

## Rashed dumps Iqbal Azim



### ACB to introduce doping test

SYDNEY, June 25: Drug tests will be introduced to Australia's senior cricketers this season, bringing the game into line with other mainstream sports, the Australian Cricket Board (ACB) announced today.

A spokesman for the ACB told Reuters that a three-man doping panel had recommended that tests be introduced in time for the 1998-99 season. "Cricket has always been seen

as a low-risk sport as far as drug taking goes but because of what's going on in other sports. we've decided to start testing our players," the spokesman said.

The spokesman said the tests would be restricted to first class players and would be conducted by the Australian sports drug agency.

He said the plan had still to be rectified by the board of directors but was expected to be passed at a meeting in July.
