### 1 Second convocation of IUB held

By Staff Correspondent The private universities of the country can build themselves as the centres of excellence by checking the tide of brain drain.

This was stated by National Professor Muhammad Shamsul Huq in convocation speech at the second convocation of the Independent University of Bangladesh (IUB) at the Osmany Memorial Hall in the city yesterday.

Prof Huq who was earlier appointed an honorary fellow of the university, said that among the problems now crippling our educational system, campus violence is at the centre of public attention which is overshadowing other crucial problems like access to higher education and the content and quality of higher education.

Underscoring the need for expansion of higher education facilities. Prof Hug said that the present enrolment of 99,717 in nine universities was not enough as it was a mere fraction of the total number of candidates seeking admission to the universities.

Prof Huq urged the government as well as the private university entrepreneurs to come forward with specific steps and efforts to modify and modernise educational system.

IUB President Dr A Majeed Khan presided over the convocation and conferred degrees to 34 students. Convocation of the six-year-old private university was attended by a number of academicians, guardians and educationists.

## Budget hailed

NARAYANGANJ, June 13: The Narayanganj Chamber of Commerce and Industry (NCCI) in an emergency executive committee meeting held here today reviewed different aspects of the proposed national budget for the fiscal year 1998-99 and termed it a balanced and people-oriented budget, reports

Chaired by NCCI president Bazlur Rahman, the meeting hailed the government for taking steps for rehabilitation of sick industries, allocations of Taka two thousand crore in power and energy sector, and proposal for creation of special fund for the welfare of women and children.

The meeting observed the reduction of tax on different consumer goods including computer and its spare parts would create a positive impact on national economy, the release

UNB adds: Institution of Textile Engineers and Technologists (ITET) yesterday hailed the budgetary proposal for continuing the 25 per cent cash in centive as "alternative facilities" for the textiles sector.

The ITET in a statement termed the proposal in the new national budget as realistic and said without the alternative facilities the local fabrics would fail to compete in the international market with neighbouring fabrics producing countries. It suggested that such facilities continue till 2005.

The ITET said the export of ready-made garments will face a serious setback after 2005 backward spinning, weaving and dying-finishing mills were not set up as backward linkage within a short time.

It welcomed the proposal for withdrawing excise duty from synthetic fibre and hoped that this decision would bring down the price of locally produced synthetic or mixed fabrics.

The ITET, however, demanded total withdrawal of excise duty from machinery. spare parts and from colour and chemicals used in textiles and

jute industries. It also wants supply of gas to jute and textiles industries at the rate of Tk 1.68, a facility being enjoyed by PDB to produce
