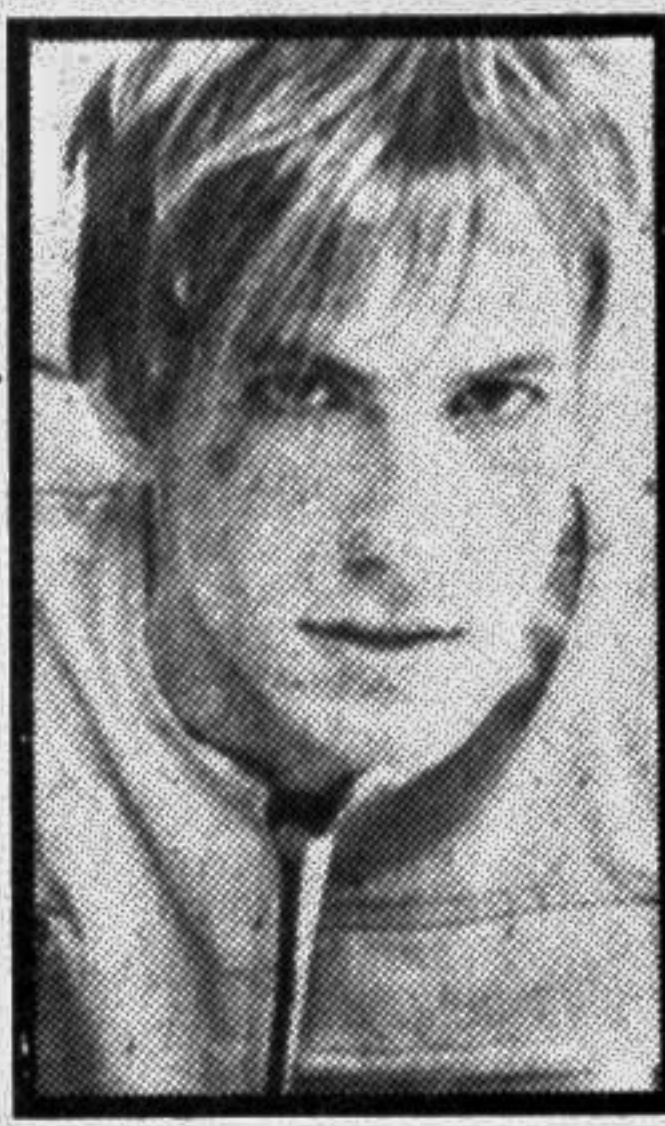


The Serial

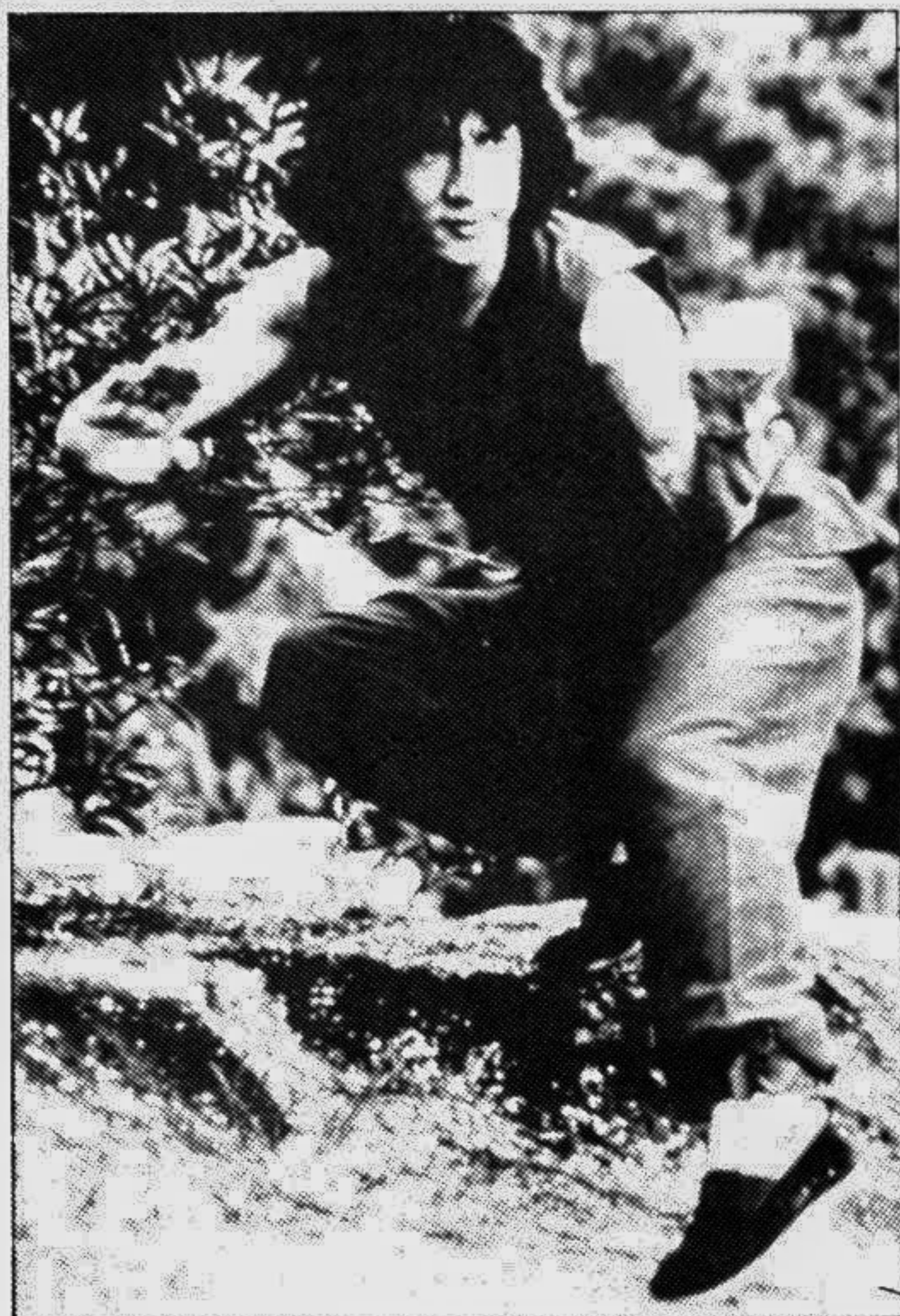
