An Indian midsummer madness?

MOHALI, May 13: India's travel weary cricketers hit the road again from Thursday to tackle lowly Bangladesh and Kenya in a one-day series slammed by critics as midsummer madness, reports AFP.

The hastily arranged series comes less than a month after a busy home season against Australia denying the players a well-earned rest at the height of the Indian summer.

The day-night tournament is being projected as a chance for India's fringe players to play alongside the seniors against the new entrants into the world of one-day cricket.

Privately, officials talk of "milking the sponsors dry" for an event that has generated little enthusiasm among India's cricket-crazy millions.

Officials at the venues for India's matches in the doubleleg preliminary league are so worried about empty stands that they reportedly asked the national selectors to include crowd-puller Sachin Tendulkar in the team.

The selectors responded partially, keeping the master batsman away from the first leg but promising to play him and other stars like Anil Kumble in the later stages.

Mohammad Azharuddin will lead the hosts in Thursopener against Bangladesh here before flying to London to attend a meeting of the nine Test captains on May

Vice-captain Ajay Jadeja will take over till Azharuddin returns either for the last league match or the final at Calcutta's Eden Gardens on May 31.

"There is no reason to complain," said Azharuddin, enjoying an extraordinary second stint as captain in which he has won two limited-overs series in Dhaka and Sharjah besides the Test series against Australia.

"It's a good chance for the youngsters who complain of not getting enough exposure in the busy season, it'll toughen them up in the heat."

For Kenya and Bangladesh, granted one-day status after qualifying for next year's World Cup in England, the tournament provides a rare opportunity to gain experience. Kenya, who scored a memo-

rable win over the West Indies during the 1996 World Cup. have played just two one-day tournaments since then. "We are grateful to the Indian

board for arranging this series, said Kenya's new captain Asif Karim, "Most of the boys have not played under lights so this is a great opportunity."

Emirates to sponsor '99 Cricket WC

Emirates, the international airline of the UAE, announced that, for the first time, it would be a global partner and official carrier of the Cricket World Cup to be played in England from May 14 to June 20, 1999, says a press release.

The chairman of Emirates Sheikh Ahmed bin Saeed Al Maktoum making the announcement together with tournament director Terry Blake, said: "This is the first time that Emirates has been involved in a major sponsorship involving cricket, but we were attracted to the event as all the participants, except the West Indies, come from countries which we serve."

Terry Blake added: "Next year's World Cup will be a celebration of cricket with the object of spreading the game to more and more countries. We are absolutely delighted that a quality airline such as Emirates should become one of our major marketing partners and we also hope that this will help to enhance interest in the Gulf countries.

Although this is the first cricket sponsorship for Emirates, the airline is famous for its support of sporting events. including New Market horse races, the Dubai World Cup, the world's richest horse race. Longchamp, the World Powerboat Championships in Dubai, the PGA Desert Classic and the Dubai Rugby Sevens.

The 47-year-old general wants to go out in a blaze of glory after being in charge since 1993 and leading Romania to the most successful period in their history.

that two years ago he resigned but Romanian officials refused to accept it and convinced him to return and prepare the side for France. In 1994 in the United States, lordanescu led Romania to

only manage one goal as they suffered three straight defeats. If they are to do well in France, Romania desperately need one man to perform at his

he may have lost a little pace. his left foot remains as deadly as ever and he still averages a goal almost every third international.

Romania loom as one of the dark horse candidates in France after romping unbeaten through their qualifying group. It has to be remembered they have many of the same players on deck this time around, who had made it to the last eight in USA 98.

Hagi, occasionally used as an out-and-out striker but more often as a playmaker, is this time expected to play in the role behind Viorel Moldovan of Coventry City and Adrian Ilie of Valencia.

He will almost certainly start after scoring five goals in six appearances as Romania won nine of their 10 qualifying matches, Albeit against less than stellar opposition. Opponents will need to be aware of his menace not only from freekicks but also with inventive corners. Hagi's creative partner is the exciting FC Cologne midfielder Dorinel Munteanu.

Attack definitely is Romania's strength and the combined force of Lile, Ilie Dumitrescu and rejuvenated veteran Marius Lacatus will be a handful for any opposing defence. At the back Chelsea's irre-

pressible Dan Petrescu remains the key man. The 30-year-old is a solid
