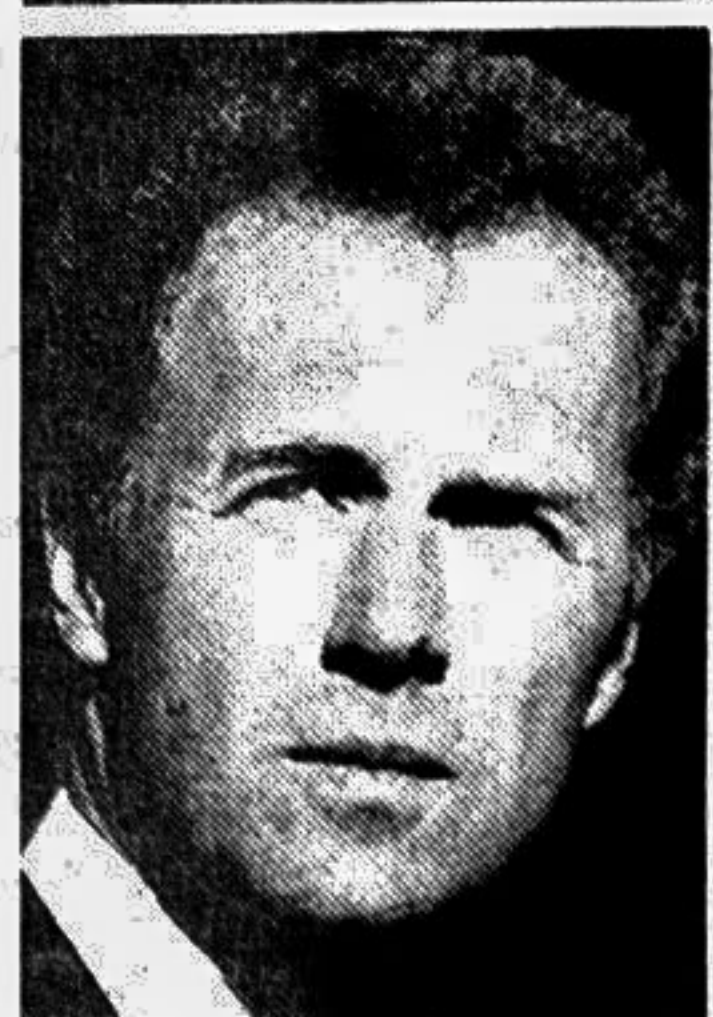

## Nat'l cricket starts today

The first phase of the 24th national cricket championship begins today at different zonal venues across the country, reports UNB.

Four matches will be decided on the opening day.

Rajshahi DSA will take on Lalmonirhat DSA at Thakurgaon, Thakurgaon DSA will take on Chapainawabganj DSA at Bogra, Khulna DSA will meet Jharkhand DSA at Sathira and Narsingdi DSA will encounter Gopalganj at Patuakhali in today's fixtures.

In all, 44 teams, split into five groups, are taking part in the knock out based preliminary round of the competition.

Ten teams — five group champions, four semifinalists of the last meet Chittagong DSA, Dhaka University, Bangladesh Biman and Dhaka DSA along with hosts of final Sylhet DSA — will play in the final round, beginning on May 19.

The zonal semifinal matches will be 80-over-a-side affairs billed for two days while the zonal final will be a three-day match.

## Schools cricket

Rahamatullah Model High School, Ahmed Bawani School and Wari High School reached group finals winning their respective matches of the 16th national schools cricket championship yesterday, reports UNB.

Rahamatullah Model High School outplayed Mohammadpur High School by 8 wickets at the Dhanmondi Club ground.

In the day's other engagement, Nazrul Sikhyaloy and BCSIR School won their respective matches and reached group semifinals.

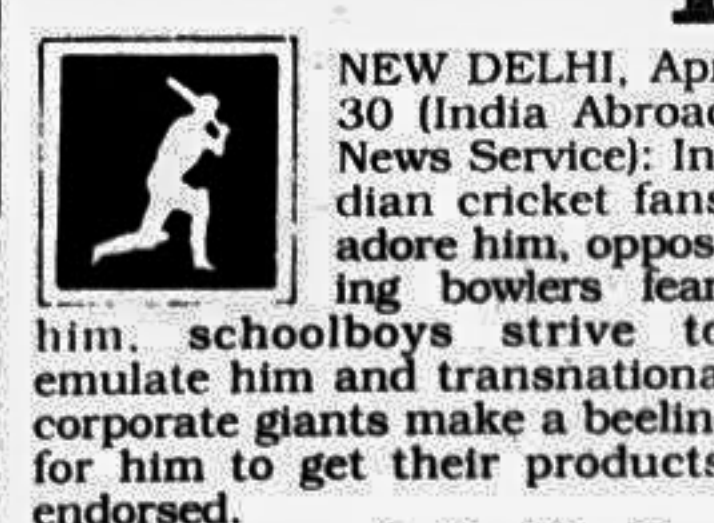

# Sachin puts stars in shade



NEW DELHI, Apr 30 (India Abroad News Service): Indian cricket fans adore him, opposing bowlers fear him, schoolboys strive to emulate him and transnational corporate giants make a beeline for him to get their products endorsed.