The Movie

April 24th at 9:30 AM on Star Movies

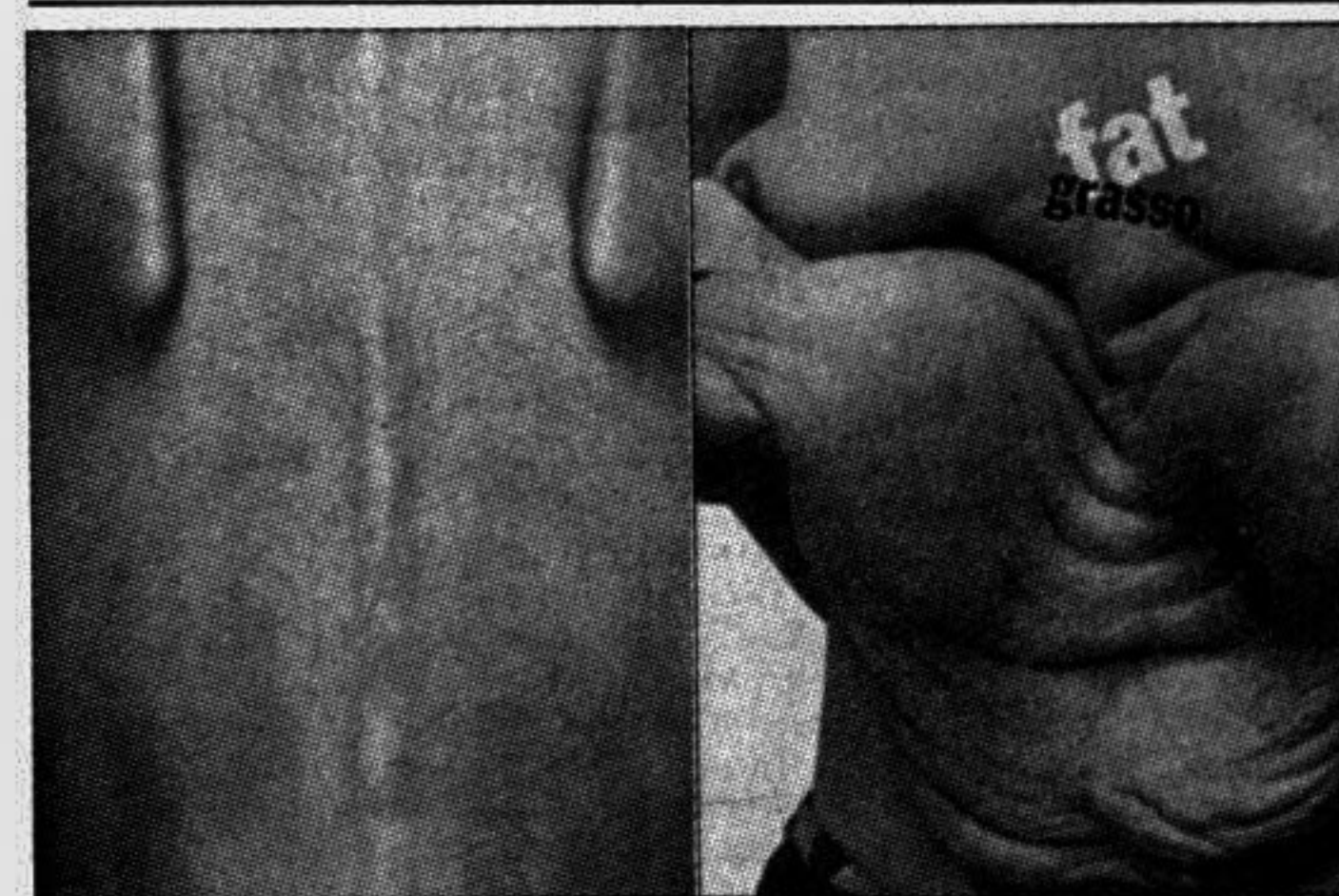
