

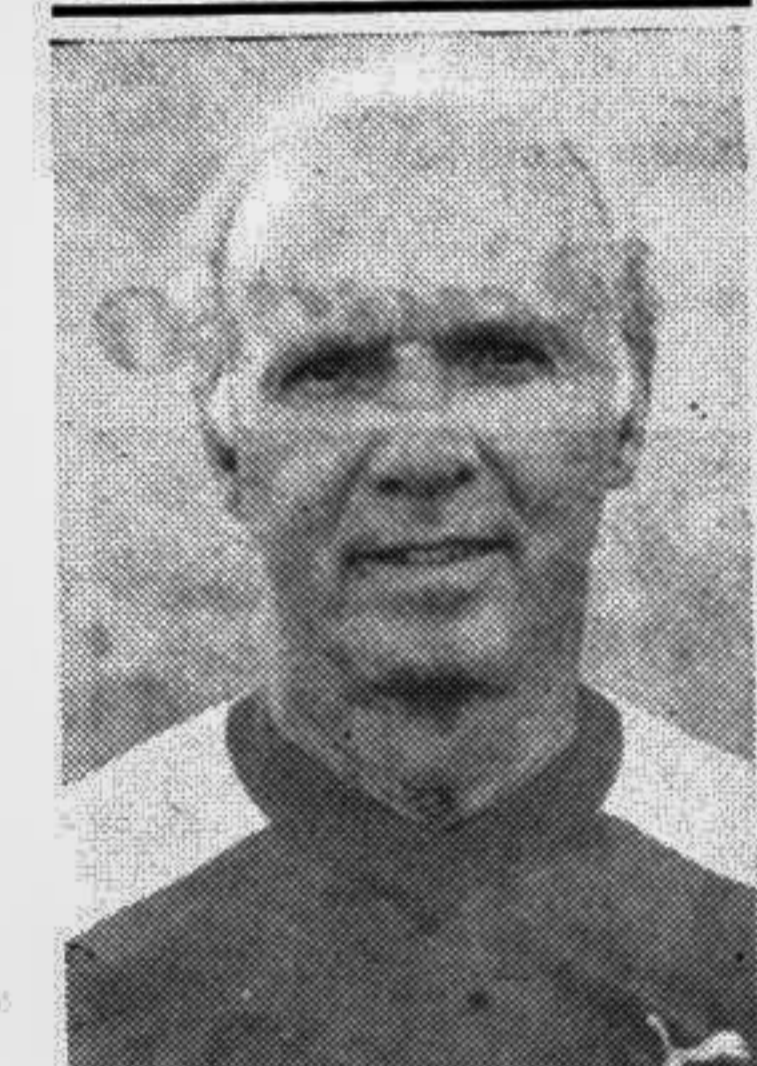

It's still a rumour

LETRAT, France, Jun 11: The Argentinian World Cup delegation Saturday angrily denied rumours that internal doping tests had proved positive for one of its players, reports AP. "I'm tired of denying rumours. Let's talk about soccer, please. I don't know where this silly story comes from," the team's coach, Daniel Passarella, said at a news conference.

The rumour was spread by a radio station in Argentina. It suggested that the player involved was Juan Veron, from Italy's Sampdoria. Veron said he felt 'mad and sad, as I have a family behind me. They (the radio station reporters) even made up comments attributed to me. I never said anything. This is the first time I speak on this issue,' he told reporters.

In spite of the denials, rumours persisted that the controls showed the presence of some kind of dubious substance. "It's possible that some substance might have showed up, but it is well known that most players had the flu," the team's physician, Luis Sevoso, said at the same news conference.

"People are talking a lot of nonsense," Sevoso said, though he added fuel to the controversy by saying he would make some inquiries. "Tonight I will visit each room and tell the players not to take any medicine without my consent," he said.

Argentina's Soccer Association president Julio Grondona had said early today that he knew nothing about the alleged doping. "In any case, that's what the controls are for. We don't want a repeat of what happened in 1994."

He referred to a positive test by Diego Maradona after the second game of the 1994 World Cup in the United States. Argentina dropped Maradona from the rest of the tournament and he was later banned by FIFA for 15 months for his second positive test.

After that World Cup, in which Argentina was eliminated in the second round, coach Alfio Basile was replaced by Passarella, who took over with the mission of imposing a strict discipline in the team and preventing new episodes of this kind.

One of the first measures he took was ordering regular doping tests.

