BIRMINGHAM, England, June 4 (Reuters): Statistically, Graeme Hick is one of the impressive

batsmen in cricket history. At the age of 32, he is the second-youngest batsman to score 100 first class centuries and only Sir Donald Bradman and Denis Compton of the 24 men to compile a century of centuries have done so in fewer innings.

Yet Worcestershire's unassuming Zimbabwe-born batsman will not be among the England XI who meet South Africa in the first Test today. Opinion is divided on Hick's

merits at international level. Only four is his centuries have been scored in 46 England appearances and the cruel tag of "flat track bully" coined by former New Zealand off-spinner John Bracewell has stuck. Certainly, after his unhappy

debut against the fearsome West Indies pace bowling in 1991, he has proved vulnerable at different times to the bouncer, yorker and googly. His supporters say he has

still averaged 36.10 in an unsuccessful England side and has three times been out in the 90s. Still the disparity between his Test average and his career average of 56.58 suggests he has yet to impose himself on the Test arena and time is now running out.

"I am not lacking any desire to play international cricket, Hick said after reaching his landmark against Sussex on

Sunday. "I've been batting well so far this season and if I keep doing that you can only hope you'll make the right people sit up and take notice.

"I certainly hope I'll get the chance to play for England

Saudi Arabia, Mexico draw

CRETEIL, France, June 4: Mexico and Saudi Arabia played to a scoreless draw Wednesday in a World Cup warm-up that showed little flair by either side, reports AP.

Mexico controlled the ball longer but the Saudis created more scoring chances. The evening match was watched by 5.000 spectators in this Parisian suburb.

Saudi Arabia came close to scoring in the first minute when Khalid al Muwalid shot wide from one metre. In the 22nd, Sammy al Jaber couldn't head a ball from a good position, with Mexican goalkeeper Osvaldo Perez beaten.

The Saudis face Denmark in their World Cup opener June 12 in Lens. Mexico open against Korea on June 13 in Lyon.

into the record books was in front of the Worcestershire supporters who have witnessed so many of his best innings. "Worcester has become a

very special place for me and if I could have chosen anywhere in the world to score my 100th hundred apart from in a Test match it would have been here at New Road", he said. The moment of triumph was

greeted by a standing ovation from the crowd of 2,000 and a glass of champagne brought to the wicket by Worcestershire president Tom Graveney, the former England batsman, who achieved the feat himself in "The last 20 runs were tough

to go through because the crowd were reacting to every run," Hick said, "the closer I got the more I was thinking I didn't want to waste the chance and have to go through it all again. "So I was really relieved to scamper the last two runs."







PARIS, June 4 (Reuters): Morocco have been dealt a tough World Cup draw but the North Af-

ricans believe they have a good chance of reaching the second round in France.

One of Africa's veteran Cup campaigners they will benefit from many players being wellacquanted with conditions in France. Coach Henri Michel, himself

a French man, believes his

team have a better than even

chance of creating a minor shock in June, even though they have been paired in Group A with defending champions Brazil, Norway and Scotland. We want to go past the opening round group. We can forget first place in our group with

Brazil there, but we have chance of beating Norway to second position," says Michel. Qualifying for France looked difficult on paper with the talented Ghanians in their group, but Morocco made light work of

A 2-2 draw in Ghana set them up to top the group, and they sealed qualification when Khalid Raghib headed the only goal against the Ghanians in front of 90,000 delirious fans in Casablanca.

In October they performed creditably in Belem against their World Cup opponents Brazil, the 2-0 defeat coming only courtesy of a late Denilson brace for the South Americans. Less encouraging was the

disappointing African Nations' Cup campaign in Burkina Faso in February which saw Morocco eliminated in the quarter finals by South Africa and lose their ranking as Africa's best team.

"Naturally, it was a disappointment but we had key players out with injury and illness and this cost us," said Michel. Among those was Salaheddine Bassir, who has scored 15 times for his country in the last

18 months. Bassir was fit against for the king Hassan II warm-up tournament in Casablanca last week, scoring twice in the 2-2 draw with France. "Without him our attack was not the

same," Michel said. With this in mind, Michel criss-crossed Europe in an effort to unearth new talent among the growing number of Moroccans playing in Europe and he also brought back Italian-based defender Rachid Nekrouz.

Most of his squad come from clubs in Europe, which Michel admits makes life difficult for a