That name is Sachin Tendulkar and not since the glory days of Indian cricket in the early '70s has one player captured the imagination of the nation. If in 1971 it was Sunil Gavaskar with 774 runs from four Tests in his debut series against the West Indies, today it is Sachin Tendulkar who is being called the "new Bradman."

The Australian immortal, now approaching 90, is the benchmark by which all batsmen are measured. With 29 centuries from 52 tests at an average of 59.94, "The Don's" figures can never be equaled.

However, such has been Tendulkar's domination since he was stripped of the captaincy late last year that many pundits are talking of the 25-year old as the greatest since Bradman, who retired from Test cricket exactly 50 years ago.

Even Bradman himself in an interview two years ago spoke of how Tendulkar reminded him of himself. This after he saw the Indian reel off two centuries in Australia in 1992. It should be remembered that Tendulkar was still in his teens at the time.

Tendulkar's Test average of 54.84 from 61 matches put him ahead of West Indian captain Brian Lara as the current player with the highest average.

Confirmation that Tendulkar is now the world's best batsman comes in the latest issue of Wisden Cricket Monthly. The authoritative magazine has been compiling for the last two years a table of the best current batsmen and bowlers in the world. Tendulkar, after scoring two centuries in three Tests against the visiting Australians, leapfrogs from his previous seventh spot to number one in the world, displacing Sri Lanka's Sanath Jayasuriya who held the position for the last nine months.

The rankings are based on cumulative performance of the last two years. In this period Tendulkar has played 26 tests

and scored 2,127 runs at an average of 57.49. However, the average Indian cricket fan has eyes only for the one-day game and here Tendulkar's domination is, if anything, even more pronounced.

Tendulkar became the first Indian batsman to hit back-to-back centuries in one-day internationals when he first guided the team into the final of the Coca-Cola Cup at Sharjah, United Arab Emirates, and then propelled them to victory. Both tons came against Australia

whose bowlers have been slammed for 1,130 runs from 12 innings at an average of 113 in all forms of cricket. This includes a double century in the tour match for Mumbai, five centuries and two half-centuries.

No wonder then that the beleaguered Aussie bowlers are beginning to have nightmares about the Little Master and his broad bat. Master leg-spinner Shane Warne, whose battle with Tendulkar was supposed to be the highlight of the clash, admitted as much on his return home last week. Warne was

quoted as saying: "I'll be going to bed having nightmares of Sachin just running down the wickets and belting me over the head for six," something he did with almost monotonous regularity.

Australian one-day captain Steve Waugh has joined the chorus of his countrymen, which includes ex-captains Ian and Greg Chappell and Richie Benaud, in hailing Tendulkar as the best since Bradman. Take out Bradman and he is the best, commented Waugh immediately after the final.

Warne sought out Tendulkar after the Sharjah final and asked him to sign the shirt he wore during the final. In a matter of three months, the man with the most wickets in Test cricket for a spin bowler had gone from rival to spectator to fan.

The manner in which he dominates the Indian batting line-up is evident from the fact that nearly half the runs scored by India at Sharjah came from the bat of the opener — 435 at an average of 87. No wonder Waugh pointedly commented after the Sharjah final, "We were beaten by a great player."

Tendulkar's sense of timing could not have been better. The victory at Sharjah, which reversed the verdict of the Pepsi final just a couple of weeks earlier in New Delhi, came on his 25th birthday (April 24).

It seemed the whole nation was willing him on. In Delhi, cable operators who were not giving the "feed" and the local electricity board that were frequently cutting power to households found themselves facing the wrath of cricket fans. Many offices closed early as people rushed home to watch and for a couple of days all talk of politics was pushed to the background.

His slump in form last year after being appointed captain of the national team saw some of the bigger contracts drying up. But today his face is not only seen on television on the field of play, it is increasingly in evidence during the commercial breaks between each over. The products he endorses cover a vast range — from cola to credit card — and read like a who's who of multinational companies in India. Every Indian, it seems, looks up to him for inspiration. And he is just 25!

# Lazio's telling turnaround

ROME, Apr 30: Lazio scored three times inside a remarkable 10 minutes on Wednesday to wipe out a 2-0 deficit, beat AC Milan and lift the Italian Cup for the first time in 40 years, reports Reuters.

