# Nigeria vs Denmark: Eying uncharted territory

SAINT-DENIS, France, Jun 27 (AP): Nigeria, carrying the World Cup hopes of a continent, and Denmark both aim to erase painful memories from past trips to the second round when they square off at France '98.

Neither have ever reached the quarterfinal stage, but that will change after their meeting Sunday at the Stade de France. Just 60 seconds and Roberto

Baggio stood between Nigeria and the quarterfinals four years ago, but the Super Eagles' suspect defence let a 1-0 lead slip away. Denmark's only other trip to the round of 16 in 1986 — ended in humiliation with a 5-1 loss to Spain.

"They are playing for themselves, for Nigeria and also for Africa," Nigeria coach Bora Milutionvic said of this talented squad, which topped Group D. "These types of games bring out their best.

The African contingent here of five teams was the highest ever, but only Nigeria are left in the draw. They could become just the second team from the continent, after Cameroon in 1990, to reach the quarters.

The confident players are thinking even bigger.

"We are now one of the favourites," defender Taribo West said. "Denmark play an English style, which is an advantage for us. We know that tactic.

LONDON, June 27: (Reuters): England, impressive 2-0 winners over Colombia, have had their World Cup odds trimmed from 14-1 to 10-1 as a record soccer bet was landed by a lucky backer on Friday.

The punter gambled 200,000 pounds (325,000 dollars) on England beating Colombia at 4-5 and will now collect 360,000 pounds (600,000 dollars).

England were heavily supported by patriotic backers to beat Colombia on Friday and William Hill spokesman Graham Sharpe said: "This result must have made a five million pounds (8.3 million dollars) dent in bookies' pockets."

# Paraguay vs France: David vs Goliath

LENS, France, June 27 (AP): Both teams have rediscovered their scoring touch at the World Cup, yet France are the overwhelming favourites going into Sunday's second-round game against Paraguay, the surprise team of the World Cup so far.

France won all three of their first-round games with a 9-1 scoring record and are brimming with confidence as they seek to become the first host nation to win the cup since Ar-

gentina in 1978. Star playmaker Zinedine Zidane is sitting out the second game of his red-card suspension, but other regular starters will be rested and ready after coach Aime Jacquet fielded a slew of substitutes in last Wednesday's 2-1 win over Den-

"I know there are tougher matches than this, but when it comes to concentration, it is tough to prepare for this," said Jacquet.

Paraguay boldly warned they should not be underesti-

"We have great players and we are capable of going all the way," said coach Paulo Cesar Carpeggiani ahead of the France game.

Paraguay surprised everyone by surviving the 'Group of Death: finishing second in Group D behind Nigeria. The South Americans relegated Bulgaria and Spain to the misery of early elimination with a stunning 3-1 win over Nigeria on

Wednesday. While the majority of Paraguay's players are unknown to the French, the aura of goalkeeper-captain Jose Luis Chilavert continues to grow. Chilavert is the lock on a

tough defence, which conceded only one goal in the first round against three of the toughest teams in soccer. "We've got the best defence in

the world," said Chilavert, the driving force behind Paraguay's team and famed for coming out of the net to take free kicks for his side.

has yet to be seriously tested and even the second-string defenders allowed only a single goal against the Danes. The ability to smother pene-

trations has proved a great basis on which to build a team. "The team is oozing confi-

dence and my philosophy is to impose play instead of being subdued by it," said Jacquet. Les Blues have taken their

sparkling play to the opposition from the opening game. and with young forwards like Thierry Henry, who scored three goals, and David Trezeguet, they've enchanted the home crowds.

The team is sure to get a great reception in Lens, a small city in France's industrial belt and home to some of the most rabid soccer fans in Europe. See page 14

# A glitch in the German machine

Ronaldo in row

NICE, Jun 27 (AP): Oliver Bierhoff and Juergen Klinsmann are scoring their goals and Germany are marching on. It may not be pretty, but the Germans are where they want to

Germany also beat the United States 2-0 and had a 2-2 draw with Yugoslavia, finishing first on goal difference. "We are a typical tournament

Bierhoff said, "On paper, they look like easier rivals for us." "I thought they were finished

after going down 2-0, but they came back and they played with a lot of heart," Bierhoff said. "We have to be on alert for 90 or 95 minutes and we have to keep them under pressure." Mexico trailed the Nether-

lands 2-0 before coming back and clinching a draw with a last-second goal, after achieving a similar comeback against Belgium.
