### Lara savours success

LONDON, May 15: Derbyshire crashed to an innings defeat inside two days against Warwickshire in the county championship at the Racecourse Ground on Thursday, reports AFP.

Wicketkeeper Warren Hegg was unbeaten on 51 at stumps, as Lancashire sought to bury Kent, who were bowled out for 186 Wednesday.

Ben Smith was Thursday's other century maker. He scored an unbeaten 121 off 211 balls as. Leicestershire took charge of their match with Gloucestershire at Bristol.

Gloucestershire, bowled out for just 134 in their first innings, were reduced to 16 for three early on, before captain Mark Alleyne (56) and Matt Windows (38) put on 112 for the fourth wicket. Both fell in the final overs, though, and Gloucestershire subsided to a perilous 146 for six still 71 short of making the visitors bat again.

# -Kapil puts his war-paint on!

NEW DELHI, May 15: Indian legend Kapil Dev Thursday launched a crusade to oust cricket officials in his home state of Haryana, saying they were "corrupt and uncaring," reports AFP.

Kapil said the current leaders of the Haryana Cricket Association (HCA) had made a mockery of the game in the "They make pots of money,

but care a damn for the welfare of cricketers in Haryana," Kapil said. "I will not rest till they are removed from office." His fire is directed in partic-

ular against Ranbir Singh, a

former secretary of the Indian cricket board who has been running the HCA for the past two decades. "The HCA has become Ran-

bir's personal property. He does as he pleases, there is no one to question him about finances etc," Kapil said.

Present and former Test stars hailing from Haryana, such as current vice-captain Ajay Jadeja, Ashok Malhotra, Chetan Sharma and Vijay Yaday, have strongly supported Kapil's campaign.

"Only a person of Kapil's stature can bring about a change," Jadeja said, adding that 10 of the 16 affiliate units of the HCA were behind him.

Kapil, a successful businessman since retiring from the game in 1994, said he was not averse to taking over the administration of the HCA if "I can be of any help."

Kapil also heads a special committee of the Indian cricket board which supervises the preparations of wickets and outfields at various Test centres around the country. Ranbir Singh, son of

Haryana Chief Minister Bansi Lal, denied Kapil's charges, saying the HCA functioned in a democratic and transparent manner.

## Lothar aims to lift German Cup

BERLIN, May 15: Lothar Matthaeus is dreaming of ending one of the most memorable weeks of his prolific career by helping Bayern Munich lift the German cup for the first time in 12 years, reports Reuters.

The veteran libero, who was on the pitch when Bayern last put their hands on the trophy with a 5-2 win over VFB Stuttgart in 1986, will marshall the Bavarians' defence in Saturday's final against MSV Duisburg.

The 37-year-old Matthaeus, recalled by Germany head coach Berti Vogts last Monday to play in his fifth World Cup finals in France next month. sounded confident that Bayern would end a disappointing season on a high note.

As Bayern will play in the Champions' League next season, Duisburg will get a ticket to the Cup Winners' Cup whatever the outcome of the game at Berlin's Olympic Stadium.

# The best team won

Despite a goalless final, this was a successful World Cup, well organised by the Americans, who justified FIFA's faith in them. It was blessed with record crowds (average 68,529), impeccably behaved, and played for the most part in the best of spirits. TV schedules meant that many matches were played in conditions of intense heat and humidity, however, but FIFA's new law interpretations had the desired effect of producing open, attacking football and allowing skill to flourish.

The World Cup was decided on penalties for the first time, and Roberto Baggio's miss that gave Brazil victory was a sad climax to what had been a thrilling tournament deservedly won by the best team.

The format for the finals was retained with the exception that in the first round groups a win would be worth three points instead of two. FIFA, still not recovered from the criticism. introduced a number of late instructions to referees for interpreting the laws.

The two most contentious rulings on interpretation involved making the "tackle from behind" a red-card offence and giving attacking players more advantage in off-side situations. Both new interpretations needed more clarification and testing before being put into practice fairly, and Brazil's first two goals against Holland in the quarter-finals should

probably not have been allowed. Cameroon were a disappointment after their brilliant showing in 1990, but Nigeria exhibited Africa's wealth of talent by finishing top of their group with a goal difference bettered only by Brazil. Perhaps the biggest disappointment was the much-vaunted Colombian side who came bottom of their group and were beaten 2-1 by the United States. The captain of the vanquished, defender Andres Escobar, who put through his own goal, was murdered in Amedellin car park on his return home to Colombia, a tragedy that puts into perspective the ups and downs of success and failure on the football

With no team of their own in the finals, British allegiance was switched to the Irish team, coached by Jack Charlton. They brought off the first sensation of the finals when Ray Houghton's spectacular goal gave team 1-0 victory over the mighty Italians. Among the personalities to make their mark in the first round was Saudi striker Saeed Owairan, who scored the finest individual goal in the finals against


But the starling individual performance of the tournament was supplied by Valencia's Russian star Oleg Salenko. Without an international goal to his credit before the finals, he scored five — a World Cup record — as Russians beat Cameroon 6l in a vain effort to qualify for the next round of the competi-

In the last sixteen Ireland could not recover from their defensive lapses against Holland. Brazil went through, thanks to Bebeto, while Nigeria were on the verge of taking a mighty scalp, after Italy's Zola had been sent off. They led until the 88th minute, when Roberto Baggio finally came alive, equalised and scored the winner from the spot in the extra time. Argentina succumbed 3-2 to Rumania and the genius of Hagi in one of the most memorable matches of the tournament.

In the quarter-finals Bulgaria chalked up a famous triumph over holders Germany. Romania, however, went out against Sweden in penalties after a dramatic game. Italy had beaten Spain 2-1 and Holland lost a five-goal thriller to Brazil.

The defensive qualities of both sides triumphed in the final. Italy brought back Baresi, three weeks after a key-hole surgery to his knee, and the veteran was magnificent. So, too, was Maldini. Brazil's central defensive pair, Aldair and Marcio Santos were outstanding. A cameo performance from young substitute Viola in the second period of extra-time injected some spice in the game.

But the match finished goalless and for the first, and hopefully for the last, time a world cup final had to be decided on penalties. Brazil's captain Dunga shot his team into lead before, finally, Baggio lifted his kick over the goal to give Brazil victory.

ian player to see his World Cup dreams shattered on Thursday when he was dropped from the World Cup squad because of injury, reports Reuters.


