

"I just know from 12 or 13 years' experience that you know when a side comes together and they're making progress and this one-day side was," Waugh said upon the team's return here today.

"And I think we're going to be a strong side, we're going to be hard to beat in the World Cup


"We learnt to play a lot tougher cricket, we were more discipline in our approach and I think that will be the making of our side."


