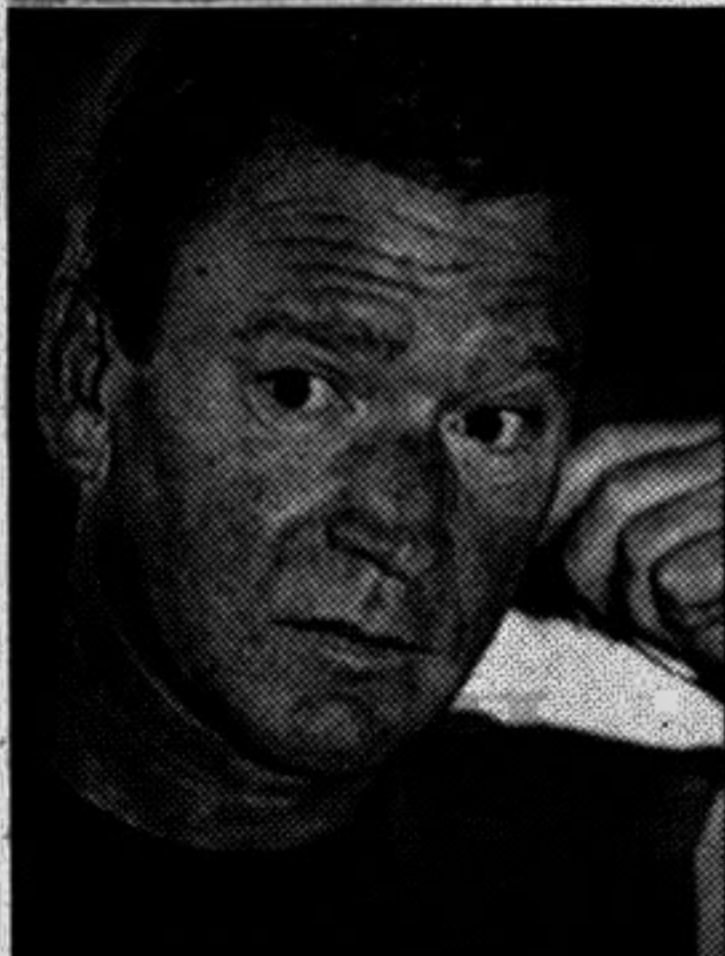

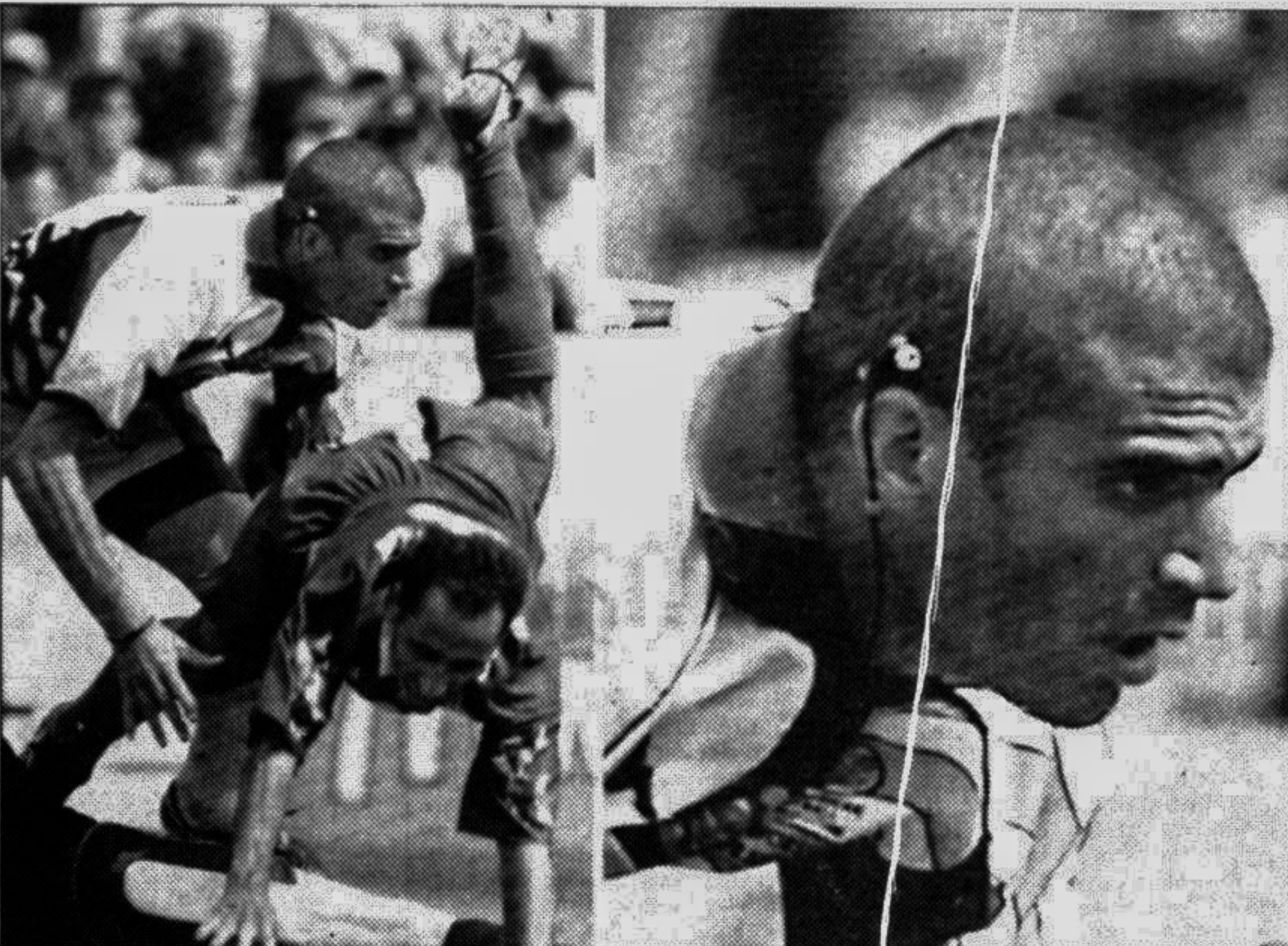

Absorbing anecdotes

PARIS, June 27: Facts and Figures on Friday's matches at the World Cup finals:

The three World Cup debutants playing in Group H all established individual first at the finals. Jamaica won their first match 2-1 v Japan. Japan scored their first goal at Croatia, beaten by Argentina 1-0, lost for the first time.

Argentina won their opening three games at the World Cup for the first time since 1930 when they also won their fourth but went on to lose the final.

Colombia's defeat was their eighth in 13 matches at World Cup finals. The South Americans have only won three matches in four appearances at the finals.

Tunisia's point against Romania was their first since a shock 0-0 draw with West Germany in their last appearance at the finals 20 years ago.