The Rome side entered the second leg at their Olympic Stadium shouldering a 1-0 first leg deficit and appeared to be dead and buried when Italy midfielder Demetrio Albertini gave Milan a vital away goal from a free kick in the 47th minute after a dreadful first half which gave no hint of the drama to follow.

Marco Gottardi equalised eight minutes later, collecting an intelligent ball played across the face of goal by Roberto Mancini to beat goalkeeper Sebastiano Rossi with a simple tap-in which gave Lazio a glimmer of hope.

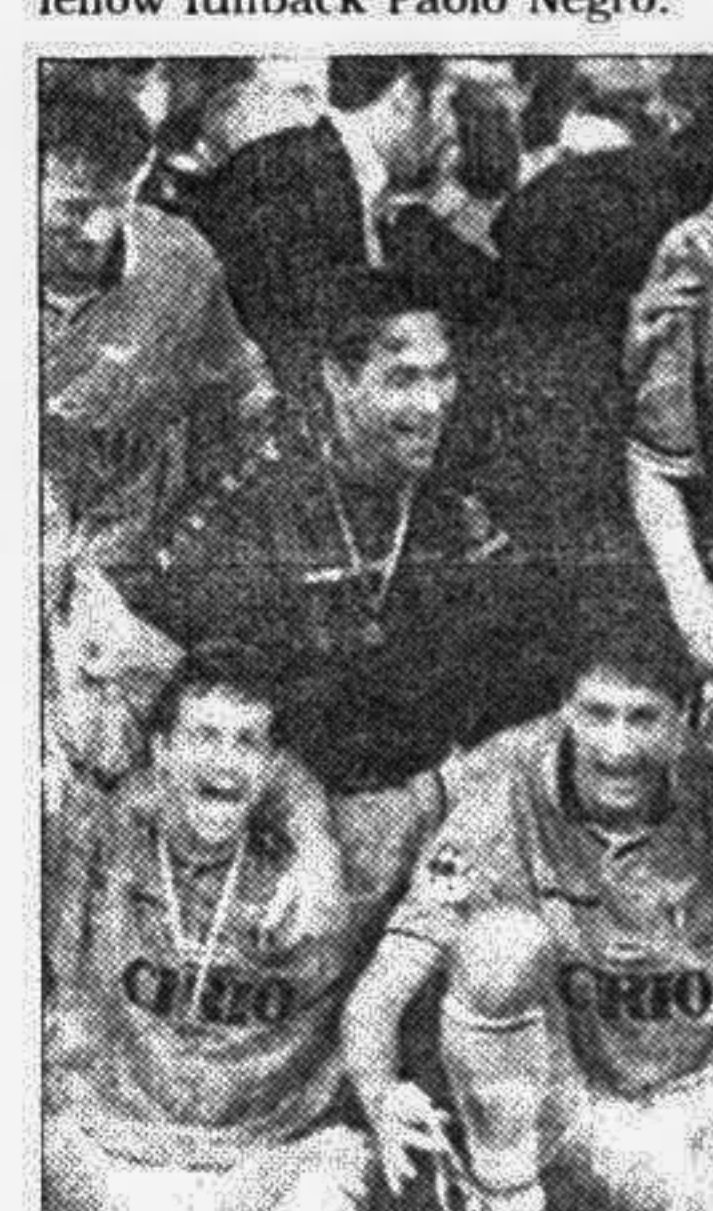
Three minutes late Milan captain Paolo Maldini was adjudged to have fouled Gottardi as the two men fought for a high bouncing ball on the edge of the box.

The referee awarded a penalty. Yugoslav Vladimir Jugovic buried his spot kick and Lazio were back in the tie.

Suddenly they rediscovered the superb football which propelled them to the brink of the league title in the first three months of the year before they succumbed to Juventus at the start of April.

Jugovic and Pavel Nedved were inspired in midfield and, roared on by 60,000 home fans who had been mute throughout the first half, they pressed forward in search of a winner.

Pierluigi Casiraghi almost gave it to them when he struck the post with a close-range shot and then, just three minutes later, Italy defender Alessandro Nesta settled the tie with a close-range strike after Rossi had parried a shot from Nesta's fellow fullback Paolo Negro.

Suddenly it was Milan's turn to attack.

Roberto Donadoni and George Wah came close to puncturing a visibly nervous Lazio defence but, after six minutes of injury time played out against a defending backdrop of whistles from the Lazio fans, the referee blew for full time.

The north curve of the stadium greeted the victory with flares and smoke bombs as the Milan players sank to their knees in despair.

