

LONDON, May 27: A leading FIFA official insisted Tuesday that the 2002 World Cup will not be transferred to England from Japan and South Korea. despite the economic crisis in south-east Asia, reports AFP.

"There is absolutely no doubt that Japan and South Korea will organise the first World

Diego's appeal turned down

BUENOS AIRES, May 27: Argentina's Supreme Court rejected Tuesday an appeal by Diego Maradona's lawyers to move his case involving four reporters to a federal court, reports AP.

The case involves the soccer star's actions during a February 1994 incident when Maradona fired an air rifle at photographers and journalists outside his country home.

Maradona had offered to do community service, but a provincial court hearing the case rejected the petition.

The rejection by the country's high court opens the way for Dante Pietrafesa, the presiding judge, to make a ruling in the case.

Prosecutors are seeking a four-year sentence.

Maradona, 37, has been suspended from soccer twice. The first time for 15 months for cocaine use after a 1991 Italian league match and the second for use of the drug ephedrine during the USA '94 World Cup.




The six local teams are last year's runners-up, Biman, Hotel Purbani. Modhumita. Dhaka Clubs-1 &2 and Gulshan Club.




