Pak delegation meets DU VC

A 5-member Pakistani delegation led by the Education Secretary of Pakistan Dr Safdar Mahmood met with Dhaka University Vice Chancellor Prof Azad Chowdhury and other senior members of the university at the VC's office yesterday.

The delegation exchanged views with the DU authorities on academic exchange programmes between universities of Bangladesh and Pakistan, says a DU press release.

The visit of the Pakistani delegation, part of an exchange programme initiated by UNESCO National Commission of Bangladesh, focused on the exchange of teachers, students, researchers and collaborative research work between the two countries.

The meeting also discussed preparation of a project document for submission to UNDP/UNESCO for developing inter-country inter-university exchange programmes in the South Asia region.

Shipping Minister A S M Abdur Rob gave a resume of the activities of his ministry and said that the ministry had taken steps to form an Inland Port Authority under the directives from the prime minister.

He said that two container terminals are being set up in the country one at Patenga in Chittagong and the other at Narayanganj at a cost of Taka 1971 crore. He told the meeting that ferry service between Chandpur and Shariatpur was being planned.

Rob said that steps are being taken to solve the "go slow" system through discussions with the leaders and workers of Chittagong Port. Deputy Minister for Shipping Saber Hossain Chowdhury said that waterways around the Dhaka metropolis is being planned to ease traffic problem.

He said various problems including sewerage, environment pollution and traffic congestion would be solved with the implementation of the waterways project. The meeting was told that the net income from the Chittagong Port during 1996-97 stood at Taka 110.98 crore compared to Taka 48.43 crore in 1993-94. The meeting was informed that calling of ship and containers at the Chittagong Port had been increasing by 20 per cent every year. Concerned high officials were present on the occasion.
