AI alleges widespread violations of HR in country

Al said several prisoners of conscience were among scores of people detained under the Special Powers Act (SPA) which permits detention without charge or trial for an indefinite period. Four senior members of the opposition BNP were detained without charge in March 1997 and were released by a High Court order.

"In December three prisoners died in Narayanganj district jail after falling ill while awaiting trial and the deaths sparked renewed protests about prison conditions," the report said. Al praised the government

for "a political solution to the long-standing conflict" in CHT by signing of a peace accord in December 1997. The Al report said that the

"whereabout of Kalpana Chakma, a tribal women's rights activist who was reportedly 'disappeared' in the CHT in June 1996, remained unknown". "A government appointed commission of inquiry into the case had submitted its final report to the government in February 1997, but its findings were not made public by the end of the year," the report

Al said that at least 33 peo-ple were sentenced to death for murder and at least two of them were executed.

Obaidul Kader distributed trophies among the winners of the tournaments final game played between Rajdia and Keyain cricket teams.


Road mishaps One killed, 15 others hurt

In another accident, 15 people were injured in a collision between a bus and a minibus in Surma Tea Garden area. Six of the injured were admitted to the local thana health complex.






City BNP convenor visits Bashar's family


