Survey reveals

Water pollution in Buriganga Shitalakhya deplete fishes

The water pollution in the rivers Buriganga and Shitalakhya has depleted almost all fishes, said a survey, reports

The survey conducted by the Surface Water Modelling Centre (SWMC), an independent unit under Water Resources Ministry said "we have not seen a single fishing boat from Mirpur to Pagla point because of nonavailability of fishes.

Dissolved Oxygen (DO) levels within the 17 kilometre reach of the river Buriganga stretching from Savar to Narayanganj was found to be far below the acceptable level of four milligrams per litre - the threshold level for survival of aquatic life including fish.

The SWMC at different periods of 1995 measured the DO level at more than 11 points and took samples of water from the river for laboratory tests.

Residues of chemical pesticides along with wastes from the industries on the banks were the main reasons behind the fall of DO level, experts at the SWMC said.

Former director general of the Department of Environment ANM Wahed said chemical fertilisers, particularly DDT, DDE and Dieldrin used in cropping, is one of the main reasons for the water pollution. A preliminary review of the data obtained so far shows that

the Buriganga is heavily polluted. The DO level within the 17 kilometre reach of the river that passes through Dhaka is at some points as low as 0.1 milligram per litre.

Although discharge of human excreta and wastes from industries contribute to the main cause of the pollution of the river Buriganga seeped-in residues of chemical pesticides have also been attributed to the

The pollution may turn the river Buriganga into a dead river if pragmatic steps are not taken immediately, environmental exports warned.



Employees' strike cripples India's postal service

NEW DELHI, July 10: India's postal system, made up of 1.2 million staff, was crippled for a second day today by a wage strike which has led to large scale disruption and public out-

rage, reports said, AFP reports. The protest by more than 600,000 employees excluded postmen, whose salaries were increased recently.

Postal Workers Union leader

R L Bhattacharya said: "The response to the strike has been more than 95 per cent." The New Delhi administration, however, said 98 per cent of post offices in the city were

functioning "without any major

disruption. Reports from several states said the strike virtually crippled services, warning the boy-cott could also hit banking operations such as clearing of

The parliament was in uproar today over the strikes, leading to a protest walkout from the house by several op-position leaders with some of them openly extending support to the employees.

Prime Minister Atal Behari Vajpayee told parliament that his coalition government was negotiating to end the strike.

"The exercise is still on," Vajpayee told the upper house and said he hoped the protesters would resume work. Communications Minister Sushma Swaraj appealed for an end to the strike, the second since a one-day stoppage in January, and promised a "favourable response" to employees' demands.

ECOSOC session ends with adoption of communique

The high level segment of the 1998 substantive session of the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) of the United Nations ended in New York on Wednesday through the adoption of a ministerial communique, reports UNB.

The theme of this segment which was attended by ministerial level delegation and high level officials was "Market access: Development since the Uruguay Round, implications, opportunities and challenges. in particular for the developing countries and least developed among them, in the context of globalisation and liberalisa-

The communique was a document negotiated by all member states of the UN, in particular by the ECOSOC members. In view of the relevance of the theme in enhancement of trading opportunities for Bangladesh and 47 other least developed countries. Bangladesh took a lead role, in the negotiation.

Bangladesh debate the issues as the coordinator of 48 least developed countries (LDCs), according to a message received here vesterday. The communique expressed

marginalisation of LDCs in international trade and finance. It declared that arresting and reversing this trend and promoting their expeditious integration in the world economy is an ethical imperative of the international community. It also declared that the in-

deep concern for the continued

ternational community will work together towards enhancing market access of the LDC exports. An important component was the expression of political will to work for the dutyfree imports from the least developed countries.

Currently only a few products receive the zero tariff treatment in a selected number of countries who offer it under autonomous arrangement.

In the products of export interest of LDCs for example textile, clothing, leather, agricultural products are subjected to high tariff barriers and quota restrictions in most markets of industrialised countries.

Realisation of this provision, on which the communique has expressed positive indication, will result in tremendous export opportunities for LDC countries, particularly of Bangladesh.

'Japan to remain biggest donor to Bangladesh'

TOKYO, July 10: Japan has said that despite fiscal stringency it would remain the biggest donor to Bangladesh in terms of Official Development Assistance (ODA), reports UNB.

"We have been the number one donor to Bangladesh in terms of ODA and I think it is fair to say that we expect to remain the number one donor to Bangladesh for quite sometime." a spokesman of the Japan government told a weekly press briefing at the Foreign Office here Tuesday.

Press Secretary of the Foreign Office Numata Sadaaki made the statement in reply to a question on whether Japan would increase its ODA for Bangladesh following the suspension of the Japanese economic aid to India and Pakistan after their nuclear tests.

The total Japanese aid disbursement for Bangladesh stood at 4.9 billion US dollars in last 25 years till June 1997.

There is a growing speculation here that Japan may increase its ODA to Bangladesh following its suspension of aid to India and Pakistan.

"There was no sort of direct linkage in the sense of swapping aid to one country with aid to

another," Sadaaki said. He, however, said the distribution of the Japanese aid and its amount to a particular country depends on a variety of factors.

These include the stage of development of that particular country, its economic situation and the efforts made by the recipient country to achieve its economic development. Without rejecting the possi-

bility of increased aid, Sadaaki said that the decisions of that kind would be made on the merit of each case.

Appreciating the economic performance of Bangladesh, he said, "We are very much aware that Bangladesh is tackling very seriously the task of economic reforms and is achieving some results.

The Press Secretary said he understands that Bangladesh's growth has exceeded five per cent and grain production has reached a level of about 20 million tons.

Meanwhile, senior officials of the Japanese government gave a broad hint that Japan may increase its ODA for Bangladesh following its economic sanction against India and Pakistan on the ground of nuclear tests.

They said that the matter was now being discussed through diplomatic channel between Dhaka and Tokyo.

"If there is some good projects in Bangladesh, the ODA amount may be increased ... believe there is a possibility," a senior Japanese official said.

He said Bangladesh now remains on the top of the list for receiving the additional ODA of Japan. Some other countries in South Asia including Sri Lanka and some African countries are in the queue to take advantage of the situation.

He said a high-powered Policy Dialogue Mission under the Japan Foreign Ministry will visit Dhaka in October to discuss with the Bangladesh government a good number of new projects and their fundings.

This is for the first time that a full-fledged mission with officials of the Grant Aid and Loan Aid is visiting Dhaka. Until last year, the two wings had held dialogues with the Bangladesh officials separately.

About 20-25 new projects including the Rupsha Bridge, Bypass to Jamuna, rural development programmes near Dhaka might figure prominently during the mission's dialogue, with the Bangladesh government.
