Sharif's appeal to expatriate **Pakistanis**

DOHA, July 1: Pakistan's Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif has appealed to Pakistanis working in the oil-rich Gulf to send home 1,000 dollars each to help fight off the sanctions slapped on Islamabad for its nuclear tests, reports AFP.

"We have broken the begging bowl and are prepared to sacrifice." he told a large crowd at a Pakistani centre in the Qatari capital late Tuesday

Sharif stressed it was up to Pakistan itself to combat the sanctions and called for each Pakistani worker in Qatar. where they number around 60,000 to deposit at least 1,000 dollars in bank accounts at

In June, Sharif also visited the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia and Britain and urged hundreds of thousands of overseas Pakistanis to contribute to a national self-reliance fund.

On the nuclear blasts carried out by Pakistan in May, the Prime Minister said Pakistan had become "the Islamic world's first and the world's sixth atomic power.

"I congratulate Pakistan for their country becoming a nuclear power," he said, to thunderous applause from the Pakistani crowd.

Sharif welcomed what he called "clear support for the Pakistani action" from other Muslim states. "Many leaders including Qatar's Emir phoned me after the Indian blasts to sympathise with Pakistan," he

Turning to the Kashmir conflict with India, he said it was "abone of contention between The two countries, and peace between them cannot be achieved without resolving this issue."

"Pakistan's peaceful intentions should not be taken as its weakness," Sharif said, adding that "we are capable of defending ourselves.

His visit to Qatar, the final leg of a Gulf mini-tour which also took him to Kuwait, follows the US-led economic sanctions imposed after Pakistan exploded six nuclear devices in response to five nuclear tests by India, also in May.

Sharif was to meet the Qatari Emir, Sheikh Hamad Ibn Khalifa al-Thani, before returning home later today.

Indian goods recovered, 1 held in Jamalpur

JAMALPUR, July 1: In a raid on a shop in the town, police today seized Indian goods worth over Tk 1.72 lakh and arrested a man in this connection, reports UNB.

Acting on a tip-off, a joint squad of the local Customs Department, BDR and DB raided the shop near the district railway station and recovered 58 bags of Indian sugar and 99 packets of cumin seed.

They also arrested Zafar Ali, an employee of the shop. The shopowner was absconding. A case was filed.

Two killed in mortar attacks in Kashmir

SRINAGAR, India, July 1: Two women died and 10 civilians were injured in heavy mortar attacks by Pakistani troops on the disputed Kashmir border with India, an official press release said today, reports AFP.

lt said Pakistani border guards continued attacks on the Kashmir frontier districts of Baramulla and Kupwara late Tuesday, also damaging a police station and several houses.

The release said more than 1.000 people had migrated from the affected areas where the alleged "unprovoked" Pakistani attacks began on June 23.

India has blamed Pakistan, which administers part of dividend Kashmir, of triggering tension on the disputed border.

According to officials here. 10 people have died in Pakistani border attacks on Indianadministered Kashmir since late last month.

Pakistan on Tuesday said eight civilians were killed in artillery and mortar attacks by Indian troops on border villages in Pakistan-held Kashmir, adding that the death toll from the week-long shelling had risen to 30.

Tensions along the Kashmir border mounted in the aftermath of rival nuclear tests by India and Pakistan in May.

BSF shoots dead 5 rebels in Assam

GUWAHATI, India, July 1: Indian border guards today shot dead five separatist guerillas in Assam, officials said, reports

They said the Border Security Force (BSF) killed the five at Baghmara village, 130 km from Guwahati, after coming under fire.

"Our soldiers retaliated and five of the militants were shot dead and a large quantity of arms and ammunition were recovered from them," BSF Deputy Inspector General Ashok Kumar said.

The guerillas belonged to the outlawed National Democratic Front of Bodoland, which is fighting for an independent tribal state for the Bodo community.

Kumar said the rebels had infiltrated Assam from the neighbouring Bhutan following heavy floods. Bodo guerillas are said to shelter in Bhutan.

Thousands of people have died in India's turbulent northeast during the past 50 years in a string of ethnic and separatist conflicts.


