DID U' KNOW? (The Professor does)

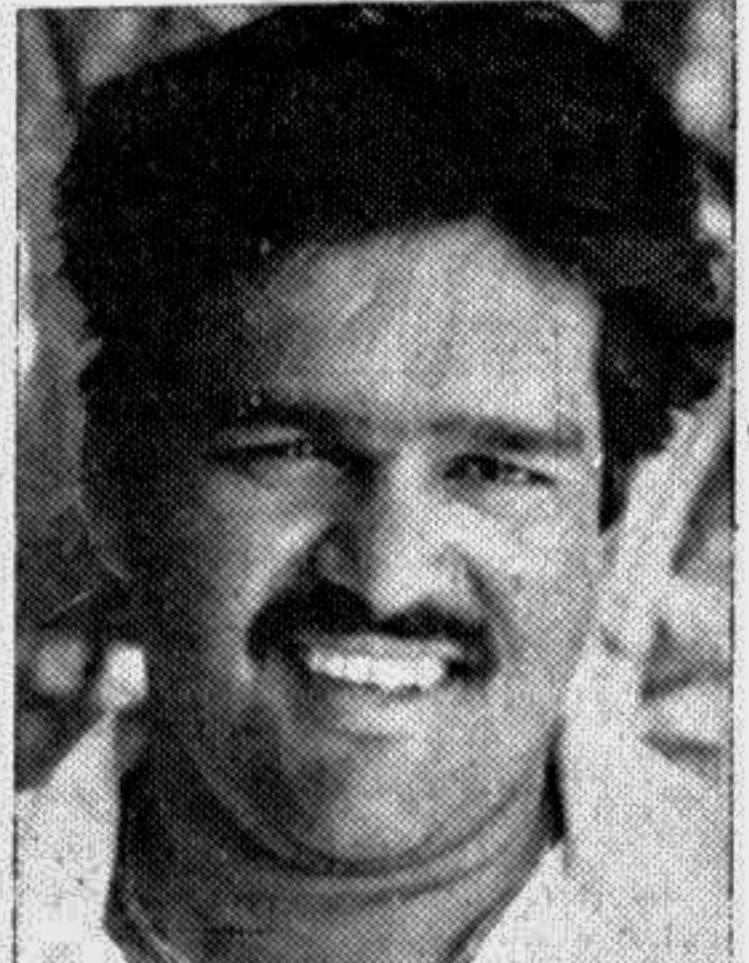

Pepsi Triangular Cup BCB bets on big boys

The national selectors fell back on experience rather than injecting fresh blood when they announced a 14-member Bangladesh squad for the Pepsi Triangular Cup, scheduled to begin in India from May 14.

Opting to travel full circle, the five-man selection committee, headed by Lutfur Rahman Makhan, virtually retained the side that won the ICC Trophy in Malaysia a year ago. Slow left-armers Enamul Haq Monil and left-arm seamer Anisur Rahman have been recalled for the first time since being left out immediately after the Malaysian spectacle. Also returning to the top flight is tall opener Ahsan Ali Khan who was dropped for the Dhaka Independence Cup in January.

With Akram Khan retaining his job as captain along with his deputy Aminul Islam, the only rookie in a rather expert line-up is Morshed Ali Khan, the young left-arm seamer who had a fantastic series in the Pakistan Wills Cup earlier this year. Opener Mehrab Hossain Opee, who had mixed fortunes in his maiden stint with the national team in New Zealand, was the other youngster in a side that would rely mostly on experience when Bangladesh renews its rivalry with Kenya in the tri-nation India tournament.

Surprisingly though, former national skipper Faruque Ahmed was once again ignored by the selectors despite being called to the selection trials for an unimpeachable time. The notable omissions are — opener Javed Omar, Al-Shahriar and Shahriar Hossain Bidyut. "We have made the best possible selection for the meet", said Shaheer Haq Hira, a member of the selection committee, while talking to this reporter at the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) office last evening. "Our main target is to beat Kenya. So, we are counting on experienced cricketers to transfer our goal", said the former

squad during the tournament", said Hira, pointing out that there are as many as ten players in the reserve list who may be able to avail the England trip. Although Hira appeared confident, Gordon Greenidge, the West Indian coach of the Bangladesh team, was philosophical regarding the selected fourteen. "This is an important question since the selection has already been made, said Gordon to the press. The important thing for us is that we are playing in the big league", said Gordon.

