



A team goes to Singapore **May 27**

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) vesterday announced a 17-member Bangladesh A team for a three-match one-day series against Singapore starting from May 28.

Former national captain Faruque Ahmed will lead the second string national side which includes 14 cricketers and three officials. This is for the first time Faruque has been recalled to lead any BCB selection since he led Bangladesh A against MCC a few years back.

Harunur Rashid, the balding Kalabagan opener, has been named as Faruque's deputy for the tour in which Bangladesh will play their first match on May 28. The second match against fellow ICC associate member will be held on May 30 while the last match is scheduled for the following day. The team will leave for Sin-

gapore on May 27. Former national left-arm seamer Dipu Roy Choudhury has been appointed coach of the team. A S M Ali Khabir, a BCB vice-president, will be the manager with Sheikh Nizamuddin, who masterminded the success of the Saber-led panel in the recently concluded election of the Board, will act as the associate manager

The fourteen players have been asked to report coach Roy at the Dhaka Stadium at 3 pm

UTRECHT, Netherlands, May 19: The dominant figure in world hockey over the past decade, Sha-

hbaz Ahmed will be hoping for a triumphant farewell from the game over the next two weeks culminating in Pakistan retaining their World Cup trophy here on June 1, reports

Shahbaz, who announced in March he would retire after this World Cup, has enjoyed more comebacks to the international. side than George Foreman has to the boxing ring - no less than three times has he fallen out with the authorities only to announce he was willing to re-

turn if required. The answer has always been an emphatic yes and this time round Shahbaz, who has appeared in three previous World Cups and three Olympics, wants to bow out having helped his country to their fifth world ti-

want Pakistan to win two world titles in a row and then I will hang up my boots for good. There will be no comeback after that," he said.

"We may not be the Brazil of the soccer world but we wills till show potential to win the cup," he insisted. Shahbaz, who won player-

of-the-tournament in the 1990 World Cup although his team were beaten by the Netherlands in the final in Lahore, earned his latest recall after Pakistan failed to impress in last year's Champions Trophy in Sydney.

Pakistan, who have overtaken bitter rivals India as the greatest force in hockey in the past 20 years, have a tough pool as they face a much improved Australia, who are revitalised under coach Terry Walsh, Olympic silver medalists Spain, the faltering 1988 Olympic gold medalists England and the two minnows Poland and Malaysia, who finished fourth and sixth respectively in last year's, World Cup qualifying tournament.

Pakistan have displayed inconsistent form in recent months, just getting the better of India 4-3 in their seven Test series, beating South Africa easily enough but then slumping to an embarrassing tied series (1-1) with Kenya, losing 4-3 in the second match.

Australia, the Olympic bronze medalists, and Spain, who were runners-up in the in-

augural 1971 World Cup, will probably fight out the second placing behind Pakistan in the pool while England will relay heavily on the giant figure of Calum Giles to convert penalty corners, he scored a hat-trick of them against New Zealand last week, and the outstanding veteran Russell Garcia to get them a respectable finishing spot.

Pool A features two European giants of the world hockey scene Germany and the Netherlands along with Canada, Korea, New Zealand and India.

The Netherlands, who are the Olympic champions, were on fire early last year rattling in 14 goals in just three matches in the Rabobank international trophy, including a 4-0 belting of Pakistan, although the losers had the excuse of just finishing a six-match series with Australia.

However, the Dutch, who understandably had to rebuild the side after losing some of their most influential players including the legendary Floris Bovelander after the Olympic victory, performed disappoint-ingly in the champions Trophy finishing well out of contention

for a final spot. This should give some hope to Germany, who finished fourth last time, and even India, who are desperate to add to their single World Cup success back in 1975 — their captain that day Ajitpal Singh has been appointed the side's manager

for the World Cup. The eight time Olympic champions included their captain and ace forward Dhanraj Pillay in the squad despite the fact he was still nursing a leg injury, although the management team are confident he will be fit for their tough opening first match against

Germany on May 21. The women's event should be dominated by reigning champions Australia although they will be pushed hard in Pool A by Germany, who they beat 2-1 in the Champions Trophy final last year - Scotland, South Africa, the United States and China make up the remainder of the pool.

Pool B should be a contest between the Netherlands, who are not as convinced as everybody else that Australia are dead certs for the title, and South Korea, who finished fifth last time but took bronze at the Champions Trophy which included inflicting Australia's first defeat of last year, 3-2 in the tournament.

England, whose experimental squad just avoided last place in the Champions Trophy, India and New Zealand all came through the World Cup qualifying tournament and will be fighting out the minor placings while Argentina will do very well to repeat their runners-up performance in the last World

The tournament is the first to feature both men and women.

LONDON, May 19 (Reuters): AC Milan's Fabio Capello, like Arrigo Sacchi before him, ignored popular football wisdom and paid

Never go back, the saying goes - particularly when you have won and done all there is to win and do.

But Capello, like Sacchi who built an all-conquering Milan team in the late 1980s, could not ignore the siren call of owner Silvio Berlusconi and the San Siro Stadium.

"Berlusconi called me and I could not say no," he said in June as he returned to a club crying out for guidance.

On Tuesday, after a "last supper" with Berlusconi, Capello's second coming ended in the first dismissal of a hitherto sparkling career, according to club sources.

Capello was seen leaving Berlusconi's Villa outside Milan just before midnight on Monday apparently furious, but Berlusconi said the meeting had gone well.

Media reports have suggested Udinese coach Alberto Zaccheroni would be given Capello's job, moving with German striker Oliver Bierhoff who has already signed. Capello's fate mirrored that

of Sacchi, his second reign suffering in comparison to the The former Italy coach, a friend of Berlusconi and Capel-

lo's predecessor, went back for a second spell at Milan in December 1996 but was pushed out in June 1997. But whereas Sacchi, despite taking Italy to the final of the

1994 World Cup, had been pilloried as national coach and was used to hostility. Capello was not. Three times a Serie A winner

with Juventus and once with Milan as a player, Capello had a charmed soccer life. He took over from Sacchi as Milan

coach in 1991 and piloted the club to four league titles. They also won the European

Cup in 1993-94 and the European Supercup in 1994-95, the season when they finished fourth. In 1996, he moved to Real Madrid and won the Spanish league title.

The irony of the timing of his dismissal, one day before Real's appearance in the European Cup final when they hope to win Europe's top trophy for the first time since 1996, will not be lost on the 51-year-old
