43 pc of female commercial sex workers suffer from STDs

Forty three per cent of the female commercial sex workers have been suffering from sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) while 41 per cent of the male clients have the same exposure, reports UNB.

This was disclosed at a dissemination seminar on CIDA-Special Activities Fund (SAF) project under the Fourth Population and Health Project (FPHP) at a city hotel today.

Secretary Health Muhammed Ali inaugurated the seminar sponsored and organised by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and Canadian International Development Agency and Research Evaluation Association for Development (READ).

Canadian High Commissioner in Dhaka Nicholas Etheridge was present as special guest at the opening session of the seminar.

Health Ministry under FPHP (1992-1998) launched the CIDA SAF projects to encourage design, and implementation of innovative research studies.

Under this programme, 30 different projects were conducted by GOB, NGOs and private sector agencies.

Twenty one studies were classified into five broad categories: Nutrition, Reproductive Health, Health Economics, Programme Assessment and Special Targets.

The target population covered in the studies included users of family planning and health, service providers and field workers, pregnant mothers, adolescents, commercial

Presenting the key note paper Executive Director of READ Dr Syed Jahangeer Haider said selected commercial sex workers (CSWs) were effective educators for their peers and practice of condoms were increased substantially among the CSWs.

The key note paper showed that the rate of condom use was increased to 73 per cent from 23 per cent at the end of the SAF project studies.

Dr Haider in his key note paper said dissemination of useful and relevant information on sexual behaviour and health risk perception among the high risk population is critical for prevention of STDs.

The key-note, however, showed that Palli Nurse (rural trained birth attendants) where accepted by the community as dependable source of safe delivery by the community.

About 65 per cent of the deliveries were performed by them in the study area.

The key-note also revealed that planned and intensive educational efforts particularly by Family Welfare Assistants and participation of mothers-inlaw and husbands motivated 61 per cent of the rural pregnant women to attend group meetings on Anti-Natal Care (ANC) compared to 24 per cent in the control areas.

It said knowledge of male health assistants (HAs) was observed poor on ANC, an impediment to the motivation of husband on safe motherhood. Re-

ferral of clients for improve care by HAs was not satisfac-

Some 34 per cent of non users expressed the desire to use contraceptives indicating substantial level of unmet need.

The key note paper said overall wastage of oral contra-ceptive by GOB, NGOs and Social Marketing Company was 25 per cent while net wastage of condom in the programme was 18 per cent per annum.

Dr Haider said leakage from stores, inflated sales from pharmacies leading to smuggling were identified as major reasons for wastage.

Secretary Health Muhammed Ali said the government has approved the Health and Population Sector Strategies (HPSS) and the Health and Population Sector Programme (HPSP).

He said health and population sector will enter into a new phase of programme development and changes with the launching of HPSP in next

Nicholas Etheridge said the SAF programme will only be useful if the findings are known to the people who might be able to apply this information in their work.

Hence, he said, the government asked that one of the last SAF activities to be funded should be this dissemination seminar for fitting use of these resources

Canadian High Commissioner said the SAF programme was planned 7-year back with the intent of furthering the objective of FPHP.

Rohingyas to be repatriated by end of current month

Bangladesh is confident that repatriation of Rohingya refugees that remained stalled for the past several months would start by end of current month, a reliable source said here yesterday, reports BSS.

The source said the repatriation of Rohingya refugees to their homeland Myanmar is "expected" to resume by end of

The Task Force constituted last month at a meeting with Foreign Minister Abdus Samad Azad in the chair to look into the process of restarting of repatriation of refugees had its meeting in Cox's Bazar yesterday. The meeting had a through review of the bottlenecks in the way of preparation of the list of refugees for restarting the repatriation process, the source

The source said because of the machination of some armed and defiant refugees, the process of voluntary consent, a precondition for repatriation is being delayed. He hoped that things would be sorted out soon and the process of repatriation will start again.

Around twenty thousand Rohingya refugees are now living in Kutupalang and Nayapara camp in Cox's Bazar district. Before the repatriation was stalled months back. 2,29,000 out of 2,50,000 were repatriated.

These refugees, most of whom came between 1991 and 1992 by their actions have caused among others, environmental degradation by destroying forest resources.

Meanwhile, it was learnt that the lists of 1152 refugees vetted by UNHCR have been sent to Yangon through diplomatic channel. Reception camps will be opened on Myanmar side once the authorities there decide to take its nationals back.

agement made many changes in the draft that was initially agreed upon by employees way back in January this year. But sources in the manage-

ment confirmed it to this correspondent that there would be no breach of agreement reached between the authorities and the employees in regard to service

Dr A K Miah, president of the Diabetic Hospital's officers club, told The Daily Star that some 67 changes were made in the service rule and he feared.
