Road mishap leaves 4 dead in Sherpur

SHERPUR, July 2: A fatal traffic mishap in Sadar thana on Sherpur-Nakla road on Wednesday night left four people dead and five others injured, reports UNB.

Police said the accident took place in Sapmara area at about 11.30 pm when a minibus overturned on the road while giving passage to a truck.

Three of the victims died on the spot while Mokhter Hossain (25) succumbed to his injuries at Mymensingh Medical College Hospital. Rest of the dead could not be identified.

Of the injured, Habi (40), Zafar (25) and two unidentified men aged about 25 and 35 were admitted to Sadar Hospital in critical condition.

The truck driver fled the scene leaving his vehicle on the spot. A case was filed with Sadar thana.

Meanwhile, Deputy Commissioner and senior police officials of the district visited the spot.

KPCL begins social goodwill programme

Khulna Power Company Ltd (KPCL), the first independent power producer (IPP) in Bangladesh, along with their power generation activities has undertaken a social goodwill programme as part of its social commitment, says a press release.

KPCL began the programme to create technological awareness among primary school children on June 28. Nepali papers face govt ban

KATHMANDU, July 2: Nepali newspapers reporting on a crackdown on Maoist rebels are facing an unannounced government ban in the western region affected by the insurgency, the president of the country's journalists union said Thursday, reports AP.

Kishor Nepal, president of the Nepali Journalist Federation, said police are telling transport operators not to carry newspapers that publish reports on the police operation and are seizing and burning papers found on buses and trucks.

Most of the newspapers are printed in Kathmandu, the Nepalese capital.

According to the government, at least 54 anti-monarchy rebels have been killed since the police operation to flush Maoist rebels from their jungle hide-outs began a month ago. Opposition leaders say the figure could be much higher.

Maoist guerillas oppose Nepal's constitutional monarchy and demand that the Himalayan state be turned into a republic. More than 200 people have been killed since the insurgency began two years ago.

Home Minister Govind Raj Joshi said he knew of no ban on news about the crackdown, a delegation of journalists who met him said.

Paris-based Reporters Without Borders wrote to Nepalese Prime Minister Girija Prasad Koirala on Tuesday expressing concern over police seizing newspapers in Sindhulimadi, 320 kilometers southeast of Kathmandu.

"Reporters Without Borders is concerned over several infringements of press freedom that have occurred in Nepal," the press freedom watchdog wrote.

Recent fighting in Lanka claims 92

COLOMBO, July 2: At least 62 people — 53 rebels and nine air force personnel — were killed in recent fighting in Sri Lanka's civil war, a military spokesman said Thursday, reports AP.

Spokesman Colonel Ranjith Witana said naval gunboats attacked a convoy of guerrilla boats off the northeastern coast early Wednesday, killing at least 48 rebels, said Col. Witana. Two government sailors were wounded.

The nine airmen were killed when their jeep was blown up by a guerrilla mine near Mankulam Wednesday, Witana said. Five rebels were killed in several other clashes Wednesday.

The ethnic war that began in 1983 has left more than 54,000 people dead on both sides and has drained this country's resources.

At another briefing Thursday, the military said it was on the verge of capturing a key highway that has been the main focus of the war against Tamil rebels, the military said Thursday.

Military spokesman Major General Sarath Munasinghe estimated the rebels fighting strength at under 7,000, all but a few hundred of them defending the last major town on the highway to the Jaffna Peninsula. For the last six weeks, they have held off Sri Lanka's army, which has a total of 120,000 men, at Mankulam, 245 kilometers (153 miles) north of Colombo, the Sri Lankan capital.

Capturing the north-south highway would open an overland supply route to Jaffna city, whose residents are now supplied by air and sea. About 20 kilometers (12 miles) of the 76-kilometer (47-miles) highway remain to be captured.

The Liberation Tigers to Tamil Eelam, seeking an independent homeland for minority Tamils, ran their own administration for more than 1 million people on the peninsula for more than five years until the army captured Jaffna city in December 1995.

After being driven out of Jaffna, the Tamil Tigers spread into the northern jungle. "Now, they have control over 100,000 people," Munasinghe said.

Munasinghe was unable to say when the highway operation will be completed, but said "it is going to be soon."

Government troops have been able to cut many of the Tigers' smaller supply routes, Munasinghe said. The government's push is being countered by the Tigers with mortar and artillery, much of it captured from the army in earlier battles.

The guerillas seized a shipment of 34,000 mortar shells that were being sent by ship from Zimbabwe to the Sri Lankan military some time last year. There has also been a report that the Kurdish Workers' Party (PKK) sold 11 Stinger heat-seeking missiles to the guerillas.
