Govt committed to modernise land admin management system: Khasru

Law, Justice and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Abdul Matin Khasru yesterday said the present government is committed to mordernise the land administration agement system aiming at dispelling the sufferings of the

common people, reports BSS. He said, "the present land administration system is incapable of meeting the need of the time and also not wholly transparent. This state of affairs needs to be changed basing on technical, procedural, legal and administrative reforms.

The minister said this while inaugurating as the chief guest a two-day workshop on "Mod-ernisation of land administration in Bangladesh" organised jointly by the Ministry of Land and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) at Bangladesh Institute of Administration and Management (BIAM) in the city.

Chaired by Land Secretary Mohammad Omar Farooq, the inaugural session was also addressed by State Minister for Land Rashed Mosharraf, State Minister for Planning, Science and Technology Dr Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir, acting resident representative of ADB Francis

Narayan as special guests.

Director General of Land Record and Survey Mohammad Shafiuddin presented the

keynote paper. Law Minister said it is true that the time befitting and independent land administration system has not been materialised till today resulting in disputes relating to ownership

of land across the country He said over 80 per cent cases, both civil and criminal are arising out of land disputes. He said huge number of land dispute cases are now pending before different courts of the

He said at present the land

administration and management system is largely corrupt for which common people living in rural areas are facing unlimited harassment.

Although the system is responsible, it has to be changed and collective efforts should be made to reduce the problems relating to land administration

and management, he added. He said in determining the absolute ownership of land through an acceptable, proper and correct record of right procedure in land management can contribute substantially to settle the land disputes.

He said, "Our people expect an honest, efficient, transparent and accountable land reform system." He hoped that the workshop would help the government with suggestions for a Betar earns Tk 11 cr


BARC governing body meet held
