From page 12 her government had to examine all pros and cons of the national interest.

"In the past, those who were in power, did not think of the people and country's interest. rather concentrated on how to get commission through underhand dealing ... But we are doing tough bargaining for long-term interest of the country."

In this context, she mentioned that the accord on KAFCO was signed during the Ershad era at the cost of national interest.

Hasina, who is now personally looking after the power sector, said, "Electricity is such a subject which needs time for improvement. One should not expect any solution overnight. People will have to be patient."

"However, we were able to tackle the situation by almost meeting the peak-hour demand and it improved a lot before the breakdown in the national grid on June 20."

Referring to the Saturday's setback, Hasina wondered about the frequent breakdown in the national grid at a time when power situation had started returning to normal.

"It must be looked into why such breakdowns happen fre-

quently." The Prime Minister feels that since she is now looking after the power sector, her adversaries might have a hand behind it to embarrass her and also put the government in an awkward situation in their bid to create an issue for movement.

An inquiry committee is now working to find out the cause of the June 20 power failure, she said and added that those who are involved must be brought to book.

Asked when the government would be able to meet the requirement of power, she said: "We had almost managed to meet the demand by proper power management before the grid line failure."

She hoped that the situation will improve significantly with the production of 100 MW power at Khulna Barge Mounted Plant by August, setting up of power plant at Meghna Ghat and another plant at Shahbazpur in

Asked if the government has any plan to buy power from India. Hasina said the BNP government had opened the negotiation with India to import power and the present government also followed it up.

"But we don't have any grid line to buy electricity from the neighbouring country. Besides, India has no excess electricity that can meet our peak-hour demand."

About the result of the second-round bidding in the oil and gas sector, the Prime Minister said: "It's almost ready. We'll give it soon."

In this regard, she said every government has its own policy and "we are carefully taking steps" so that national interest is protected.

Replying to a question on the long-awaited autonomy to state-owned Radio and Television, Hasina said: "We're going one step further. We are giving it to the private sector. One company is now at the

final stage to operate radio in the private sector, she said, adding that the government will take decisions on allowing more private radio and TV stations after scrutinising their of-

Asked if he private radio and TV will go into operation this year, the Prime Minister said if it is not possible this year, it

will be operational next year.

About the separation of judiciary bill which was expected to be introduced in Parliament much earlier. Hasina said a High Court verdict on the question of Constitutional amendment debars the government to place the bill in the House.

She, however, asserted that "the Judiciary is totally independent and enjoying full freedom. There is no interference in the Judiciary from this government."

On her recent peace initiatives, in the wake of nuclear tests, that took her to India on June 16 and her plan to visit Pakistan on June 24, the Prime Minister declined to make any comment.

She, however, said her talks with Indian Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee was "very fruitful."

"It will not be proper to say anything before visiting Pakistan," she said to a query whether she is taking another move to bring the prime ministers of India and Pakistan across the table after the threenation Business Summit, held in January in Dhaka.

Pressed further, Hasina categorically said: "I will not mediate" between India and Pakistan over the nuclear issue.

"We feel that this is a problem of India and Pakistan and they'll settle it bilaterally."

Explaining Bangladesh's position, she said: "We want peace and stability in the region. Arms race will not benefit any-

As a neighbouring country, I thought I should do something. So I need to visit the two countries to ease the tension,' Hasina said.

Out of this realisation, the Prime Minister said, she had telephonic talks with both Vajpayee and Nawaz Sharif. Both the prime ministers invited her as she expressed her willingness to visit their countries.

Asked if she has any message for Opposition Leader Begum Khaleda Zia on the eve of her government's third year, Hasina said: "Certainly, I like to tell the Leader of the Opposition and all others irrespective of party affiliation to work together for the betterment of the

country." She said her government was constituted with representation of BNP. Jatiya Party and others to make concerted efforts to drive the country to-

wards progress. Hasina also mentioned the appointment of a neutral personality like Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed as President with the expectation that all would come closer and contribute to the economic uplift of

the country. She said: "Ours is a problemridden country. Our people are poor. And I seek cooperation from all in running the government on consensus."



The GCO activists set fire to a copy of the budget speech delivered by the treasurer of the university during the gherao programme.

A rally was held during the programme which was addressed by Dipankor Shaha Dipu, Monjor-E-Khuda Tarik. Saifur Rahman Tapon, and Rahman Mizan.

Later, the GCO leaders met the Vice Chancellor at his office housed in the administrative building of the university. The leaders, however, walked out of the meeting as the Treasurer appeared in the scene.

Meanwhile, an alliance of four student organisations gheraoed the office of Vice Chancellor demanding withdrawal of the decision to increase tuition fee. The organisations included Bangladesh Chhatra Federation, Biplabi Chhatra Maitri, Jatiya Chhatra Dal and Chhatra Oikya Forum.

The leaders of the student bodies also condemned the statement of the treasurer that each student of the DU should pay Tk 10,000 instead of Tk 2600 as educational expenses.


