Loan to sick units Spl body to be set up to recommend interest remission

A special committee, headed by a retired district judge, will be set up to consider prayer for remission of interest of the enlisted sick industries which had borrowed up to Tk 50 lakh from the state-owned banks, reports

Finance Minister Shah A M S Kibria in his budget speech told parliament Thursday that the committee might recommend remission of interest and penal interest up to 100 per cent taking into account the condition of sick industries, previous relief, if any, financial capacity, honesty, reputation and statements of the entrepre-

The government will reimburse 50 per cent of such remitted interest to banks, he added. The finance minister said the amount due as determined by the special committee would be payable in 36 monthly installments within a maximum period of three years.

Also, the enlisted sick industries which had borrowed over Tk 50 lakh may submit proposals to banks for a compromise, he said, adding that the banks would take appropriate decision in such cases taking into account the bank-client relationship.

The minister said where court cases are pending, all proceedings would be taken within the legal framework without compromising the interest of the banks.

In order to compensate the losses of banks for the implementation of these measures the minister proposed to issue bonds worth Tk 60 crore in the new financial year. He said, "If needed, allocations for this purpose will be enhanced in the future."

BSRS earns Tk 4.45 cr pre-tax profit

Bangladesh Shilpa Rin Sangstha (BSRS) has said it has earned a pre-tax profit of Tk 4.45 crore during the financial year of 1996-97, reports BSS.

This profit has been ascertained on the basis of actual realisation.

Out of the profit Tk 1.25 crore will be provided for payment of income tax to the government and Tk 70 lakh will be paid to the national exchequer, said a BSRS press release.

While approving the audited accounts of BSRS for FY 1996-97 at a meeting, the Board of Directors of BSRS held on June 11. with Hasnat Abdul Hye. Chairman Board of Directors and Secretary, Local Government Division, in the chair.

The board expressed its satsfaction at the earning of profit and hoped that the management would improve the realisation of loans.

Economic Survey says

Power production falls to 2400mw

The power supply situation in the country has deteriorated as production fell amidst ever increasing demand, says the Economic Survey 1998, reports Parliament Thursday.

The highest power genera-tion capacity was 2908 megawatt in 1996-97 while installed capacity for power gen-eration was 3091 MW in 1997-

But the real production de-creased to 2350-2400 MW due to lack of gas supply, and because some power plants have become obsolete.

"It was not possible to supply

Nat'l Pay Scale Block allocation of Tk 110 cr proposed

to remove disparity Finance Minister S A M S Kibria has proposed a block al-location of Tk 110 crore in the 1998-99 budget to meet the demands of various groups affected by the new national pay scale, reports UNB.

"No new pay scale is equally beneficial to all groups. Benefits vary in the process of pay fixation." he said in his budget speech Thursday.

However, the Finance Minister said, the government is "sympathetically considering the demands of various groups. and a block allocation of Tk 110 crore has been proposed for this purpose in the new budget.

Kibria said the expenditure on salaries has increased by Tk 1334.64 crore in the revenue budget and Tk 158.91 crore in development budget in fiscal year 1998-99 over the expenditure prior to implementation of new pay scale.

As part of anti-poverty campaign, the Finance Minister said, the Employment Generation Bank will start operations this month.

Taka 50 crore has been provided in the current year's budget as government's contribution to the bank's capital, he added. In the new budget, Kibria

proposed Tk 25 crore additional allocation to this bank for next year. He also proposed additional Tk eight crore to the Housing Fund which started operation with a capital of Tk 50 power according to the highest requirement for the last few years due to shortage in production," said the Survey placed in

The present average power generation capacity of the country stands at 1900 MW as some power plants are undergoing renovation and maintenance. The Survey estimated that

the demand for power in the year 2000 will be 3150 MW. It also mentioned that the government has undertaken a power sector reform programme to improve the situation.

The government is taking all possible steps to increase power production and allowed the private sector to generate power, it

Arrangement has also been made to put into operation the 210 MW capacity sixth unit at Ghorashal and the 100 MW barge-mounted power plant at Khulna by next August.

In the private sector, two barge-mounted power plants of 100 MW capacity will be set up at Khulna and Haripur. An agreement was also signed with Rural Power Company to set up a 60 MW gas turbine power plant at Mymensingh.

Another contract will be signed soon for setting up a 450 MW combined cycle power plant at Meghna Ghat while initiative has been taken to set up a 100 MW gas turbine power plant at Baghabari.

Pakistan, India should sign 'no first use of N-arms' accord

ISLAMABAD, June 12: Pakistani opposition leader Benazir Bhutto urged Islamabad and New Delhi to reach a 'no first stir agreement following their nuclear test programmes in an interview published to-

day, reports AFP. Pakistan "should immedi ately enter into a 'no first use of nuclear weapons' agreement with India," she told The Nation Daily. The former prime minister

also advocated an independent Pakistan policy over the global nuclear test ban treaty after having achieved nuclear parity with its giant neighbour.

It invited India to joint it in a formal test ban treaty in a bid to defuse tensions on the subcontinent.

Pakistan is ready to reach a "no-nuclear' test agreement with India as an important confidence-building measure at the regional level," the foreign office here said in a statement.

India on Friday dismissed Pakistan's offer saving it was meaningless since New Delhi had already declared a unilateral moratorium after its May 11 and May 13 nuclear tests.