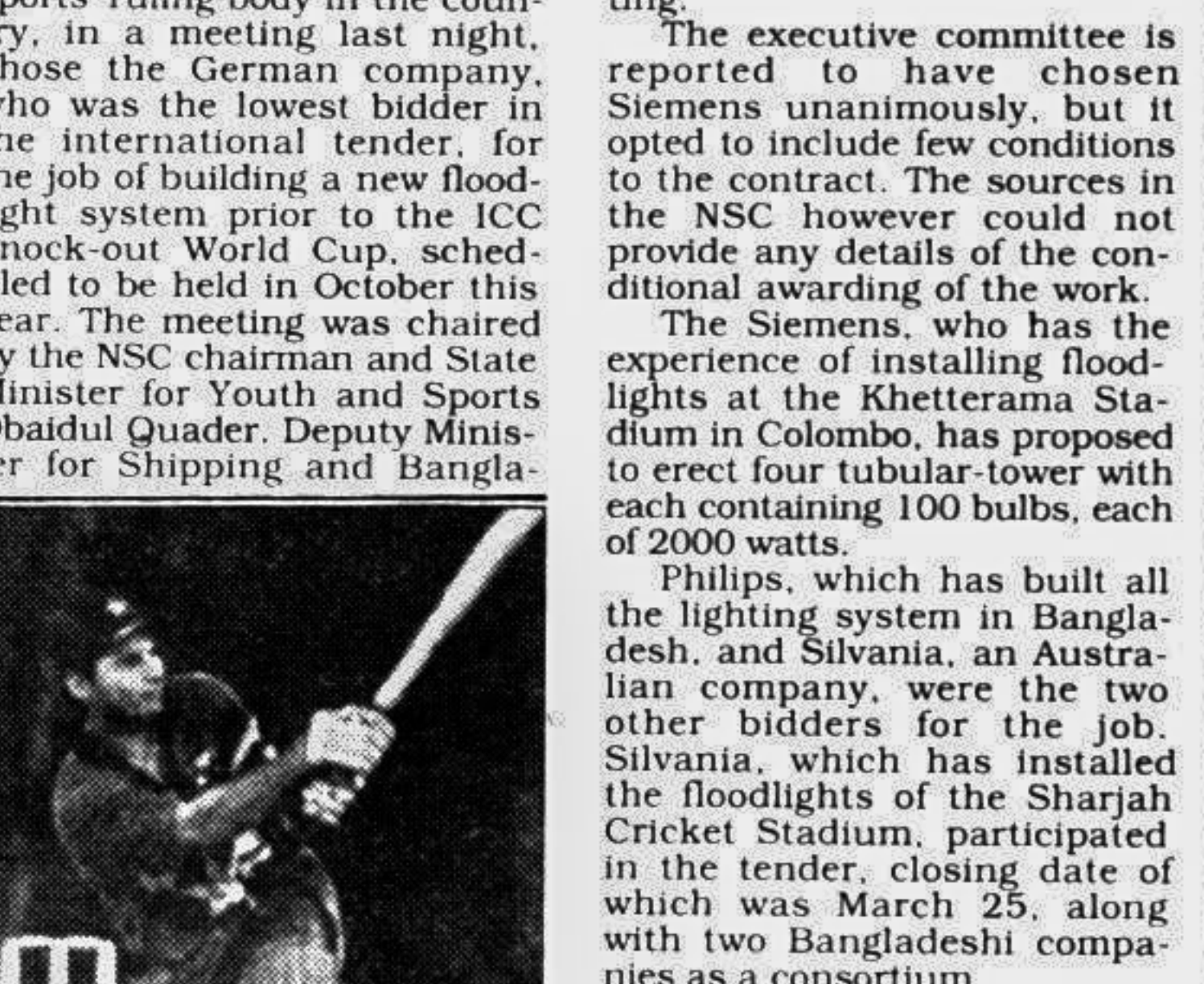
He was however reluctant to make any forecast about Bangladesh's aspirations and expectations. "You never know what awaits us in the tournament. Did any one think that Pakistan would score only 114 in the final against South Africa?" Accepting that the clash with Kenya would be the significant point of our India tour, Gordon said, "The Kenyans had earlier beaten us in a follow in their backyard. But the tournament will provide us the opportunity to get back at them as well as proving that the ICC triumph was not a one-off affair". The national team, now limbering up at the flood-lit Dhaka Stadium, is likely to leave the capital on May 10 for the north-western state of Punjab, where they will appear against the mighty Indians in the inaugural match at Mohali.

