British teacher in Sylhet awarded MBE

A British school teacher, M Ailsa Scarsbrook, has been awarded the MBE (Member of the British Empire) by the Queen for her outstanding contribution to educating the youth of Sylhet, report agencies.

The announcement was made in the United Kongdom last month, a British High Commission press release said in the city vesterday.

Ailsa Scarsbrook is teacher of the British-Bangladesh International School in Sylhet. She has been working in Bangladesh for the past 10 years and in the South Asia region for over 23 years, the release said.

"Mrs Ailsa", as she is known to scores of students and friends in Sylhet, qualified as a teacher in Liverpool, England, and began teaching in 1970.

Ailsa and her husband Alan first visited Bangladesh in 1988, and returned the following year and again 18 months later. As a result of these visits, they produced a set of short video films on life in the Sylhet region which have been supplied to many schools, libraries and individuals in the United Kingdom. In 1993, they accepted an

invitation to teach spoken English at a language academy in Sylhet for one year.

In January 1997 they joined the British-Bangladesh International School in Amberkhana, Sylhet, where Ailsa has helped to modernise the English-language programme.
