### Underdogs bark but don't bite

PARIS, Jun 30 (AP): Denmark are proving to be the upset champions of world soccer.

Gaining a backdoor entrance to the 1992 European Championship when Yugoslavia was kicked out, the Danes went home with the title, beating hot favourites Germany in the fi-

After ousting 1996 Olympic gold medalists Nigeria from World Cup '98 by a surprising 4-1 score, they now face defending titlists and four-time world champions Brazil for a place in the semifinals.

Another upset? Why not. "Everybody expects Brazil to win," said Danish striker Brian Laudrup. "We might be able to do it again. You never know. I think we showed the whole football world that we can play attractive football as well."

Brazil-Denmark takes place Friday at Nantes the same day that hosts France take on threetime winners Italy at the Stade de France.

Reigning European champions Germany and the Netherlands have also made it to the last eight and will play Saturday, but they wouldn't know their opponents until later Tuesday.

The Germans, who came from behind to beat Mexico 2-1 on Monday, will play either Romania or Croatia at Lyon. The Dutch will face England or Argentina at Marseille

Romania and Croatia met at Bordeaux Tuesday and England faced Argentina at Saint-Eti-

While the France-Italy quarterfinal could go either way the French with home advantage and the Italians with a wealth of World Cup experience — the Danes aren't expected to beat the mighty Brazilians.

But that's their strongest weapon, and they like it that They exposed Nigeria's

weakest point - the defence and were 2-0 up before the Olympic champions' feared strikeforce had barely touched the ball.

Brazil's only weakness happens to be their defence, too. Norway proved that in a comefrom-behind 2-1 victory in Group A and the Norwegians are no longer in the competition, beaten 1-0 by Italy in round

The Italians look more assured as the championship goes on, while the French struggled to put out the modest Paraguavans.

The hosts needed as extra time goal by defender Laurent Blanc — the first sudden death "Golden Goal" in the history of the World Cup — to beat the South Americans with a penalty shootout only six minutes away.

During the Group F games, they hit back from 2-0 down to secure a 2-2 ties with Yugoslavia and overturned Mexico's 1-0 lead with late goals from Juergen Klinsmann and Oliver Bierhoff to win 2-1 and

Berti Vogts' team also appears to have the easiest route to the semifinal. Romania have never reached the World Cup semifinals while Croatia are making their debut.

The prospect of facing either England or Argentina looks far tougher for the Dutch, a World Cup losing finalists in 1974 and '98. The Netherlands edged Yugoslavia 2-1 on Monday thanks to an injury-time winner by Edgar Davids.

England reached the semifinals the last time they qualified in 1990 and have spent 32 frustrating years trying to emulate the team that won the title in 1966. Under Glenn Hoddle, England now play with more imagination and have topquality matchwinners in Alan Shearer, David Beckham and 18-year-old Michael Owen

Argentina, a two-time winners who beat the Dutch in the 1978 final, are striving to step out of the shadows of South American rivals Brazil.

# Italy vs France: Friends turned foes

SENLIS, France, June 30 (Reuters/AP): France and Italy will have no secrets to share when they meet in the quarter-finals of the World Cup, Italian captain Paolo Maldini said on Monday.

Half the French squad have played in Serie A. Seven players are currently with Italian clubs and four others used to be.

France's starting line-up for their second round clash against Paraguay included Inter Milan's Youri Djorkaeff, Parma's Lilian Thuram, Juventus' Didier Deschamps and AC Milan's Marcel Desailly.

The substitutes included AS Roma defender Vincent Candela and Sampdoria midfielder Alain Boghossian.

Juventus midfielder Zinedine Zidane will be back from suspension to face Italy at the Stade de France on Friday while others have past experience of Italy to draw on.

France's hero against Paraguay, Laurent Blanc, used to play at Napoli. Patrick Vieira and Christophe Dugarry are both former AC Milan players while Christian Karembeu joined Real Madrid from Sam-

Italy's superstar Alessandro Del Piero and Zidane produced sparkling play and goals as teammates with league champions Juventus, this year.

In Friday's quarterfinals they may sorely miss each other's help.

Del Piero, seeking his first World Cup goal against the French, said at Italy's training camp on Monday that he con-sidered Zidane France's key

"He is a great player, and I hope he does not prove it against Italy," the 23-year-old forward said.

"With Zidane supporting me I had some great seasons with La Juve. I will miss him in the next match, but he too may feel my absence," Del Piero said.

Del Piero tallied 21 goals in league matches and became the Champions League top scorer ever with 10 goals this year. Zidane added seven goals and lots of assists. They form one of the most impressive duos in the Italian league.

Looking forward to Friday's match Del Piero said, "It will be the toughest match for Italy. against the home team."

"They have individual talents and an excellent teamwork. We will play at our best to win. We start with equal chances," Del Piero said.

"It'll be a match without secrets." Maldini told a news conference. "We know their players well, they know us and neither side will have anything to hide."

Italy were loudly whistled by Norwegian fans and locals during their uninspiring 1-0 defeat of Norway in the second round in Marseille. The fans were annoyed Italy effectively closed down the match once they had taken an early lead. Maldini picked out Monaco's

Thierry Henry as France's most dangerous forward player. "Once he gets some space he's unstoppable," he said.

Del Piero, who was just recovered from a thigh strain meanwhile was busy denying allegations about his questionable form and rejecting criticism about the scoring chances missed in against Norway.

"It's true that I missed some easy chances, but not because I'm unfit. I'm physically okay and ready to play a full match, Del Piero said.

Originally considered Italy's best player and one of the would-be World Cup stars, Del Piero has been overshadowed so far by striker Christian Vieri, who tallied five goals in four matches, and by Roberto Baggio, his would-be substitute.

"It has not been Del Piero's World Cup. I hope it can be Vieri's or Italy's World Cup. What really counts for me is that the team goes on in the tournament," he said.

Doctors back in Brazil later suggested Romario would have been fit from the quarter-finals onwards but Zagallo wasn't prepared to take the risk.



## Azzuri enter the wolves' den

SENLIS, France, June 30 (AFP/ Internet): Italy are going into the wolves' den when they take on France for a place in the semi-finals, coach Cesare Maldini claimed on Tuesday.

The two sides meet on Friday and the 66-year-old coach did not mince his words over the grim fate awaiting his men at the Stade de France.

"We're playing against one of the favourites for the competition ... and we're going into the wolves' den," he said. Maldini tipped France as a

tournament favourite and envied coach Aime Jacquet for having the likes of creative midfielders Zinedine Zidane and Youri Djorkaeff. France, who will have Zidane back from a two-match

"Germany had a very hard

time beating Mexico, which only goes to show that all the teams here are very well-prepared. Zidane is a very important player for them and his absence didn't help things.

"France are not new to us," he went on. "So many of their players are in Italian clubs and we've seen so many of their games that I hope that we know everything there is to know about them." That familiarity will not

think the French will be worn out by their marathon win over the South Americans.

"We've got very good players,

but we don't have a player like Djorkaeff," he admitted. "Someone who moves a great deal between attack and defence, someone who can take people on and beat them, and

then come back to cover. "France used up a lot of energy to beat Paraguay, but the motivation and the strength soon comes back. I heard what Zidane and Deschamps have been saying and they sounded optimistic.

Despite the brickbats which formation, and only afterwards Maldini has suffered over the try to understand what they past week, the Italy coach is convinced there will be plenty of entertaining football ahead.

"The best matches are still to come in this tournament," he said. "But we have to give everything we have. Looking back over our campaign, I think we've played very well so far. "We were criticised a bit
