Mohakhali slum-dwellers appeal to ministers against eviction

The dwellers of Mohakhali slum yesterday submitted a memorandum to the Health and Family Wellare Minister and Home Minister, containing their demand not to evict them without making alternative arrangement, reports BSS.

The slum dwellers, who came in procession to submit the memorandum Bangladesh Secretariat held a rally at Osmani Uddyan while their representatives submitted the memorandum at the Secre-

In the memorandum, they noted that more than 25,000 people belonging to various professions like garments, construction, day labour, factory workers as well as fourth class employees of the Health Directorate have been residing in this slum for more than 26

Besides, for the last one decade various non-governmental organisations including Proshika have been carrying out their poverty alleviation activities through organising the residents in this slum. Proshika, so far organised 400 primary societies comprising 9,000 members and set up 20 non-formal schools, two adult education centres, eight resource centres and 119 income generations schemes in this

The memorandum noted that since coming to power the present government attached highest priority to poverty alleviation and well being of the oppressed people and particularly the Prime Minister categorically assured the slum dwellers that they would not be

190 healthcare centres to be set up in 4 city corpn areas

LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Zillur Rahman vesterday underscored the need for united efforts to make the Urban Primary Healthcare Project (UPHCP) a success for providing primary medicare facilities to

"The government has taken various steps to provide primary healthcare facilities as it is committed to ensuring primary healthcare services to all' the minister said, while addressing as the chief guest the inception workshop of the Urban Primary Healthcare Project at a city hotel yesterday morning.

The minister said a total of 190 primary healthcare centres would be set up in the country's four city corporation areas to ensure primary healthcare facilities to the urban poor.

Chaired by Mayor of Dhaka City Mohammad Hanif, the workshop was addressed, among others, by State Minister for LGRD and Cooperatives Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury Maya, Bir Bikram, State Minister for Health and Family Welfare Prof M Amanullah, LGRD Secretary A H M Abdul Hye, Health Secretary Muhammad Ali and officer in charge, Bangladesh Resident Mission, Asian Development Bank (ADB)

Francis B Narayan. He said one third of the total urban population are deprived of medicare facilities.

"The main objective of the project is to bring the urban poor under the primary healthcare facilities," the minister

The LGRD Minister urged all four city mayors participating in the workshop to set up healthcare centres in their re-

spective areas soon. "Under the project 25 maternity centres will be established in the country's four city corporation areas" he said, adding that the project would play a vi tal role in reducing mother and child mortality rate in the

The minister urged all concerned for extending all sorts of cooperation for the successful implementation of the project

The cost of the project has been estimated at Taka 254 crore. The government of Bangladesh, UNFPA, ADB and Nordic Development Fund are funding the project.

2nd barge mounted power plant to sail for Mongla port from S'pore soon

The second barge mounted 55 MW power plant will sail for Mongla Port from Singapore in a couple of days, reports UNB.

Wartsila NSD and Keppel Singmarine Ltd handed over the plant named Tiger-III to Khulna Power Company for generation of electricity in Singapore Wednesday, according to a message received in the city.

GCO to march towards JS June 28

By DU Correspondent Ganotantrik Chhatra Oikva (GCO) will organise a march towards the Jatiya Sangsad on June 28 demanding 25 per cent allocation for the education

sector in the national budget.

Addressing a press conference at the Madhu's Canteen of the Dhaka University the GCO leaders said allocation for the education sector had not been increased in the new budget.

A total of Tk 4596.14 crore has been allocated for education sector in the proposed budget for 1998-99 fiscal which is 15.27 per cent of the total expenditure in the budget. Though the figure marks a

slight increase in the allocation, that does not reflect the true picture considering the Jhigh, inflation (rate, the QCO leaders said, adding eight per cent of the total GDP should be allocated for the education sec-

The "conspiracy" to make education a commodity will not go unchallenged, the GCO leaders said at the press conference. They suggested that there

should be allocation for new schools, colleges and universities and for research in the national budget in express terms.

There should also be arrangement of subsidy in the budget so that the students could get education materials at production cost.

The GCO will submit a memorandum to the Speaker to press home their demands.

138 that fixes minimum age for different jobs. "We've our own laws about age limit for jobs," the Minister said.
