Seminar on water contamination

Speakers suggest stricter laws to help combat environment pollution

Speakers at a seminar yesterday demanded formulation of a National Water Management Policy and stricter laws to check increasing pace of environment pollution which is posing a grave threat to the biological world.

Emphasising on an allout movement to force the government to take steps against pollution, they opined that the issues like environment pollution and nature conservation should be included in the curriculums of schools.

Addressing a seminar on "Water Contamination: Cause, Effect and Remedies" at the WVA auditorium in the city yesterday, they also suggested inception of "Environmental Court" to look into the cases relating to violations of environmental laws.

Presided over by Khushi Kabir of Nijera Kari, the seminar was jointly organised by ADAB and Coalition of Environmental NGOs (CEN) in observance of the World Environment Day. keynote paper in the seminar while scientist Dr Abdullah Al Muti Sharfuddin, Dr Zahiruddin Chowdhury of BUET, BIDS Research Fellow Dr Atiur Rahman, journalist Santosh Gupta. ADAB president Kazi Faruque Ahmed, director of Environment Directorate (ED) Reazuddin Ahmed and DG of ED FR Khan among others took part in

the discussion.

In her paper Sanchita Roy said indiscriminate use of chemical fertiliser and pesticide, dumping of industrial wastes into the rivers, unplanned sewerage system and dumping of atomic wastes in the oceans were the sole causes of water contamination. She said that the earth was losing fertility, water-beings including fishes were threatened and the human beings were faced with serious diseases and physical complications due to the water pollution.

Abdullah Al Muti Sharfuddin said the farmers should be trained up of the scientific use of chemical fertiliser and pesticide to stop indiscriminate use of chemical materials.

ness to prevent pollution. Dr Zahiruddin Chowdhury said "Building of dams to protect flood is causing water pollution as the wastes are being piled up in the dams and wastes are not flushed away."

Dr Atiur Rahman stressed on originating consciousness on environmental pollution from the family level

Santosh Gupta said that the problem of environment pollution and water crisis were due to political reasons.

"Our policy makers decided to install deep tubewells in the city to circulate drinking water only to get some commission from the project" he said. "Our crises are not solved as the government fails to get rid of the clutches of bureaucrats and corruptions" he added.

Kazi Faruque Ahmed said "Pollution was not caused by day to day activities of common people, it is an effect of excessive consumerism by a few socially advantaged persons". Calling for a public movement against pollution, he said that the government would not take step until it would face public

JERUSALEM. June 21: Over American protests, Israel's Cabinet approved a plan Sunday that would extend Jerusalem municipal authority over eight Jewish settlements in the West

Bank, reports AP. The United States had called the plan "provocative" and US Secretary of State Madeleine Albright urged Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu in a tele-

phone call to have the Cabinet reconsider. The plan outraged Palestinians, who said Israel was unilaterally annexing the settlements, the status of which is supposed to be determined in negotiations on a final peace agreement. The Palestinians

dent state in the West Bank and Gaza Strip.

SIRAJGANJ, Jun 21: About 2.5 crore people of eleven northern districts will not ge the desired benefits of the Bangabandhu Jamuna Bridge scheduled to open to the traffic Tuesday in the absence of Siraj ganj-Bogra rail line, reports

With existing arrangement will take eight hours from Siraigani to travel by train to Bogra via Iswardi, 10 hours to Rangpur and 11 hours to Dinajpur.

Local people said Sirajganj-Bogra railway connection could reduce the traveling time by at least six hours to greater Rangpur and Dinajpur districts.


