



Collecting revenue should not be the main issue at stake. said Abdul Awal Mintoo of Bangladesh Association of Banks, calling for a greater thrust on generation of employment through industrialisation. "We must decide on the policy first. I think we are mixing up everything.

He suggested drastic cuts in rates and simplification of tax paying procedures, which he said could improve the situation dominated by dodgers. "Let's try it. We have tried so many things," he said.

"We have to get rid of the inspector-Raj," said A K M Shamsuddin of Foreign Chamber, borrowing from the Indian finance minister

A notable presence was that of a top trader from Moulvi Bazar, the capital's wholesale hub. Enayet Ullah gave a portrayal of the anomalous tariff values of essential products,

which he said was only breeding smuggling.

"Not even 10 per cent of consumption has been imported in case of cloves, whose tariff value had been fixed at 2.5 times the price in the country of origin, he said. "And if you investigate, you will find not a single chhatak of cardamom has been imported."

Dr Zaid Bakht of BIDS, however, sought to dispel the common notion that high tariff was behind large-scale smuggling. citing his own study.

"Without giving necessary incentives you cannot expect development of industrial sector," said Dr. Omar Haider Chowdhury of BIDS. "Opening of the trade regime does not mean withdrawal of all kinds of support by the government to domestic industry."

Finance secretary Dr Akbar Ali Khan called the budget a "compromise document" — between good and bad proposals.

"Farmers are underrepresented in such forums." lamented Dr Rushidan Islam Rahman of BIDS. She said a good growth in agriculture was needed to "provide a base for industrial growth".

### Obesity greatly increases risk of asthma

CHICAGO, Apr 25: Harvard researchers say a study of thousands of nurses has provided the first strong evidence that obesity greatly increases the risk of developing asthma, reports AP.

Even a little bit of fat increases the risk, and obese people — those who are roughly 35 per cent overweight - are at least three times more likely to develop the respiratory ailment that afflicts millions of Americans, the researchers say.

For years, doctors have been aware of a connection between obesity and asthma. But the general assumption was that asthma comes first, that patients were prone to putting on weight because breathing problems limited exercise.

The new study was designed to test that assumption, and the results "guarantee that obesity preceded the diagnosis o asthma," said the research leader, Dr Carlos A Camargo Jr of the Harvard Medical School in Boston.

One outside expert, however, said more study is needed.

The results will be presented this week at the international conference of the American Thoracic Society and the American Lung Association.

Both obesity and asthma are on the rise in developed nations. From 1982 to 1994, the rate of asthma rose 61 per cent in this country.

# Jayalalitha calmed down by Vajpayee's envoy

NEW DELHI, Apr 25: A trusted envoy of Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee, sent to southern India to talk to an angry ally who could topple the government, appeared to have soothed her. AP quoting domestic news agencies reported.

The envoy, senior Bharatiya Janata Party leader Jaswant Singh, met with Jayaram Jayalalitha for two and a half hours today in Madras, 1,750 kilometres south of New Delhi. the United News of India re-

Singh said the meeting was very successful and the problems within the ruling combine "are all matters of the past," UNI said.

Jayalalitha triggered a crisis in Vajpayee's one month old government by insisting that he fire Commerce Minister Ramakrishna Hegde and Urban Development Minister Ram Jethmalani, who she alleges are charged with corruption. She succeeded in having a third fired after a member of her party had to quit the cabinet because of graft charges. Jayalalitha's demands have

set off public squabbling among members of the 20-party ruling coalition led by Vajpayee's BJP.

Friday, BJP vice president Krishnan Lal Sharma appealed to parties to resolve their difference in private.

Talking to reporters after the meeting. Singh said Jayalalitha had not raised the issue of the dismissal of the two ministers. She had also agreed to attend a meeting of coalition partners in New Delhi, an indication that she had calmed down for now, UNI said.

Singh made a similar trip last month when Jayalalitha threatened to topple Vajpayee's government even before he could take the oath of office. Jayalalitha has the support of 30 lawmakers Vajpayee needs to win any confidence vote.

Then, Singh reportedly persuaded Jayalalitha to withdraw demands that the rival party in charge of Tamil Nadu, which she once controlled, be dismissed and that a politician close to her be named finance minister. After general elections in

February and March, Vajpayee's Bharatiya Janata Party emerged as the largest party in Parliament, but without the majority needed to rule without

From late last year, Petrobangla and Cairn has been disagreeing over an escalated budget for Sangu. These remain to be solved.