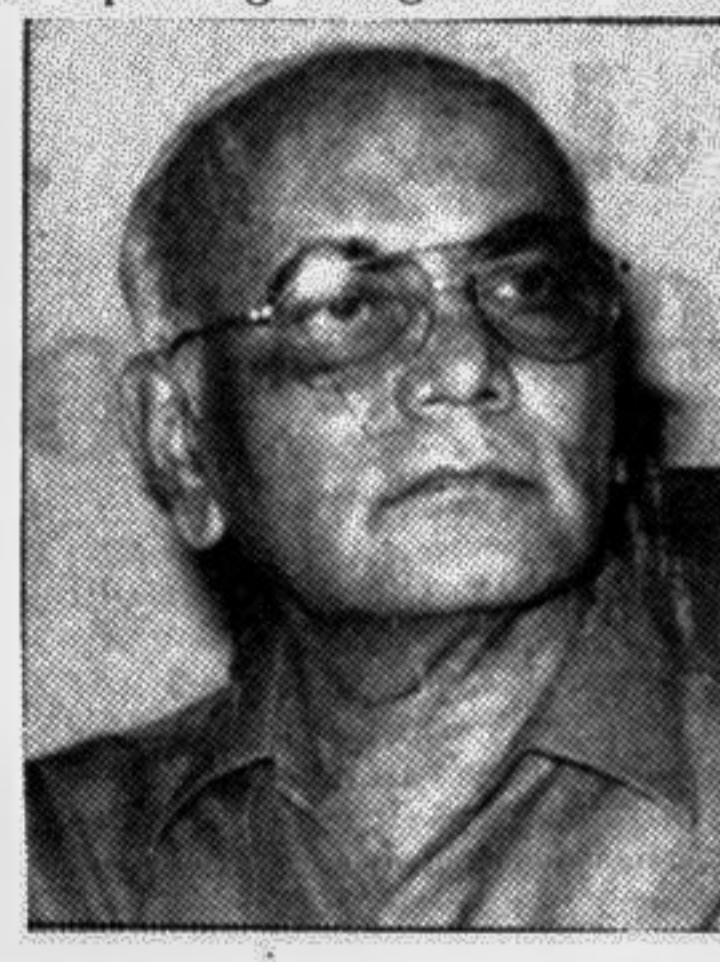

Bangladesh 52/2 in 17 overs

 Bangladesh scored 52 for two in 17 overs in reply to Ireland Provincial Eleven's 194, according to the message received here late last night. Opener Mohammad Rafique returned for a duck in the second over while his partner Athar Ali Khan was out after scoring 13 in a rain-interrupted match at the Malahide Cricket Club ground. Faruque Ahmed and vice-captain Aminul Islam were at the crease to guide Bangladesh to the coast. Bangladesh made four changes in the line-up that played the first match against Ireland in Belfast on June 5. Faruque replaced Minhazul Abedin while Athar Rahman gave Khaled Masood a break behind the wicket. Young leg-spinner Tanveer Khan made his debut for the national team and Zakir Hasan came in for left arm seamer Morshed Ali Khan. Earlier, batting first, the provincial selection of Ireland were restricted to 194 for five in the stipulated 50 overs. Khaled Mahmud, Mohammad Rafique and Naimur Rahman captured one wicket each for the tourists. Bangladesh lost their tour opener against the Irish national side by four wickets.

Saber elected ICC executive member

President of Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) and Deputy Minister for Shipping Saber Hossain Chowdhury has been elected an executive committee member of the International Cricket Council (ICC) for the year 1998-99, according to a message received in Dhaka yesterday, reports BSS. The election was held during the ICC conference now being held at Lord's. Two other members, elected in the ICC executive committee



are Tinku Iman from Malaysia and Joe Buzavla Gibraltar. BCB general secretary Syed Ashrafal Huq has been elected member of ICC cricket management committee securing the highest number of votes. The other two members in the committee are from Hong Kong and Scotland.

Nat'l chess

Abdullah Al Rakib, Syed Mahfuzur Rahman Imon and Shawkat Hossain Pallab are jointly leading in the 24th national chess championship securing full four points at the end of the 4th round matches yesterday, reports UNB.

In the fourth round matches, Rakib of Leonine Chess Club beat Ashrafur Rahman Murad, Imon of Magura DSA defeated Deen Mohammad Swapon, and Pallab beat Firoj Ahmed at the NSC chess room.

Four players with three and a half points each followed the leaders after the day's encounters. They are IM Reefat bin Sattar, Khandaker Kayes Hasan, Nazmul Haq Rotan, Moniruzaman Khan and Mizanur Rahman Labu.

Negative tests

PARIS, Jun 11: The first eight doping control tests carried out at the World Cup finals proved negative, FIFA spokesman Keith Copper said today, reports Reuters.

Two players from each of the four teams who played in Wednesday's opening games between Brazil and Scotland, and Norway and Morocco, were tested after their names were drawn at random at halftime.

Goalkeeper Taffarel and non-playing substitute Goncalves were tested in the Brazil team, while Scottish skipper Colin Hendry and non-playing substitute Scott Booth were also asked to provide specimens at the Stade de France.

The four players who were tested at Montpellier were Abderrahim Ouakil and Salaheddine Bassir of Morocco and Qyvind Leonhardsen and Stale Solbakken of Norway. Only three players have tested positive at a World Cup — Ernst Jean-Oseph of Haiti in 1974, Willie Johnston of Scotland in 1978 and Diego Maradona of Argentina in 1994.
