Pakistan Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's special envoy Senator M Akram Zaki called on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at her office yesterday and handed over a letter of the Pakistan Prime Minister to her, reports UNB.

The Pak envoy informed the Prime Minister that the foreign secretary-level meeting between Pakistan and India would resume soon.

He said that Pakistan would not go for further nuclear test to

keep the region tension-free. Hasina told the Pakistani envoy that peace is essential for progress and development. "We want an immediate resumption of bilateral dialogue between New Delhi and Islamabad for the sake of peace and stability in this region." The prime minister pointed

out that there would be a scope for initiating dialogue on bilateral issues by the participating countries during the next SAARC Summit in Colombo.

Foreign Secretary Mustafizur Rahman and Pakistan High Commissioner to Bangladesh Karam Elahi were present on the occasion.

## 20000 carrying HIV in Bangladesh

At least 20 thousand people are carrying HIV and a total of 102 people have so far died of AIDS in Bangladesh.

Around one per cent of expecting mothers in rural areas are infected with HIV, implying the possibility of giving birth to millions of AIDS-infected children in the country.

These were stated by the speakers at the inaugural ceremony of a workshop on "Creating consciousness on HIV, AIDS and STDs" for the Imams and religious leaders held at the Islamic Medical Mission (IMM) yesterday.
