Metropolitan
Bangabandhu had taken up uphill task of building country: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday called upon all to work unitedly to establish a poverty and hunger free society in order to fulfil the dream of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, reports BSS.

She was speaking at a function to mark the joining of a large number of leaders and workers of Jatiya Party from Brahmanbaria under the leadership of its Joint Secretary General and former Deputy Minister Advocate Humayun Kabir and other elected representatives and different group leaders in the afternoon.

She said her government wanted to develop the country, imbued with the spirit of the Liberation War. "We want to reach the fruits of independence to every doorstep," she added. She asked the newcomers to work with a sense of sacrifice.

The Awami League chief said that the party since its inception in 1949 had been working for the welfare of people. "All our activities are directed towards the welfare of the common man," she said.

She referred to the devastating situation after the independence of the Bangladesh and said Bangabandhu had taken up the gigantic task to rebuild the war-ravaged country. She said everything was virtually ruined and destroyed during the war. She said there had been no foreign exchange reserve at that time.

Sheikh Hasina regretted that when Bangabandhu had finished the reconstruction of the war-ravaged country, the enemies of the country had killed him brutally. She said with the killing of Bangabandhu, the power was taken away from people. She said Awami League had fought for long 21 years to restore the rights of people.

The Prime Minister said the people had reposed their confidence in the Awami League and voted it to power to look after their interests. "We have to discharge our responsibilities towards them," she added.

She expressed her confidence that the joining of so many leaders and workers and representatives to Awami League would strengthen the party. She mentioned various achievements of her government in the past two years including the signing of the water sharing treaty with India and signing peace accord in the Chittagang Hill Tracts.

The Prime Minister observed that the image of Bangladesh had been brightened in recent past due to various activities taken up by her government. She said Bangladesh is now a country of possibilities. She asked the newcomers to make all out efforts to make the nation economically viable.

Children should be allowed to learn thru' entertainment

Children should not be burdened with books and lessons at the pre-school level and they should be encouraged to learn through entertainment, games and play for developing their faculties of language, emotion and intelligence.

This was stated by psychologist and child education specialist Dr Sultana Zaman at a press conference at the Institute of Childhood Education (ICE) in Dhanmondi yesterday. The briefing was organised to raise consciousness on the handling of pre-school children and to publicise the activities of the two-year-old institute of early childhood education, ICE.

The first five years of a child is the most crucial period for the foundation of the basic human qualities including proper development of Psycho-Motor and Socio-Cultural abilities," Dr Zaman said.

"If children do not get appropriate Stimuli, Environment and Guidance at this stage, it is likely that this will have adverse effects on their development and it may be too difficult to reverse these effects in later states of development," she said.

There is no alternative to early childhood education centres today as there remains none to look after the children against the parents' busy life," she added.

Introducing his institution, the Founder Rector of ICE Dr Khan Mohammad Serajul Islam said the objectives of his institution was to develop curricula and syllabi for early childhood education, arranging trainings for nursery and kindergarten school teachers, to publish guide books, teachers manuals and develop teaching aids and educational toys. ICE also extends consultation services for childhood education.

Among others, child education specialist Farida Akhter, Dr MI Chowdhury and Siddika Toufique Khan were present on the occasion.
