

### Mexico comes DOMINIC'S DIARY to a standstill

MEXICO CITY, Jun 26: Thousands of Mexicans partied wildly in the main streets and plazas of the country on Thursday after a surprise 2-2 draw against the Netherlands that carried Mexico into the second round of the World Cup, reports Reuters. The national war cry 'Yes we

can", started by broadcaster Televisa, turned into a "Yes we could" as thousands of soccer fans wearing the green jersey of the national team and draped in Mexican flags danced with · joy in Mexico City centre. "There's nothing like the

taste of not losing and thank god we were able to achieve this feat," star striker Luis Hernandez, known as the "matador" for his goal-scoring talent, told The draw, coupled with a 1-1

draw between the other Group E teams Belgium and South Korea, meant Mexico passed beyond the first round of a World Cup tournament held in Europe for the first time. In offices across the country

work stopped as anxious fans watched Mexico come back from 2-0 down against the Netherlands in St Ethienne. France, to score a stunning equaliser through Hernandez with just seconds left. ....In Mexico City's historic