ICC Trophy champions Bangladesh along with Kenya and the fancied India will take part in the day-night tournament, to be played on double-leg basis at seven different venues across India. "We have experimented too early and it has hardly helped our cause", commented Hira while explaining the reason behind relying on old guards. "It is not that we have picked them by name, but we have taken those who have performed well in the recent past", said the soft-spoken former national wicketkeeper.

Although we are considering only one wicketkeeper in Khaled Masud for the tournament, I can assure you that Mehrab is a good stopper behind the stumps", said Hira. Mehrab is likely to keep in case of any injury to the regular wicketkeeper Khaled Masud. "But this is not the final selection ahead of our tour to England", said Hira. Bangladesh will tour England as part of its preparation for the 1999 World Cup immediately after the India meet. Floodlights at Dhaka Stadium Siemens gets the job

After a month-long evaluation, the National Sports Council (NSC) yesterday decided to award the Siemens with the installation work of new lighting system at the Dhaka Stadium. The executive committee of sports' ruling body in the country, in a meeting last night, chose the German company, who was the lowest bidder in the international tender, for the job of building a new floodlight system prior to the ICC knock-out World Cup, scheduled to be held in October this year. The meeting was chaired by the NSC chairman and State Minister for Youth and Sports Obaidul Quader. Deputy Minister for Shipping and Bangla-



des Cricket Board (BCB) president Saber Hossain Chowdhury. Bangladesh Olympic Association (BOA) president Lt Gen (ret) Mahbubul Rahman and the NSC secretary ASM Ali Kabir also attended the meeting. The executive committee is reported to have chosen Siemens unanimously, but it opted to include few conditions to the contract. The sources in the NSC however could not provide any details of the conditional awarding of the work. The Siemens, who has the experience of installing floodlights at the Khetterama Stadium in Colombo, has proposed to erect four tubular-tower with each containing 100 bulbs, each of 2000 watts. Philips, which has built all the lighting system in Bangladesh, and Silvania, an Australian company, were the two other bidders for the job. Silvania, which has installed the floodlights of the Sharjah Cricket Stadium, participated in the tender, closing date of which was March 25, along with two Bangladeshi companies as a consortium.

Hanif hails U-16 booters

Mayor of Dhaka City Corporation Mohammad Hanif has congratulated the national youth football team for their victory in the Asian Youth Championship, reports UMB. In a message yesterday, Hanif, who is also the president of Bangladesh Football Federation, said the success would create confidence among the members of the under-16 squad for better performances in the future.

Comfortable victory for Shiliguri

The touring Shiliguri Agramam Sangha under-16 cricket team registered their first win in Bangladesh when they beat a selection of Dhaka-based coaching schools by a convincing eight-wicket in an exhibition match at the Dhaka Stadium yesterday.

Chasing a paltry coaching schools total of 89 in 50 overs, the visitors rattled up 90 in only 25.2 overs with eight wickets in hand. Middle-order Bikramjit Saha scored an unbeaten 31 off 60 balls while opener Chanchal Sarkar remained not out on 30. He struck two fours in his 30-ball innings. The undefeated duo featured in a 61-run partnership for the third wicket after the tourists lost two early wickets of opener Sunamtra (12) and one-down Riddhiman (5).

Earlier, sent into bat first, the local boys were shot out for a meager 89 in 31.1 overs. Kamal Hasan Mandal emerged as the wrecker-in-chief for the Shiliguri Sangha taking three wickets for only 12 in his miserly eight overs. He was ably supported by pacer Sandeep who captured two wickets for 18 runs. Opener Bishwajit (18) and middle-order Nizamuddin (14) were the only two local batsmen, who could score double digit.

It was, so far, the first victory for the visiting team in their five matches. They lost their first match in Nilphamari by five wickets while the other three matches in BKSP, Munsiganj and Sylhet were washed out due to rain.

