

er on an est as 1825 PARIS, June 21 (Reuters): Facts and figures of World Cup

matches played on Saturday: Ten goals were scored in the three games on Saturday, the highest tally on a single day at the finals so far. It followed the bleakest day on Friday when only one goal was netted in two games.

The Netherlands recorded the biggest win of the finals so far in the 5-0 thrashing of South Korea with five different Dutch players getting their names on the scoresheet. It wastheir biggest ever win at the finals and the first time the Dutch had scored five since beating Austria 5-1 in 1978.

Dennis Berakamp, who scored the third Dutch goal, has netted in each of the last four matches he has started in the finals.

He scored in the Netherlands' last three matches in 1994 against Morocco, Ireland and Brazil at the US finals. He failed to score against Belgium in his team's opening match after coming on as substitute.

It was South Korea's heaviest defeat since 1954 when they lost 9-0 to Hungary and 7-0 to Turkey on their World Cup de-

Asian teams have fared disastrously in France. The record now reads played seven, lost seven, goals for one, goals against 16. The only two teams definitely eliminated so far are Asian - South Korea and Saudi Arabia. Japan, beaten 1-0 by Croatia, have also lost twice without scoring and look sure to go out.

Mexico, the first team at the finals to fight back from a twogoal deficit, drew 2-2 with Belgium and have lost only once in eight matches against European opponents at the finals in the last 20 years. The only team to beat them was Norway in 1994.

Despite throwing away their advantage, Belgium did at least manage a first draw with Mexico following defeats to the Mexicans hosts in the 1970 (0-1) and 1986 finals (1-2).
