

Daud Khan Majlis dead

Veteran journalist and broadcaster Daud Khan Majlis, who had distinguished career spanning over four decades at home and abroad, died of a heart attack at a city clinic yesterday morning. He was 69.

His namaj-e-janaza was held at the Battul Mukarram mosque after Asr prayers. He was buried at the Mirpur Intellectuals Graveyard.

Born in 1933, Daud Khan Majlis was the eldest son of Mohd Yusuf Khan Majlis of Borail, Manikganj.

He did his MA from Dhaka University in Political Science and started his career as a journalist in 1952 with the then East Pakistan Radio and was a reporter of daily Sangbad.

He joined the Voice of America in 1956 and where he worked till 1959. From 1960 until 1974, he worked as the Director, Department of Films and Publications (DFP) and then as DG in the Information Ministry. From 1972 till 1975 he served as Managing Director of FDC. After retiring from FDC, he was appointed Advisor to President Ziaur Rahman.

In 1981 he left for USA as a guest lecturer at MIT in 1982, he again rejoined VOA in Washington as Bureau chief for South Asia and South East Asia. He returned home after retiring in

In his long journalistic career he was closely associated with NBC, Financial Times and Far Eastern Economic Review.

Daud Khan Majlis has been suffering from heart problems for a long time and underwent a by-pass surgery in Washington a few years back. He developed cardio-respiratory problems on June 2 and was admitted to the Bangladesh Medical College Hospital where he breathed his

Khan Majlis has left behind his wife, a daughter, a son and a host of friends and relatives to mourn his death.

From Page 1 The DCCI appreciated the budget for higher allocation for poverty alleviation and human resource development, steps proposed for revitalisation of capital market, higher mobilisation of domestic resources, and its targets of 8.1 per cent industrial growth and higher GDP growth rate.

It criticised the government for 'failing to check' the growing inflation rate, declining trend in foreign exchange reserve, increase in unproductive expenditure and increasing loss in the State Owned Enterprises (SOEs).

The DCCI said that most of the proposals submitted by trade bodies during a series of pre-budget discussions with the government were not reflected in the budget.

"Some of the proposals were accepted partially in such a manner that their benefit will be minimised by the unfavourable effects," it noted.

The budget lacked any proposal for increasing private sector investment in power sector, which was vital for growth of industries as well as the whole economy, DCCI said.

"Both local and foreign investors have been unable to invest due to shortage of power," it said adding that the matter had been affecting the growth of existing industries and would affect new ones.

Regarding the budget proposals for reviving sick industries the Chamber observed that those might not be effective unless the problems were resolved at in the possible time.