# Lopez baffles Brazilians



RIO DE JANEIRO, Apr 30 (AFP, AP): Claudio Lopez gave Brazil a reality check as they head into the 84th minute to give Argentina a 1-0 victory in an exhibition game Wednesday night at Maracana Stadium.

"Going into France we'll have to play much better," said Brazilian national team coach Mario Zagallo. "Argentina had a much better rhythm and rhythm is very important. The

enabled Brazil's vaunted striking duo of Ronaldo and Romario to score.

Poor finishing prevented Argentina from opening the scoring in the first half, when Lopez, Batistuta, Ortega, Sime-

one and Varon all made attempts but rarely threatened Brazilian keeper Taffarel.

Brazil rarely came close to Argentina keeper Taffarel in the second half. Zagallo made three important changes, sending on Leonardo for Rai, Edmundo for Denilson and Cleber for Aldair, but to no avail.

The mistakes continued, and Brazil's scoring chances remained few and far between.

In one of them, in the 81st minute, Ronaldo exchanged passes with Romario to set himself up in front of the Argentine goal, only to have Burgos anticipate his shot.

Argentina responded immediately. Veron put through Lopez, who raced up the right and fired a shot that Taffarel saved.

But in the 84th, the Valencia forward broke free of Junior Baiano and slotted the ball home.

The 95,000 fans at Maracana Stadium were unimpressed, jeering their lacklustre team. It was the first time Brazil had hosted a match at the fabled ground since a World Cup qualifier against Uruguay five years ago.

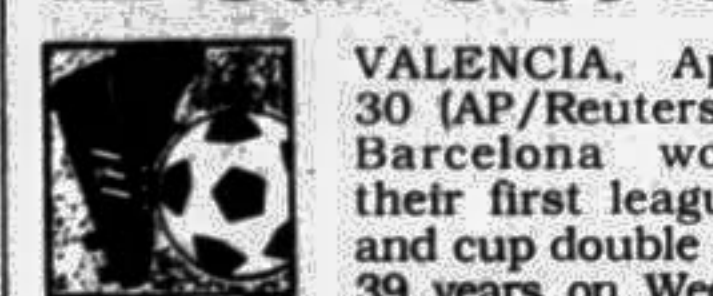
Argentina claimed their 30th victory over their longtime rivals: winning one more than Brazil in the 84 matches contested between them.

# Barca's brilliant double



VALENCIA, Apr 30 (AP/Reuters): Barcelona won their first league and cup double in 39 years on Wednesday by beating Mallorca on penalties in a pulsating Spanish Cup final.

Two Mallorca players were sent off towards the end of normal time with the game locked at 1-1 but the underdogs managed to hold out for 30 minutes of extra time as Barcelona threw everything into attack.

Both sides missed penalties

in the shootout as nerves and tiredness took their toll before Raul Huidobro rounded off a fine debut season for Barcelona by saving from Xabier Etxezarreta to clinch a 5-4 win.

Mallorca had never won a major trophy and were playing in only their second final.

Barcelona's Rivaldo equalised an early goal from Jovan Stankovic midway through the second half.

Stankovic hit wide a crucial penalty that would have won the cup for Mallorca after his keeper Carlos Roa saved from Luis Figo. "Penalties are always

luck," said Hesp. "I'm very happy, the cup is for everybody here."

Hesp had to pick the ball out of his net with the game just seven minutes old when Stankovic blasted home after a fine move down the right from Gabriel Amato.

But the second half was a different story.

The equaliser came when Giovanni found space down the left, and pulled the ball back from the deadball line. Fellow Brazilian Rivaldo connected with the cross, and his shot ricocheted past Roa.

Mallorca seemed to run out of steam when midfield general Vicente Engonga limped off shortly afterwards, and there were chances for Juan Pizzi, Albert Celades, Nadal and Luis Enrique in the closing minutes as Barcelona tightened their grip. The game shifted decisively in the holders' favour six minutes from time. Oscar Mena hacked down Rivaldo from behind and was sent off for the challenge.

Enrique Romero was booked for protesting against the decision, but seemed to be unaware of the caution. With injury time looking, he held back Luis Figo and saw his second yellow card to leave his side with just nine men.

From that moment on, Mallorca's best chance was to hang on for penalties. The chances rained in on Roa's goal and substitute striker Juan Pizzi missed two clear chances, one of which hit the post.

Roa pushed an effort from Giovanni against the post with just two minutes left on the clock, and continued his heroic performance in the penalties.

With a record 24 Cups, Barcelona has drawn ahead of Athletic de Bilbao who had won 23 times before Wednesday's final.

Barcelona clinched the league title two weeks ago, although the season still has three games to go. Winning their fourth double, their first in 39 years, draws them even with rival Real Madrid's achievement.
