DDT blamed for falling male fertility in wildlife

The pesticide. DDT, is being blamed by scientists for falling male fertility and sex changes in wildlife, reports BSS.

The findings have been made by scientists at the University of North Carolina and the reproductive toxicology branch of the US government's Environmental Protection Agency.

Providing powerful evidence, the researchers said other effects may include a fall in the age of puberty among girls and rise in breast and tes-

ticular cancers. They said there is a growing alarm that hundreds of manmade chemicals produced since

mimic fernale hormones or block the action of male hormones in the unborn child. Hard proof is proving elusive because there are so many chemicals to screen. But the new findings claim to offer lab-

oratory evidence that 50 years after its introduction, DDT may be the key culprit, the researcher's said. Animal experiments found

that rats exposed to DDE, a smaller reproductive organs and female like nipples after birth.

The researchers said there was also evidence that another breakdown version of DDT may mimic the female hormone, oestrogen, enhancing the pesticide's reminiscing impact.

These results suggest that the reported increased incidence of development male reproductive system abnormalities in wildlife and humans reflect anti-androgenic activity of the persistent DDE, the metabolite of DDT.

According to the researchers, the present use of DDT in most developing countries, mainly for malarial control, probably exceeds historical use. The use of DDT is banned and allowed for use only in malarial control in Bangladesh.

41 important posts lying vacant for long

Pabna Mental Hospital plagued with problems, mismanagement

PABNA, July 3: Pabna Mental Hospital, the only mental asylum of the country, has been grappled with numerous problems, including mismanagement and lack of psychiatrists, reports UNB.

According to a competent source, proper treatment of pa-tients and administrative works of the 400-bed hospital are being hampered as 41 important posts of the hospital have been lying vacant for a long time.

The vacant posts include, four Clinical Assistants out of nine, four Medical Officers out of five and one Service Superintendent.

More worrying is that there are no electric fans in most of the wards of the hospital and it even has no generator to tackle the loadshedding problem.

Pathological department of the hospital remained under lock and key for a long time for lack of manpower and necessary equipment.

Apart from this, many pa-tients, who come to the hospital for admission from different back for lack of accommoda-

On the other hand, a good number of patients, who recovered 10 to 12 years ago, have not yet left the hospital.

According to the sources, repeated appeals by the hospital authorities to their concerned guardians to take them back fell on the deaf ears. But the authorities cannot force them out on humanitarian ground.

There is also an allegation that the patients are being deprived of adequate diet they need soon after their recovery.

Besides, the hospital management has become hostage to the hands of a section of hospital staff. They allegedly intervene in the day-to-day administrative works of the hospital and enjoying its property, including lands and ponds, without giving necessary revenue to the government.

Allotment of the hospital quarters is also under their control. A section of retired staff keep staying at the hospital quarters in collaboration

The Bharatiya Janata Partyled governing coalition said the bill would be introduced only after support was assured. The bill had been on the legislative calendar for Friday, but was taken off. Parliamentary Affairs Minister Madan Lal Khurana set no

first introduced in 1996 by a previous government but never put to a vote. Leftists lawmakers, who have been the staunchest supporters of the bill to reserve a third of parliament and state assembly seats for women, staged a sit-in near the entrance

The main objection to the bill came from the Democratic Front party, which wants the quota to be lowered from 33 per cent to 15 per cent. The Front which represents lower castes and Muslims in northern India, also wants a quota within the quota for women from the groups they represent. A 1995 federal law set aside a

third of the seats on municipal and village councils for women. In many cases the law has had the intended effect - increasing the participation of women in India's democracy. But some women face opposition at the local level. Male politicians have attended council sessions in place of their elected wives or daughters. ousted women in no-confidence votes, and scheduled meetings late in the evening - a time when women in small, traditional communities would be unlikely to leave their homes.
