Tenders in sealed cover are invited from bona fide traders for supply of about 200,000 (two hundred thousand) metric tons of wheat in cash. The particulars of tenders are furnished below:

- Quantity : 200,000 M.T. (5% more or less at Seller's option). The quantity may be increased or decreased depending upon the situation.
- Basis of payment : C&F liner terms at both ends.
- Mode of payment : Cash through L/C
- Port of delivery : Chittagong (Chittagong Silo), Chittagong Port and Mongla Port.

- Offer in sealed cover addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Food, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh must be submitted by intending tenderers in the tender box to be kept in the office chamber (Room No. 119, Building No. 4, Bangladesh Secretariat, Dhaka) of Deputy Secretary (Procurement), Ministry of Food or in the office chamber of Director (Procurement) (Room No. 501), Director General of Food, 16, Abdul Gani Road, Dhaka by 13:00 Hrs BST 17-08-1998. The tenders will be opened on the same day at 13:30 Hrs BST in the Conference Room of the Ministry of Food (Room No. 104, Building No-4, Bangladesh Secretariat, Dhaka). Tenderers or their representatives may attend the same. The offer of the tender must be accompanied by earnest money in the form of Bank Guarantee/Bank Draft/Pay Order in favour of the Secretary, Ministry of Food, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh equivalent to 1% (one per cent) of the total C & F price of the entire quantity offered. Further, on acceptance of tender a Performance Guarantee equivalent to 5% (five per cent) of the value of the entire quantity shall be to be furnished within three working days from the issue date of letter of intent.
- Tender schedule containing instructions may be obtained during office hours of working days up to 16.8.1998 from the undersigned by paying Taka 5,000/- (Taka five thousand only) by Pay Order/Bank Draft drawn in favour of the Secretary, Ministry of Food, Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh. Instructions contained in these documents should be carefully read and adhered to. These documents should also be submitted along with the offer being signed and sealed on each page. No tender schedule shall be sold on the closing date of the tender.

11,905 hectares of fallow and illegally occupied lands.

Trees would be planted along 25,000 km of roads, highways and railway tracks.

The target to plant trees along the roads and railway tracks calls for participation of the people as part of the social forestry programme, emphasizing on fruit trees, she added.

The plan calls for planting fruit trees on both sides of the railway trucks. That will provide income and nutrition to the people, and maintain biodiversity, she said.

About the government's programme to create plantations on the government-owned lands and fallow lands along with shelters for the poor, she said it would help stem migration to the city and urban centres from rural areas.

The Minister said the plan also outlines a new strategy to use the demarcation lines between the crop fields by planting trees, specially palm, dates, betel nuts and acacia. The programme in this regard has already been started.

Sajeda Choudhury said the other targets of the plan calls for developing 708 hectares of new forests on char lands, 12,000 hectares of unclassified lands to help slash-and-burn farmers at Bandarban and rehabilitate vanishing shal forests on 40,000 hectares in CHT, Mymensingh and Sylhet.

The plan also calls for developing 31,408 hectares of industrial forests to beef up the existing 11,223 hectares. The NGOs would contribute to the creation of 400 hectares of industrial forest.

A wildlife sanctuary will be developed at Dulahazara in Cox's Bazar and 43,400 hectares of forests will be rehabilitated at the National Park. Another sanctuary will be developed in Khulna Division.

The ships and oil tankers discharging bilge at the Cox's Bazar coast are also affecting the beach, which calls for cleaning the coast to make them attractive to the tourists, the minister said.

She said that the mangrove plantation at Patenga in Chittagong is facing problems due to the activities of the ship-breakers. They have caused environmental damage on at least an 8 km strip of the coast with oil, iron scraps and other effluents.

"We are going to notify them to develop a dry dock instead of breaking ships indiscriminately on the sea shore," she added.

The ships and oil tankers

discharging bilge at the Cox's Bazar coast are also affecting the beach, which calls for cleaning the coast to make them attractive to the tourists, the minister said.

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
