

#### Biman raises fare in domestic, int'l routes twice since '96

### Leading Indian dailies say

## Hasina's visit to Delhi 'useful and timely'

NEW DELHI, June 18: The Indian press today described as "useful and timely" the just concluded day long visit of Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina here, reports

In separate editorials the leading dailies like The Pioneer, the Asian Age, The Hindustan Times and The National Herald welcomed the initiative of Sheikh Hasina to promote peace in South Asian region.

"The Pioneer in its editorial published today said the Bangladesh Prime Minister's visit has dispelled the notion that she was keen to act as a mediator between India and Pakistan.

Sheikh Hasina's response that each country had the sovereign right to assess its security concerns and to plan appropriate measures, appears pragmatic, the paper said, adding her emphasis on a dis-cussion of bilateral matters on a purely bilateral basis rules out any mediatory role between India and Pakistan.

The paper referred to the trilateral business summit among India, Pakistan and Bangladesh held in Dhaka in January this year and said, in fact Sheikh Hasina's initiative in seeking a meeting with top leadership of new government in Delhi has served useful purposes. It said both Hasina and Vajpayee jointly identified the Ganga waters treaty as a major landmark in the bilateral relations between the two neighbours. The discussions between the two leaders must have also allayed then apprehensions with some sections in Dhaka that the new BJP-led government may seek to review some provisions of the Ganga water treaty.

In its editorial. The Hindustan Times said India has reasons to be happy with the outcome of Vajpayee's talks with Sheikh Hasina.

The Awami League Prime

Minister, the paper said, has been under tremendous pressure after the Pokhran blasts to come out against India on the nuclear issue but the very fact that she restrained herself and even accepted the sovereign right of India to take appropriate measures based on its own security perceptions, speaks well of her confidence in friendship with India, and a shared commitment to

strengthen bilateral relations. It said Vajpayee could convince the Bangladesh Prime Minister of India's commitment to full disarmament and to its objective of making South Asia 'a zone of peace.'

In another editorial. The Asian Age said Sheikh Hasina's good offices could have been used by India to send a message to Islamabad without project ing this as an intrusion into its sovereignty.

Another daily the National Herald said Sheikh Hasina's visit to India sets at rest the apprehensions voiced in a section of public opinion that the recent nuclear tests conducted by New Delhi might cast a dark shadow over its otherwise strong ties with Dhaka.

The political maturity Sheikh Hasina has displayed in confining herself to only bilateral issues and nonpolitical multilateral (SAARC) ones has been well matched by that of Vajpayee, the paper observed.

It said Vajpayee used the opportunity of his counterpart's visit to explain to her at length the rationale behind the recent nuclear tests and acquaint her with some of the initiatives India has taken to instill confidence in neighbours about New Delhi's commitment to peace and disarmament in the region.

The mutual understanding Dhaka and New Delhi have displayed should serve as a model for developing relations between Indian and other neighbours as well.

## BNP Secy Gen urges farmers to realise their demands

BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan on Wednesday described the government as the "greatest enemy" of farmers and called on them to raise their voice to realise their demands, reports UNB. "Save the country — save the

farmers" was one of the slogans of Awami League during its election campaign, but it did harm to the farmers after assuming power," he said welcoming the leaders of the newly formed committee of Jatiyatabadi Krishak Dal. Bhuiyan said the farmers

have not only been deprived of the due price of their produces during the last two years, but also did not get their production

'More worrying is that the prices of fertilizer, diesel and other agricultural inputs were increased during the period."

The BNP leader also accused the government of harassing thousands of farmers by filing certificate cases against them and thus taking away their property and belongings.

He called on the leaders of the Jatiyatabadi Krishak Dal to be more active in realising the rights of the farmers and expose the betraval character of the government.

After the meeting. Bhuiyan along with the Krishak Dal leaders went to the mazar of Shaheed President Ziaur Rahman, laid wreaths there and offered fateha.

At the mazar, Mahabubul Alam Tara, Absar Ahmed Siddiqui, Borhan Uddin Ahmed, Shamsuzzaman Dudu MP, Majibur Rahman, Mirza Alamgir, Abul Kalam Azad MP. Goutam Chakrawarty MP were, among others, present.
