UNITED NATIONS, May 14: The UN Security Council today strongly deplored India's nuclear tests after Pakistani ally China dropped demands for an outright condemnation, report agencies.

In a statement adopted by consensus among the 15 members, the Council said it "strongly deplores" India's three tests on Monday, followed by two more on Wednesday "despite overwhelming international concern and protests."

The Council "strongly urges India to refrain from any further tests," the statement said, expressing concern at the tests' effects on regional peace and se-

## Call JS standing body meet soon, BNP urges govt

The BNP has called upon the government to convene immediate meeting of Parliamentary Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs to discuss the issue of five underground nuclear tests conducted by India on May 11 and 13, reports UNB.

In a statement yesterday, members of the standing committee Prof A Q M Badruddoza Chowdhury, M Morshed Khan and Shamsul Islam said in the wake of five Indian nuclear tests, strong negative reactions are pouring in from the countries across the world.

But, they said, the reaction of the government was conspicuous by its silence.

### 9 absconding accused traced in 6 countries: Home Minister

Home Minister Rafiqul Islam yesterday said nine of the 14 absconding accused in the Bangabandhu Murder Case were traced in six countries, reports

"Four countries have confirmed the presence of five absconders, and we have traced four more absconders in three countries," he told reporters on his return from a 10-day visit to Interpol Headquarters in Paris and London. Whereabouts of five others

could not be known, he said. Rafiq, said the Interpol authorities have issued 'red notices' to its member countries providing the descriptions of the absconders as requested by the government. Those who have been traced

are Major Bazlul Huda in Bangkok, Major Mohiuddin in the USA, Captain Kismot Hashem and Lt Nazmul Hassan A isal un Canada and Col Abdul Aziz Pasha in Zimbabwe.

# Tk 2150 cr budget for CHT development

The government has planned various development projects for the Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) with an estimated budget of about Tk 2150 crore.

"The Special Affairs Division has already prepared a need assessment report on development activities to be taken up immediately and on short, mid and long term basis with a budget of Tk 2149.17 crore in the next five years," Chief Whip of the Jatiya Sangsad and Chairman of the National Committee on CHT Abul Hasnat Abdullah told a press confer-

ence in the city yesterday.

Held at the NEC auditorium at the Planning Commission, the press conference was also addressed by State Minister for Planning and Science and Technology Dr Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir and Prime Minister's Parliamentary Affairs Adviser Suranjit Sengupta.

Abdullah said that a joint GOB (Government Bangladesh)-Development Partner Group, comprising representatives of the development partners, the Planning Commission and the Special Affairs Division, has been formed in this regard. A Need Assessment Mission, working on the issue, will soon submit its report to

the government, he said. In the current fiscal year, Abdullah said, block allocations for the development of CHT region had been raised from Tk 25 crore to Tk 28 crore and from Tk six crore to Tk nine crore for the three local government councils in the CHT. Besides, another Tk eight crore was allocated for implementing new projects in the re-

# Manipulation of balance sheet

# Orion Infusion hides default loan status

To unsuspecting share market investors. Orion Infusion looked a good company to invest in. Its dividends were high, its future plans rosy and profit substantial.

But these were all on paper. In reality, the company had manipulated its balance sheet which was certified by an auditor to hide the true picture of the company from the general public. Today the company is in deep trouble and is likely to face a money suit from the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), and investors are left in the cold

As the watchdog of the capital market, SEC's role has come under a lot of questions, as it did not act on time.

A Daily Star investigation detected some serious discrepancies regarding the company's loans obtained from two banks. The company's balance sheet audited by Nizamuddin & Co showed an amount of Tk 12.47 crore in outstanding loans with Agrani Bank and another 4.97 crore with Janata Bank.

But documents obtained by The Daily Star clearly show that Orion Infusion had deliberately hidden the actual amount of the loan with Agrani Bank and its status. Orion Infusion, in fact, had Tk 21.49 crore loans with the bank as on June

30, 1996, the date on which the balance sheet was drawn. This is Tk nine crore higher than the amount shown in the balance sheet. Moreover, the total amount of the loan is in default category since December 1995. Its loan with Janata Bank, now at 5.69 crore is also in the default category.

The company's annual re-port for 1996 should have clearly mentioned the status of the loans which it did not. According to audit experts, the auditor of the company, Nizamuddin and Co, should have checked with the banks before certifying the loan status and the amount, which it had not done. Audit experts say this is a clear violation of the law. Experts also point out that

had the company truly reflected the loan situation, the balance sneet would have shown a different picture of the company and the investors could have taken informed decisions. Managing Director of Orion

Infusion Obaidul Karim acknowledged to The Daily Star that his company's balance sheet carries inaccurate information regarding the loan status and amount. He has also admitted that these are default

# Many billionaires show annual income below Tk 55000: Kibria

Finance Minister S A M S Kibria yesterday came down hard on the business community, saying that many of their members are not paying taxes.