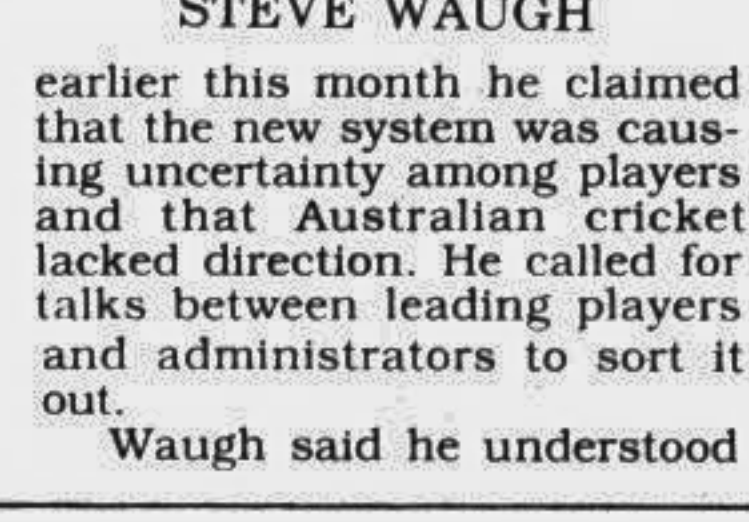
Steve enlightens critics

SYDNEY, Apr 27: Australian one-day cricket captain Steve Waugh today cautioned critics, among them Test skipper Mark Taylor, not to make rushed judgements of Australia's controversial two-team selection policy, reports AFP.

Waugh said the recent three-nation series in India and Sharjah had transformed his improving limited-over team. "I just know from 12 or 13 years' experience that you know when a side comes together and they're making progress and this one-day side was," Waugh said upon the team's return here today.

"And I think we're going to be a strong side, we're going to be hard to beat in the World Cup (1999). "We learnt to play a lot tougher cricket, we were more disciplined in our approach and I think that will be the making of our side."

The touring Australians had to cram 10 one-day matches into 24 days, they beat India in the final of the Indian tournament which also involved Zimbabwe, only for India to reverse that result in the Sharjah tournament where New Zealand were the third team. The Sharjah series ended earlier this month he claimed that the new system was causing uncertainty among players and that Australian cricket lacked direction. He called for talks between leading players and administrators to sort it out. Waugh said he understood the national selectors would sit down with Taylor and himself next week to map out a direction for Australian cricket, but stressed people should not jump to premature conclusions about possible changes to the current two-team, two-captain set-up. "I'd like to give it 12 months and have a look then. I think we're jumping in a bit too early and making rash decisions and harsh judgements without giving it a fair go," Waugh said. "I'd like to may be have a look back now and see where we are and come up with a plan for next year."

Waugh did admit, however, the situation was probably easier for himself than for Taylor. "It's difficult for Mark because he's not in both forms of the game, it's easier for me because I'm playing Tests and one-dayers and it's not disrupting me so much. "But from my point of view, I really enjoyed it and looking forward to continuing it." Waugh said the Australian Cricket Board's decision to play the Ashes (southern) summer before starting the limited overs tri-nation tournament also involving world champions Sri Lanka was good scheduling as it was hard to "mix and match" both forms of the game.

Lara in winning way

LONDON, Apr 27: Reigning champion Warwickshire beat the weather and then beat Surrey with five balls to spare in their English 40-over AXA (Sunday) League match on Sunday, reports Reuters.

It was a first success for new Warwickshire captain Brian Lara, though once again the weather was not quite what used to be in his Caribbean islands. The match, at London's Kennington Oval, was reduced to 10 overs per side after a late start because of rain. Alec Stewart, one of Lara's adversaries from the recent England-West Indies Test series, scored only 17 in his first appearance of the season as Surrey managed 81 for five wickets from their allotted overs.

Warwickshire were always up with the required run rate in reply, as all-rounder Neil Smith continued his fine form. Smith, the son of former England captain Mike Smith, smacked 48 of the first 59 runs and although Lara was caught on the boundary for eight, those were the only two wickets the visitors lost in reaching their target.

Kent, last year's runners-up, won their second match out of two, defeating Glamorgan by eight wickets in a match reduced to 27 overs each. Matthew Walker's unbeaten 62 was the match-winning innings.
