South Africa were struggling at 195 for 5 on the third day of the first Test against England at Edgbaston yesterday.

At the time of filing of the report late last night, Jonty Rhodes (36) was batting with Shaun Pollock. England paceman Dominic Cork celebrated his recall to the international cricket with a blistering spell of swing bowling. He took four wickets for only 52 runs in 23 overs to inflict the stunning collapse.

England pacer Darren Gough has had his finger broken by Donald after taking the new ball, and will not bowl or bat for the rest of the match. He is expected to be out for 6 weeks and will miss the Lord's Test.

## Inter sign Baggio

MILAN, June 6 (AFP/ Internet): Italian World Cup star Roberto Baggio has signed a two year contract to play at Inter Milan alongside Brazilian ace Ronaldo.

The club announced the deal with the 31-year-old striker here on Friday.

Inter President Massimo Moratti has made no secret of his desire to secure the services of Baggio, who nearly ended up at the club in 1995 when he left Juventus.

Instead he had what proved to be an unhappy two-year stay at neighbours AC Milan before linking up with Bologna last summer. Baggio secured his Italian World Cup berth following one of the best seasons of his illustrious career, rounded off with a personal record of 22 goals.

## Sheringham says sorry

BISHAM ABBEY, England, Jun 6: England striker Teddy Sheringham apologised Saturday for a late-night drinking spree at a Portuguese nightclub which openly defied instructions of coach Glenn Hoddle. reports AP.

Hoddle, under some pressure to drop Sheringham, said there was no similarity between this case and that of Paul Gascoigne: Hoddle cut Gascoigne last weekend, distressed by his late-night habits and lack of fitness.

"I've been proud to be a professional footballer for 15 vears," said Sheringham, speaking in a subdued tone at the team's training site in southern England.

"I've played 33 times for England and been very proud to do so. I care about what I do and I

want to continue playing for England. "I have explained what happened in Portugal to Glenn

Hoddle. I now want to put this matter behind me and the England team as quickly as possible. I intend to learn from the experience. Sheringham's photo was

splashed across papers Friday, showing him with a cigarette in the mouth and his arm draped a young woman in a bar on Portugal's Algarve coast. Accompanying stories said he had been partying and drinking until dawn.

After breaking training camp in Spain last weekend. Hoddle reminded players they were "on England duty" and ask them to return home for a quiet few days before training resumed.

The incident put Hoddle on the spot, particularly since Sheringham is regarded as a much less-talented player than Gascoigne.

"This is unlike the Paul Gascoigne case," Hoddle said. "I'm sure people will say they are being treated differently but with Paul it wasn't a case of a drinking situation but about his fitness."

nament. "Officials should not use the government's budget to go to see the World Cup," the spokesman

"This is a warning, because we have learned there are many Thai government officials planning trips to Europe while the World Cup is on," he added.

Kobsak said officials travelling abroad must not try to extend their trips as an effort to get to France, but should abide by civil service regulations which say they should return home one day after meetings.

Blame it

RIO DE JANEIRO, Jun 6: Brazil's assistant coach Zico has boosted security at this Rio de Janeiro home because of a furious backlash from soccer fans blaming him for the exclusion of Romario from the World Cup squad, local media said, reports Reuters.

O Dia newspaper said drug dealers in the poor neighbourhood where Romario grew up had burned his club Flamengo's red and black flag to send a warning to Zico. O Dia said Zico was worried

and had hired two security guards at his home in a wealthy Rio neighbourhood. He also cut off his phone and asked his wife and three children not to read their E-mails for fear of their contents, media reported.

Romario, a national hero for his 1994 World Cup performance, was dropped from the champions' team in France because of injury, a day after he had promised he would be fit to

The announcement stunned and angered Brazil's fans who felt he was key to a fifth cup

Their wrath fell hardest on Zico, once worshipped as one of the greatest players in Brazilian history, because of rumours he had pushed for Romario's exclusion.




